### Foot and Mouth Disease

### Low risk - no change

In October, there was one outbreak in Botswana (serotype SAT1), four outbreaks in Namibia (SAT2), and one outbreak in Zimbabwe (not typed). There were three outbreaks in Turkey (serotype O).

# Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza

### Medium risk for wild bird incursion – deteriorating

In October, outbreaks of HPAI were reported in domestic poultry and wild birds in **Europe**: Germany HPAI H5 (4) and HPAI Untyped (1), Netherlands HPAI H5 (5), and Russia HPAI H5N8 (10). In **Asia**, outbreaks were reported in domestic poultry of HPAI H5N8 in Israel (9), HPAI H5 in wild birds in Kazakhstan (3), and in poultry in Vietnam HPAI H5N1 (1) and HPAI H5N6 (3).

## African Swine Fever

### Medium risk – no change

In October, in **Europe**, reported outbreaks of ASF in domestic pigs have continued in Bulgaria (1), Moldova (1), Poland (5), Romania (109), Russia (12), and Ukraine (3). Reports of wild boar continue in Bulgaria (22), Estonia (4), Germany (80), Hungary (72), Latvia (27), Lithuania (21), Poland (144), Romania (23), Russia (10), and Slovakia (21). In **Asia**, China has reported new outbreaks of ASF in domestic pigs (2) as well as South Korea (2). Reports of wild boar continue in South Korea (30). In **Africa**, there were three outbreaks reported in domestic pigs in South Africa.

### Classical Swine Fever

# Very low risk - no change

In October, Japan reported no new outbreaks in domestic pigs, and there were no new wild boar reports. Elsewhere, outbreaks in domestic pigs were reported in Brazil (2).

# Bluetongue

### Low risk - no change

In October, in **Europe** there were outbreaks of **BTV-8** in France (28), Germany (2), and Luxemburg (2), Spain (3) and Switzerland (1), and **BTV-4** in Bosnia and Herzegovina (1), Bulgaria (3), Croatia (16), Greece (42), Italy (21), North Macedonia (12), and Serbia (6). Elsewhere, BTV-4 was reported in Algeria (2). #### Newcastle disease

### Low risk - no change

In October, two outbreaks of Newcastle Disease were reported in Russia and eight outbreaks of Newcastle Disease reported in Israel.

#### African Horse Sickness

### Very low risk - no change

In October, two outbreaks of AHS were reported in Thailand.

### West Nile virus

### Very low risk - no change

According to ECDC, since the start of the 2020 transmission season and as of 29 October 2020, EU Member States have reported 308 human cases of WNV infection, including 36 deaths: Greece (143, including 22 deaths), Spain (76, including 7 deaths), Italy (66, including 5 deaths), Germany (12), Romania (6, including one death), Hungary (3), Bulgaria (1,







including 1 death) and the Netherlands (1). The province of Pazardzhik in Bulgaria, the province of Badajoz in Spain, the region of Utrecht in the Netherlands and five regions in Germany (Barnim, Ostprignitz-Ruppin, Saalekreis, Halle (Saale) and Meissen) reported locally-acquired human cases of WNV infection for the first time. All other cases were reported from areas that have been affected during previous transmission seasons. No cases have been reported from EU neighbouring countries. In the same period, outbreaks in horses have been reported by Austria, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Portugal and Spain. In October, outbreaks in horses have been reported in Austria (2 reports – one of these was a horse), France (2, on the island of Corsica), Germany (4), Italy (1), Portugal (1), Spain (33), and wild birds in Bulgaria (2). 

















Bluetongue disease in Europe: May - October 2020
















Highly pathogenic avian influenza in Poultry, Captive and Wild birds May - October 2020 Overlay: migratory bird flyways
