

ELC Expansion Programme Update (June 2019)

1. DELIVERY ASSURANCE

Simon and the delivery assurance team have continued to meet with councils around the country, as well as with ADES and RIC early years groups.

We are working to provide access to individual support where required on issues of policy, capital programme management, business modelling, and contingency planning. We are also working to unblock issues that councils have raised with us to provide a once-for-Scotland solution.

The data return provided by each council to the Improvement Service has been collated and reported to the Joint Delivery Board. Nationally, the data showed that the programme is moving forwards as forecast, although of course there is local variation.

Update on Scotland Excel guidance from Scottish Government and COSLA

The Scottish Government, on behalf of the Service Models Working Group, commissioned Scotland Excel to develop a suite of supporting operational guidance and information that helps local authorities and providers in the private and third sectors, including childminders, implement Funding Follows the Child, and the underpinning National Standard, from August 2020.

This includes the following technical guidance notes which were published on 29 April:

Scotland Excel are now developing template terms and conditions, and supporting tender documentation, that local authorities can draw on as they develop their commissioning approaches ahead of the introduction of the expanded entitlement and Funding Follows the Child in August 2020.

Scotland Excel are also working with the Regional Improvement Collaboratives to run specific sessions on the guidance over the Summer, and, in addition to this we will look to include further sessions on the Scotland Excel guidance as part of our wider programme of engagement to support implementation of Funding Follows the Child.

Information on Local Authority Support and Funding for ELC Providers

In addition to the hourly rate that providers receive for delivering the funded entitlement, local authorities also provide a range of benefits and support to funded providers. As we progress towards the full roll-out of 1140 hours, and the introduction of Funding Follows the Child, in August 2020 there have been substantial changes in the hourly rates and the support offered to providers.

To understand the changes in the sector the Scottish Government wrote to local authorities on 8 April 2019 to request an update on their actions to support partnership in their area, and on the hourly rates that are paid to funded providers for the delivery of funded Early Learning and Childcare.

A summary of the information provided by local authorities is now available on the Knowledge Hub. This covers, by local authority area, the following information: hourly rates (for delivering 600 hours); hourly rates in 2019-20 for phasing (delivering more than 600 hours); any payments to providers for the delivery of meals as part of phasing; and a summary of the actions to support providers in each local authority.

Legislative changes

Further to the May programme update, the Scottish Parliament has now approved two pieces of secondary legislation to support the ELC expansion programme:

[The Children and Young People \(Scotland\) Act 2014 \(no.1\) Order 2019.](#)

- This order removes the minimum session length for funded ELC (currently 2.5 hours) and increase the maximum session to 10 hours or less (currently 'less than 8 hours') so funded ELC can be delivered in a whole day session (e.g. 08:00-18:00).
- The changes to session length supports our wider efforts to improve flexibility of access to affordable ELC and support parents who are in work, training or further study.
- Changes to the minimum framework do not place an obligation on ELC settings to provide the maximum 10 hour sessions where these are not already offered.
- This order will take force from **August 2019** to support local authorities to provide more flexibility on session lengths, and to test new delivery models, during the phasing period and in preparation for full implementation of 1140 hours.

[The Children and Young People \(Scotland\) Act 2014 \(no.2\) Order 2019.](#)

- This order formally changes in legislation the amount of funded ELC children are entitled to from 600 hours to 1140 hours. This order will take force from **August 2020**.
- This will provide the necessary legislative basis to underpin the work local authorities are already doing to deliver the expanded ELC offer from August 2020.

Impact Assessments

Our Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA), Children's Rights and Wellbeing Assessment and Business and Regulatory Impact Assessment (BRIA) were published last month to accompany the legislation package. These can be viewed here:

Further Equality Impact Assessments relating to specific non-legislative aspects of the ELC Expansion Programme will also be published imminently. Those include EqIAs considering:

- the barriers to taking up employment in the ELC sector and diversifying the workforce;
- the barriers to children with protected characteristics fully benefitting from their ELC experience; and
- how changes to the income threshold impacts the eligible two year old population.

The impact of the policy will, of course, depend on local implementation. That is why we are hoping to share our learning with local authorities, to support local EqIAs and FSDAs. We are hoping to host some events later in the year to share our learning and support the sharing of best practice between local authorities.

Statutory Guidance Refresh

We are beginning work to revise and update the Statutory Guidance on ELC. The guidance was first published in 2014 and so it is necessary to review the document to incorporate updates to policy and reflect the new context of delivering the expanded entitlement from August 2020.

We will provide an opportunity for the sector to inform the development of the updated Guidance. In particular, we will be looking for insights from across the ELC sector to understand how to make the guidance as effective and accessible as possible. We will shortly be convening a short life working group to support the development of the updated guidance. The draft Statutory Guidance will then undergo wider public consultation this autumn.

ELC Partnership Forum

In order to support and promote genuine partnership between providers and local authorities, the Scottish Government and COSLA have established the ELC Partnership Forum.

The Forum met on 18 June in the Forth Valley and West Lothian Regional Improvement Collaborative area at the Stirling Highland Hotel, with the meeting focusing on parental engagement, support that local authorities offer to their funded providers, and the emerging programme for the ELC Partnership Summit.

Any provider can apply to join the membership pool (via the email address below). Attendee numbers for each Forum are limited in order to enable small group discussions. Meetings are taken around the country using Regional Improvement Collaborative (RIC) areas as a guiding principle and to help maximise local representation, wherever possible. The Forum's membership pool is steadily increasing with 160 members now having joined, which includes 140 members from the private and third sector.

We understand that some RIC areas are looking at setting up local partnership arrangements, with the West Partnership establishing its own forum. Its inaugural meeting took place on 7 June.

Parental communication

7. 2 YEAR OLD OFFER

We are currently working towards a legislative solution to protect the eligibility for those 2 year olds whose parents who will be affected by changes to UK Government policies in respect of the increase in the National Living Wage and a freeze to the income threshold for those in receipt of both maximum Working Tax Credit and Child Tax Credit. We have now laid legislation to increase the income threshold before the Scottish Parliament.

Subject to approval from the Minister, we have agreed with COSLA that we will write out to Local Authorities to provide an update on the forthcoming legislation and ask to bring in the revised income threshold using their discretionary powers in advance of the SSI being laid and coming into force.
