salsus has been running since 1982, initially collecting information on smoking habits. Drinking trends have been measured since 1990 and drug use trends since 1998.

































A regular smoker is defined as someone who smokes at least one cigarette a week. Results are based on a self-completion survey of 1,749 S2 and S4 pupils. Fieldwork was conducted between September 2013 and March 2014. Data are weighted by local authority, year group, sex, school denomination, school sector and area type (i.e. urban/rural) using the Scottish Government's pupils census data, independent schools data and urban/rural classification.
