Member Reappointed to Shetland NHS Board

The Cabinet Secretary for Health and Sport, Jeane Freeman MSP today announced the reappointment of Jane Haswell as a Member of Shetland NHS Board.

MEMBER

Jane Haswell has served on Shetland NHS Board and Shetland Integration Joint Board for the last four years, holding Chair positions within Clinical Care and Clinical Strategy Program Board. Her experience of clinical governance systems along with audit and risk will continue to be important skills within the Board membership. Jane's career started as a Podiatrist for Health Boards in Scotland and Wales before moving to management within Social Care. As a Partners in Policy Making graduate, she has a national perspective of the barriers and inequalities faced by marginalised people within our communities. She is a Health & Care Lecturer within UHI as well as having board level involvement in third sector charities, finding creative ways to support interventions focusing on prevention. Using her energy and commitment, she will continue promoting real partnership where lived experience and the patient voice are front and central to shaping the future of integrated services.

REAPPOINTMENT

This reappointment will be for four years and will run from 1st January 2022 to 31st December 2025.

This reappointment is regulated by the Ethical Standards Commissioner.

REMUNERATION

This reappointment is part-time and attracts a remuneration of £8,095 per annum for a time commitment of one day per week.

OTHER MINISTERIAL APPOINTMENTS

Natasha Cornick does not hold any other ministerial public appointments.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY

All appointments are made on merit and political activity plays no part in the selection process. However, in accordance with the original Nolan recommendations, there is a requirement for appointees' political activity within the last five years (if there is any to be declared) to be made public.

Natasha Cornick has had no political activity within the last five years.
