# Low risk - no change

In June, there were three outbreaks in Turkey (serotype O). Elsewhere, there was one outbreak in China (serotype O) and one outbreak in South Africa (serotype SAT2).

## **Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza**

### Low risk for wild bird incursion – no change

In June, outbreaks of HPAI were reported in domestic poultry and wild birds in Asia: HPAI H5N5 in Taiwan (1) and HPAI H5N1 in India (12). #### African Swine Fever

#### Medium risk – no change

In June, in **Europe**, reported outbreaks of ASF have continued in backyard pig and commercial pig premises in Poland (3), Romania (51), Russia (5), Serbia (3), and Ukraine (1). Reports in wild boar continue in Bulgaria (9), Estonia (3), Hungary (295), Latvia (26), Lithuania (21), Poland (192), Romania (40), Russia (2), and Slovakia (9). In **Asia**, China (2), Myanmar (1) and Philippines (21) have reported new outbreaks of ASF in domestic pigs. ASF in wild boar has also been reported in South Korea (18). In **Africa**, there were outbreaks reported in domestic pigs in Nigeria (3) and South Africa (3). No new reports in June.











Highly pathogenic avian influenza in Poultry and Wild birds Europe January - June 2020 Overlay: migratory bird flyways

















Bluetongue disease in Europe: January - July 2020
