Section 2(4) outlines governance arrangements. With integration of health and social care functions, it is vital that this section make explicit the importance of clinical and professional governance. This requires the involvement of heads of professional, directors of psychology, clinical directors, nursing directors, and AHP directors, and the Act must incorporate such professional governance arrangements to ensure the consistency and cohesiveness of service delivery, and quality assurance.

As it stands, the draft currently only describes the need for a Clinical Director or Associate Medical Director on the Joint Board. No other clinical professions are identified. This is not helpful, as failure to include Psychology, Nursing, Midwives, and Allied Health Professions will impact on the ability of the Joint Board to make informed decisions.
