

## **ELC Expansion Programme Update (May 2019)**

### **1. DELIVERY ASSURANCE**

Simon and the delivery assurance team have been around the country over the last few weeks meeting councils to discuss implementation. We have been able to provide access to individual support where required on issues of policy, capital programme management, business modelling, and contingency planning. A key topic of discussion has been understanding the specific challenges that authorities face, and how Scottish Government can support councils and add to council's existing additional capabilities. We will also be engaging with ADES Early Years and Resources networks to discuss delivery at future meetings.

## **Update on Scotland Excel guidance from Scottish Government and COSLA**

The Scottish Government, on behalf of the Service Models Working Group, commissioned Scotland Excel to develop a suite of supporting operational guidance and information that helps local authorities and providers in the private and third sectors, including childminders, implement Funding Follows the Child, and the underpinning National Standard, from August 2020.

This includes the following technical guidance notes which were published on 29 April and cover:

### **Legislative changes**

On 3 May the Scottish Government laid two pieces of secondary legislation in the Scottish Parliament to support the ELC expansion programme:

#### **[The Children and Young People \(Scotland\) Act 2014 \(no.1\) Order 2019.](#)**

- This order will remove the minimum session length for funded ELC (currently 2.5 hours) and increase the maximum session to 10 hours or less (currently 'less than 8 hours') so funded ELC can be delivered in a whole day session (e.g. 08:00-18:00).
- The changes to session length will support our wider efforts to improve flexibility of access to affordable ELC and support parents who are in work, training or further study.
- Changes to the minimum framework will not place an obligation on ELC settings to provide the maximum 10 hour sessions where these are not already offered.
- It is intended that this order will take force from August 2019 to support local authorities to provide more flexibility on session lengths, and to test new delivery models, during the phasing period and in preparation for full implementation of 1140 hours.

#### **[The Children and Young People \(Scotland\) Act 2014 \(no.2\) Order 2019.](#)**

- This order will formally change in legislation the amount of funded ELC children are entitled to from 600 hours to 1140 hours. This will provide the necessary legislative basis to underpin the work local authorities are already doing to deliver the expanded ELC offer from August 2020.

The Education and Skills Committee agreed the Orders on 22 May 2019, and they will now be subject to a vote in the Scottish Parliament before summer recess.

## **ELC Partnership Forum**

In order to support and promote genuine partnership between providers and local authorities, the Scottish Government and COSLA established the ELC Partnership Forum. The next meeting of the Forum will take place on 18 June in the Forth Valley and West Lothian Regional Improvement Collaborative (RIC) area at the Stirling Highland Hotel.

Any provider can apply to join the membership pool (via the email address below), however attendee numbers for each Forum are limited in order to enable small group discussions. Meetings are taken around the country using RIC areas as a guiding principle and to help maximise local representation, wherever possible. The Forum's membership pool is steadily increasing with 158 members now having joined, which includes 138 members from the private and third sector.

We understand that some RIC areas are looking at setting up local partnership arrangements, with the West Partnership establishing its own forum. Its inaugural meeting will take place on 7 June.

We are also planning to facilitate a significant Forum event in late summer to involve all members of the pool, local authorities and national organisations. More information about this will follow.
