Rural Deprivation – Coming later this month

As part of our commitment to help make SIMD more applicable in rural areas, we have developed an evidence summary on rural deprivation.

Studies show people living in rural areas face different challenges to those in urban areas. Public transport, fuel poverty and broadband are particularly important issues. Later this month, we will publish case studies to show how SIMD, with other publicly available data, can be used to explore issues in rural areas.

One case study will demonstrate how using census data to explore child poverty in the Orkney Islands can help to identify small areas where children might be at risk. The second looks at fuel poverty in Dumfries and Galloway. Here, 46% of households are fuel poor. We compare SIMD with other data to examine whether households without access to the gas grid are likely to pay higher prices for fuel and if they are in deprived areas. Glasgow Women's Library

Maike from the SIMD team visited the Glasgow Women's Library (GWL) in November through the 'Analytical Exchange Programme' to discuss how SIMD can be used for funding applications, and how deprivation of the arts and culture can be measured.

This programme matches government analysts with a third sector organisation to complete a small project together and exchange skills and perspectives.

The GWL staff were very welcoming, and the discussions lively.

GWL is the only accredited museum in the UK dedicated to women's lives, histories and achievements, with a lending library, archive collections and innovative programmes of public events & learning opportunities.
