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Introduction

This data specification contains the core questions to be used in the monitoring short term let licences by local authorities. It includes the acceptable methods and media for sending the data, the overall format of the data file, and rules governing when to send data. Definitions and validation checks on each variable are also provided. This document is intended to be a working document and will be updated periodically as required. File Format and Sample Data

Data should be sent in XML format.

The XSD schema and sample data is available at the end of the document.

The XML schema should adopt a flat record format (one full record per application). This will result in multiple records for individual properties where multiple applications are present in the public register (for instance where an application for renewal has been received while the existing licence is still valid). In such instances, analysis by Unique Property Reference Number (UPRN) and property address will generate information on all applications associated with each individual property for analytical purposes.

In the event of unsuccessful applications and revoked licences, it is important to capture the reason(s) why applications were not granted.

File Transmission

After the end of each quarter local authorities should submit an XML file of their data to the Scottish Government. Data transmission will be via the Scottish Government's ProcXed data system. Further information will be provided in time for local authorities to upload their data.

Rules for sending data

Cases should be submitted in batches four times a year.

Local authorities should send the current contents of their public register, as specified in this document. This should include all currently granted licences, as well as all applications pending determination, along with applications in the last 12 months that have been rejected, refused, revoked, lapsed, suspended or withdrawn.

This 'in the last 12' months approach is to ensure that we receive all the required information on the records being removed for legitimate reasons over recent quarters. However after this time frame, records that have been refused, revoked, withdrawn, lapsed etc over 12 months previously can be safely removed from the data provided.

Authorities are not required to send through data for invalid applications until all the necessary information has been provided by the applicant and the application is considered valid. However authorities can if they wish send through records for invalid applications, especially if most of the data fields relating to the data specification have been completed.

We are aware from the provision of the first quarter of data that local authorities are currently recording the data behind this field in different ways, and that any change to the required format of Ward codes for this specification may cause some further work for authorities to implement. We therefore propose to explore this further through circulating a paper setting out further details of the current position and the available GSS Ward codes, and to consider how this may help to standardise the approach whilst also assessing any implications on authorities.

Description of the type of licence. Although the type of licence is already represented in the last character of the licence number, a separate variable will aid the analysis of STL data by different types of licences.

Following 1 October 2023 all applications received should use 'N' for new applications, to be changed to 'F' at the point in time that an application is granted, or if the licence application isn't granted, then the 'N' code should remain and the Status of Application field should be recorded as Refused or another appropriate outcome. For clarity, note that an 'N' licence number will not allow a host to operate.

Any provisional 'P' type licences which are already in the system, or which relate to applications from existing hosts that have been received before 1 October 2023 but not yet input into the system, should be recorded as 'P' types, to be changed to 'F' at the point in time that an application is granted, or if the licence application isn't granted, then the 'P' code should remain and the Status of Application field should be recorded as Refused or another appropriate outcome.
