The act seems to be working well around here with regard to foxes.

But attempting to flush foxes out of thick cover with only 2 dogs would be a waste of time & quite ineffective. The foxes would easily dodge the dogs & remain in the cover, out of sight of the guns.

But we have far too many badgers, with noticeable reductions in their prey species - ground nesting birds (particularly oystercatchers, peregrines & curlews), hedgehogs & bumble bees.

Some control of the badger population would relieve the pressure on the prey species.
