



## Cereal and oilseed rape harvest: first estimates – 2023



## **Summary**

Industry experts predict an average year for cereal production. Total cereal production is expected to be around 3.0 million tonnes, in line with the ten-year average. Variable weather this year likely means mixed harvest outcomes for Scottish farms. Some good wheat yields are being seen but there have been challenges for spring barley. Final estimates of the Scottish harvest will be published in December. Final results are collected from farms after the harvest has finished.
