The Crown Estate Transfer Scheme 2017

I am writing to confirm that the Crown Estate Transfer Scheme 2017 (the Scheme) has been laid before the UK Parliament today, 1 March. It will now be subject to a debate and vote in both Houses.

We expect the scheme to come in to force on 1 April 2017, as provisionally agreed by our respective officials, and I enclose a copy of the draft Scheme as it has been laid.

Dear David,

It was a pleasure to meet you here in Edinburgh on 8 September.

We discussed implementation of the Scotland Act 2016, and noted that progress continues to be made across the range of activities covered in the legislation. As I said, our major concern is that the considerable turbulence and workload caused by the outcomes of the EU referendum does not distract from transferring the new powers. I therefore welcomed your reassurance that implementation of the Act remains a top priority for the UK Government.

The sharing of information between our two governments is an essential part of this process. For example, it would be very helpful to have key financial information on tribunals and Crown Estate management shared with the Scottish Government now to enable the Scottish Government's planned programmes to continue on schedule. For the Crown Estate, it is also important to ensure that tight timetables do not slip for agreeing the draft Transfer Scheme, memorandum of understanding and block grant adjustment, as we work towards these powers commencing on 1 April 2017.
