Changes to indicators for SIMD16

Education and Crime Domain indicators will change in SIMD16. This is because the way the data is collected has changed or new data is available that allows for improvements.

The Crime Domain categories are being revised with support from Police Scotland to better reflect deprivation. This is also necessary to ensure any changes to legislation since SIMD12 are reflected in SIMD16.

In the Education Domain a new indicator will be included to replace the current indicator capturing school qualifications that pupils leave school with. This is due to changes to the exams children sit in Scotland and that not all exams are now taken in fourth year.

Also in the Education Domain improvements are being made to school pupil absences. Instead of recording all pupil absences, a new indicator is being developed that will look at individual pupil absences. This will be better at representing deprivation to children in education.

Amongst other factors, before including an indicator to SIMD16 it must:

- have a sound reason for including it as an indicator

- it accurately reflects deprivation

- also be a useful indicator on its own More information can be found in the papers from our recent 'Measuring Deprivation Advisory Group' meeting, published online here

Progress Report

We recently held a meeting with the Measuring Deprivation Advisory Group which was a lively discussion. The group helps us at the SIMD team keep in touch with practitioners, academics. Members of the group have a lot of experience working in deprivation matters and they will also help us to make changes in SIMD16.

Data Agreements are being put in place to ensure we have the right data at the right time. The last agreement being worked out is with the Department of Work and Pensions who help us deliver the Income and Employment Domains.

We will also be getting in touch with Local Authorities to make sure we have experts from all across Scotland to help us quality assure SIMD16.
