TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (SCOTLAND) ACT 1997 APPLICATION FOR PLANNING PERMISSION IN PRINCIPLE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF LAND FOR RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES AT MILNQUARTER FARM, ROMAN ROAD, BONNYBRIDGE

Scottish Ministers have decided to require the above planning application to be referred to them for determination in terms of Section 46 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997. Accordingly a Direction to that effect is enclosed.

This Direction is given in view of the proposed development's interconnection with the proposal for a distributor road which is also being called in by Scottish Ministers due to the possible significant adverse impacts on the setting of scheduled monuments and the Outstanding Universal Value of the Frontiers of the Roman Empire (Antonine Wall) World Heritage Site and would allow consideration of the whole interconnected scheme in its entirety.

Regulation 35 of The Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 2013 requires the planning authority to serve notice on the applicant for planning permission of the terms of the Direction, of the reasons for issuing it, that the application has been referred to Scottish Ministers and that the decision of Ministers will be final. In connection with the service of notice, your attention is drawn to section 271 of the 1997 Act. I should be glad if your Council would serve the required notice and let me have a copy. There is also a requirement to include a copy of the decision to call in on the planning register in accordance with regulation 16 and paragraph 3(d) of Schedule 2.

The application will be submitted to the Directorate for Planning and Environmental Appeals (DPEA) in Falkirk for an examination by a reporter of all the evidence submitted in accordance with the Town and Country Planning (Appeals) (Scotland) Regulations 2013. I would be grateful if you would prepare a disk containing all the application documentation, as









this data is required by DPEA to insert on to their web site. The disk should be sent directly to Mr David Henderson, Head of Performance and Administration, DPEA, 4 The Courtyard, Callendar Business Park, Callendar Road, Falkirk FK1 1XR who will make arrangements for processing the case. Thereafter the appointed reporter has been asked to submit a report with recommendations to Scottish Ministers for their consideration and determination.
