## **2. OVERVIEW OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE OPERATIONAL PROGRAMME (ARTICLE 50(2) AND 111(3)(A) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1303/2013)**

### **2.1. Key information on the implementation of the operational programme for the year concerned, including on financial instruments, with relation to the financial and indicator data.**

Key themes and generic issues impacted across all the priority themes are summarised below:

- Compliance, this continues to cause challenges to Lead Partners and the Managing Authority, across all priority areas. The complexity and robustness of documentary information required to fully verify claims is one aspect impacting on Lead Partners and the Managing Authority. Lack of robust, and appropriate, evidence to support the claim has also impacted on delivery of operations and the number of claims approved.
- It is also acknowledged that obtaining the required evidence is challenging, procurement documentation for example. Lead Partners have faced significant difficulties obtaining data and evidence to verify claims but have continued to make every effort to do so.
- Resource, the complexity and resource in terms of processing claims continues to challenge both Lead Partners and the Managing Authority. The verification process is complex and time consuming for all involved in the process. These challenges have resulted in delays in implementing strategic interventions and operations, impacting on physical and financial targets.
- Despite the substantial challenges facing Lead Partners and the Managing Authority, services and outputs continue to be delivered across Scotland.

To support Lead Partners with the delivery of operations, the Managing Authority is providing advice and support to Lead Partners, working collaboratively to agree realistic timescales and milestones, undertake system and verification checks and to support, and encourage, Lead Partners to upload all eligible claims onto EUMIS.

### 3. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PRIORITY AXIS (ARTICLE 50(2) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1303/2013)

#### 3.1. Overview of the implementation

1	Supporting Sustainable and Quality Employment and Supporting Labour Market Mobility	<p>The employability pipeline is a 5 stage process which allows constructive engagement for those who feel unable or ill prepared for the transition into employment. The pipelines have been rolled out across Scotland. The Programmes are locally tailored and programme rules specify that participants must have a minimum of two barriers to employment or progressing in the labour market. The employability pipeline is delivered by Local Authorities and Skills Development Scotland with delivery being a mix of in-house delivery, challenge funds and procurement. Pace of delivery has improved considerably since the pipelines commenced in 2015. At the end of 2019 the priority has 98% committed at the level of strategic interventions and 94% at the level of operations.</p> <p>During the delivery of phase one many lead partners experienced a number of operational issues. The transition from the 2007 – 2013 ESF programme (ESF P5 for Employability Pipeline) many anticipated that delivery would be similar to the previous programme. Delays in introducing the Participant Guidance from the MA led to a lack of understanding of the compliance and/or multiple barrier requirements, these requirements were underestimated by lead partners which resulted in a lack of resources to deal with compliance as well as an under estimation of the level of documentation required to evidence participant eligibility and results. In addition the roll out of Universal Credit (UC) caused compliance issues as many Lead Partners find it difficult to obtain and verify information from the Department of Work and Pensions UC system. The implementation of other Employability services in Scotland has resulted in multiple organisations targeting similar participants.</p>
2	Promoting Social Inclusion, combating poverty and any discrimination	<p>Overall commitment and progress has been much slower on promoting social inclusion and combating poverty than in the employability pipeline. At the end of 2019, 58% of the priority is committed at strategic intervention level with 56% committed at operation level.</p> <p>Support under this Priority is delivered at Local Authority and at Scottish Government national level. However ten local authority lead partners chose not to apply for their indicative allocation and other partners have selected not to extend their activity for a phase two. The reasons for the lower uptake of funds is largely due to compliance and lack of available match funding. Many lead partners also concentrated their efforts on Employability pipeline activity.</p> <p>For those operations which have commenced, a number of factors have contributed to the slower pace of delivery including prolonged development and procurement exercise, lack of recruitment of experienced staff and incorrect evidencing within the priority eg, evidencing multiple barriers which is not a requirement.</p>

		<p>The Managing Authority has worked closely with Lead Partners to provide advice and guidance regarding eligibility, agreeing milestones, undertaking verification checks and encouraging the upload of all eligibility participant and other outputs to the Eumis management information system.</p> <p>Despite the above issues the Performance Framework output targets have been achieved for the transition region hitting in excess of 80% of milestone target. To compare with the More Developed region, only the Deprived or Fragile Communities Supported has been achieved with disadvantaged participants in workless households and expenditure being less than 65% of the 2018 milestone.</p>
3	Investing in Education, Training and Vocational Training for Skills and Lifelong Learning	<p>The delivery of higher level qualifications aligned with the needs of growth industries and sectors is supported under the ‘Developing Scotland’s Workforce’ (DSW) intervention delivered by Scottish Funding Council and Skills Development Scotland. DSW was developed to create additional learning places linked to key sectors; Develop a new curriculum addressing the workforce skills gaps; Strategically expand Scotland's Modern Apprenticeship programme; Create a new work-based learning approach through Foundation Apprenticeships (starts at school) and support Advanced Apprenticeships (post-school).</p> <p>In the first phase of the Programme for both DSW strategic interventions, higher level skills ambitions were lower than anticipated. The Managing Authority has worked with the Lead Partners to address this in the second phase and these targets have been significantly increased. In particular targets for the transition area were less ambitious than the Programme targets. This was due to the distinct nature of the labour market and skills requirements in the Transition area, with significantly lower population density than the More Developed area, as well as limited access to higher education in the region historically. This led to a distinct and longer-term programme of activity, which supported greater initial support/development activities and increased progression routes into higher level degree, masters and doctorate level courses in the future. Although in the short-term targets are lower, in the longer-term the 2023 targets should be met.</p> <p>By end of 2019 both Lead Partners had still to have Phase 2 change requests to extend operations until 2023 agreed, therefore this priority was not yet fully committed at operation level.</p>
4	Youth Employment Initiative	<p>The Youth Employment Initiative in Scotland supports young people into employment and into additional learning places. Scotland committed £59m to 15 operations. The Managing Authority faced a number of challenges in committing all the YEI funds. This was largely due to a lack of clarity from the beginning about the way in which eligibility, unit cost models and audit rules would apply to YEI. However some of the difficulties also stemmed from the nature of youth unemployment in South West Scotland, in particular its close links to other forms of unemployment, poverty and deprivation in a formal industrial area; and the policy focus</p>

		<p>for Scotland which perhaps does not align well with the tight focus on fairly immediate and sustainable results for the individual participants.</p> <p>Other challenges which affected the commitment of YEI funds include not being able to target pre NEET clients; key lead partners not taking up their YEI funds due to the geographical nature of the programme or wanting to focus its efforts on the ESF funded employability pipeline activity. Perhaps the most important challenge has been the significant reduction in the youth unemployment rate in the West of Scotland compared to when the programme was first designed.</p> <p>The MA worked closely with lead partners to address compliance issues to maximise spend under this programme. However, difficulties remained which has resulted in partners submitting change request documentation to reduce or decommit funds citing lack of match funding, the impact of a decrease in youth unemployment and issues arising from audit and compliance requirements. One lead partner withdrew their full amount of funding due to compliance issues which was a blow to the programme.</p>
5	Technical Assistance	<p>The TA priority axis funds the functions of the MA and the AA. Within the MA, this supports three strands of activity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Three thematic teams (Smart, Sustainable and Inclusive) have day-to-day responsibility for management of approved operations. The teams work closely with the lead partners responsible for delivering operations under their area of the programme. This includes assessing and making proposals on applications for funding to the MA Approval Panel, comprised of team leaders across the MA; checking, verifying and paying claims for funding; and carrying out monitoring visits in line with the Monitoring and Control System.</li> <li>• The Programme Performance Team is responsible for carrying out quality checks on approved operations and claims; managing the EUMIS IT System; and maintaining and reviewing the Monitoring and Control System.</li> <li>• The Governance and Stakeholder Engagement Team supports the management of the programme, including as secretariat for the Programme Monitoring Committee and co-ordinating preparation and submission of the Implementation Reports; and delivery of the Communications strategy and Monitoring and Evaluation Strategy.</li> </ul>

#### 4. SYNTHESIS OF THE EVALUATIONS

Synthesis of the findings of all evaluations of the programme that have become available during the previous financial year, with reference of name and reference period of the evaluation reports used

The current Monitoring and Evaluation strategy was approved in 2020 and is published online (<https://www.gov.scot/publications/esif-monitoring-evaluation-strategy-2014-2020/>).

##### **Evaluation to Date**

To date, three evaluations have been carried out on the programme:

- Ex-ante Evaluation
- Both Youth Employment Initiative Evaluations
- Early mid-term review

##### **Ex-ante Evaluation**

The formal ex-ante evaluation was completed in November 2016 (<https://www.gov.scot/publications/esifformal-evaluations/>) ahead of the approval of the programmes. The work included the Equalities Impact Assessment, Strategic Environmental Assessment and Ex-ante Assessment of Financial Instruments. This has informed the development and implementation of the Ops and the selection of operations within each Programme.

##### **Youth Employment Initiative**

The first evaluation was completed in 2015 and the second in December 2018 (<https://www.gov.scot/publications/yei-evaluation-report-2014-2020/>). The most recent evaluation did not seek to provide recommendations, but identified a number of lessons learned or wider points for consideration.

The report was considered by the Youth Employment Initiative Territorial Committee when it met on 9 March 2019. The committee agreed with the report and noted five points in particular:

- The need for clear guidance on compliance from the outset, noted in the evaluation at points 5,6 and 8.
- Difficulty in gathering evidence of long-term results.
- The need to upskill small employers with regards to the compliance regime.
- Issues with online banking and the information that is presented/accepted.
- Different compliance regimes with other programmes (e.g. Scottish Employer Recruitment Initiative), noted in the evaluation at points 1 and 2.

Based on the evaluation, and ongoing stakeholder engagement work, the MAL

- Will note the need to be aware of the challenges of timing and aligning European and national policy initiatives in designing future programmes.
- Have taken into account the need to minimise the time from application submission to formal offer of grant to recipients in the 2018 MCS review.
- Have reviewed and revised processes for reviewing, revising and publishing guidance to lead partners, and revisions and support for the EUMIS IT system.
- Have introduced regular “lead partner events” to increase dialogue with lead partners.
- Are engaging with lead partners to ensure guidance and rules on evidence requirements are clear and appropriate.

Alongside this, we will engage with lead partners to confirm the final outcomes of the programmes and identify good examples of the support provided and publicise these in line with the Communications

Strategy.

### **Early Mid-term Evaluation**

In November 2016, the Joint Programme Monitoring Committee (JPMC) agreed to bring forward the mid-term review and the recommendations were agreed by the JPMC at the June 2017 meeting (<https://www.gov.scot/publications/jpmc-minutes-june-2017/>).

The recommendations agreed were to:

- Request changes to both the ERDF and ESF programmes
- Allocation the additional H&I allocations for ERDF to Priority 5 (Protecting the Environment) and ESF for Priority 3 (Investing in Education, Training and Vocational training)
- Request an increase in the Programme co-finance rates
- Change to National Rules to allow apportioned staff costs following confirmation with Audit and EC
- Consider eligible opportunities for digital skills, employability, mental health and financial engineering for social enterprises and, where appropriate, seek new interventions thereafter.

Based on this, revised Operational Programmes were submitted and agreed by both DG Emploi and DG Regio in late 2017.

### **Forthcoming Evaluations**

- The Monitoring and Evaluation Strategy was reviewed during 2020 and approved through Written

Procedure by the Programme Monitoring Committee (PMC) in March 2020. The identified evaluations have not been taken forward due to the impact of Covid-19.

## 6 ISSUES AFFECTING THE PERFORMANCE OF THE PROGRAMME AND MEASURES TAKEN (ARTICLE 50(2) OF REGULATION (EU) No 1303/2013)

### (a) Issues which affect the performance of the programme and the measures taken

The main issues affecting performance of the ESF Programme relate to the complexity of the compliance requirements and the additional evidencing required in order to meet programme requirements. This has impacted on the lead partners ability to submit timeous claims.

During 2019 the ESF programme was placed into pre-suspension and later in the year it was into full suspension. As a consequence, the Managing Authority was not able to pay any claims from Lead Partners while it worked to resolve the audit issues identified in the ESF Early Preventative System Audit (EPSA) report from 2018. Lead Partners who had submitted claims on EUMIS system could not progress any further claims as the claims were 'locked'. The urgent priority for both the Managing Authority and Lead Partners to make early progress on the development of the Standard Scale of Unit Costs system resulted in a drastic slowdown in the rate at which claims were submitted, verified and paid. For example, in August 2019 the Managing Authority had to request Lead Partners not to submit further claims on EUMIS and this remained in force until January 2020. In addition, it is important to recognise that Lead Partners had a number of other competing priorities to balance. These centred around phase two change requests and preparation for Article 125 (b) and Article 127 on the spot checks.

Due the issues described above the achievement of expenditure and physical performance targets are below the expected level at this stage of the Programme, especially for the Poverty and Social Inclusion priority axis.

### **ESF Priority One - Supporting Sustainable and Quality Employment and Supporting Labour Market Mobility**

The Managing Authority continues to work extensively with Lead Partners to ensure that they are clear about compliance requirements. Often evidence has to come from the UK Department of Work and Pensions (DWP). The roll out of Universal Credit (UC) has created difficulties for Lead Partners as many of them find it difficult to obtain and verify information from the DWP UC system. In addition, DWP has changed the way that Lead Partners/Delivery Agent should gather participant labour market eligibility

evidence. Instead of obtaining information direct from DWP, the Lead Partner/Delivery Agent now has to obtain this information direct from the participant via screenshots from their Universal Credit account. Therefore many Lead Partners/Delivery Agent struggled to get the necessary evidence to determine the full eligibility of the participant. This change was introduced during the second half of 2019.

The MA reviewed its Participant Guidance, particularly around Universal Credit and aligned this Guidance with UC Guidance used in other parts of the United Kingdom in order assist Lead Partners. However Lead Partners continue to struggle to obtain the necessary information and the MA liaises regularly with DWP and the Lead Partner group to resolve issues.

Compliance and prioritising time and resources to deliver the employability pipeline activity is the main reason for the lower update of Funds.

The MA holds regular portfolio meetings with Lead Partners to address any delivery or compliance issues. In addition quarterly Lead Partners meetings are held to review performance of the ESF programme and address any operational concerns.

### **ESF P2 – Promoting Social Inclusion and Combating Poverty**

This priority has been new activity for many of the Lead Partners who have been able to commence activity. Many Lead Partners were evidencing participant barriers which is not a requirement for this priority. The Managing Authority has worked closely with those Lead Partners, particularly around compliance requirements. The Portfolio & Compliance Managers hold regular portfolio meeting with Lead Partners in their portfolio and the MA has held workshops with Lead Partners and their Delivery Agents.

### **ESF P3 – Investing in Education, Training and Vocational Training**

The activity within this Priority is delivered by two Lead Partners, Skills Development Scotland (SDS) and Scottish Funding Council (SFC). As noted earlier the ESF Suspension and EPSA issues caused problems for SDS and meant that one of their claims was on 'hold' while we tried to resolve the issues. This meant that further claims could not be submitted. Claims have continued to be submitted by SFC, however, these claims are large and are time consuming to verify and pay. This, added to earlier delays, means that expenditure and activity is not at the expected level for this Priority.

### **ESF P4 – Youth Employment Initiative**

As with other ESF Priorities, YEI claims have been slow to be submitted and then further delayed with the ESF suspension and EPSA issues. The YEI activity in SW Scotland has not performed as expected due to the change in economic circumstances that have taken place in the area since 2012 and the clients that were envisaged to be supported by the Programme are just not available. Those that are unemployed tend to have more barriers and need more in-depth support which is not what the YEI Programme was designed to provide. This has meant lots of underspends with the YEI operations. The MA has worked with the Lead Partners to overcome any compliance issues and a YEI Territorial Committee met up until March 2019 to discuss and address operational issues. With the YEI activity ending in December 2018 the MA has worked with Lead partners to ensure that Final Claims can be submitted and paid, however due to the delays described above at the end of 2019 there were still some outstanding final claims to be paid.

(b) An assessment of whether progress made towards targets is sufficient to ensure their fulfilment, indicating any remedial actions taken or planned, where appropriate.

With the Managing Authority not being in a position to pay many claims during 2019, this resulted in many lead partners not being able to report their progress and outputs as they were unable to submit timeous claims.

The Performance Framework outputs targets have been achieved for both the More Developed and Transition region hitting in excess of 80% of milestones achieved for targets for Supporting Sustainable and Quality Employment and Supporting Labour Market Mobility. However the performance has been mixed for Promoting Social Inclusion, Combating Poverty and Discrimination and in Investing in Education, Training and Vocational Training.

Some lead partners have assessed the performance of their operation and working with their Portfolio and Compliance Manager (PCM) have submitted change requests to revise their expenditure and outcomes downwards. These change requests have been reviewed, discussed and approved by the Managing Authority Approval Panel (MAAP).

The Managing Authority continues to work with Lead Partners to ensure that claims can be submitted as quickly as possible and that outputs are recorded on the EUMIS system. In addition to quarterly lead partner events regularly cover compliance requirements. The Growth teams regularly hold portfolio meetings with lead partners to discuss issues such as progress with performance and verification standards. In addition Lead Partner meetings relevant to the respective teams are held on a quarterly basis to discuss performance management and address common issues and concerns.
