I would like to comment on the Review of the Protection of

Wild Animals (Scotland) Act 2002.

I farm at the above address, which is in the Teviot

Country, & I welcome the Hunt, when & if it arrives.

My main farm income comes from sheep farming, & at this time of year (lambing), I am here that the fox population is not out of control. Part of my farm lies into the River Teviot, & was formerly a SSSI. This site is a haven for foxes, because it lies to the sea, & its gradient (v. steep) & also because of bracken, gorse which grows in abundance there.

I would suspect that flushing with two hounds would not work - the foxes would not break cover, - the shooter would lose intact - so have, or fail to run up in the first place.

There is no doubt in my mind that the Act as it is - works.

If has killed 'the start' of hunting foxes to a pretty major extent -

now are the 10 mile packs (riding to distract the fox) of bygone days.

Hunt subscriptions are down, otherwise mounted followers, & the police have downgraded hunt activities to very low priority. (No Vandalism or

disorderliness!)

Some people (myself included) have got up some Hunt Tawks - this
helps the mounted followers remember what shooting is taking place. This
gives the mounted followers some excitement, commandment etc when hunting
more on to the next draw. (Places where foxes might lie.)

It has supporters from all walks of life. I support people in our area
who are in balance for hunting - we do have good community spirit. &
have made a sensible donation to the Mayhew Trust and the
local Badger General Hospital.

There are 7 packs of Fox Hunts in the Scottish Borders County Area
- on high days & holidays (Christmas & New Year etc.). I support those who are more
people at the Hunt meet than at the rough game taking place.
In conclusion, hunting/shooting with 2 hounds would not work
- totally impractical. Community are certainly not against hunting. Police
are not really involved. My cynical mind thinks that this review has
been brought about by the SNP - who's threatening to vote against the
English law at Westminster - which proposed bringing it into line with Scottish
law, & somehow have to now justify their position having failed the
world not vote on solely English matters!
