





- 1) Raising awareness videos for NHS have been produced as a pilot and joint initiative with NHS England, based on the previously produced materials by South East England Councils. After successful completion and launch of the campaign by the NHS England, the Commissioner plans to approach relevant authorities across all devolved administrations to seek support and, hopefully, to replicate the campaign. However, in view of the differences in legislation in Scotland and Northern Ireland, the video materials will have to be tweaked.
- 2) Re the toolkit for local authorities, this is still work in progress and early stages. I can reassure you that we will be consulting relevant stakeholders in Scotland (as well as Northern Ireland) during this process to take into consideration the legal differences and local authorities particular powers and duties.

- 3) The Commissioner is in process of establishing partnership relations with the Children Commissioners for each respective devolved administration. The Children and Young People's Commissioner for Scotland, has been invited to the event in Westminster Abbey on the 12th of October ("Wreath Laying to Commemorate the work of William Wilberforce ahead of Anti-Slavery Day 2016) organised by the Commissioner.
- 4) The Commissioner has arranged for the International Bar Association's (IBA) Human Trafficking Task Force to fund and develop training programmes for Judges and Police Officers in England and Wales on the Modern Slavery Act 2015. It is a pilot project and following its successful implementation the Commissioner plans to promote best practice in Scotland and Northern Ireland.

Thanks, please find enclosed the report with slight additional comments on the content attached.

We noticed it's a little light on engagement with Scotland and wondered how this will play with our Ministers. Can you consider fleshing the report out in those areas where such engagement has taken place or providing details of your involvement in the following areas so we can respond to Ministerial inquiries if they arise?

Page 15 – liaison with NHS England – safeguarding lead for the training of frontline staff in health, emergency services and councils – can you indicate what contact has been made with NHS Scotland in this regard and what their response to this has been? Are they involved in the creation of the video/materials discussed and will they have access to it as part of their training of staff in NHS in Scotland?

Page 18 – the Commissioner has commissioned a practical toolkit for use by local authorities and health services to asses victim long term needs and to help analyse potential risks to further harm or exploitation. Can you set out whether this commission includes a toolkit which will take into account the different legal basis for support in Scotland given local authorities particular powers and duties here – will it therefore be useful for Scotlish local authorities?

Page 19 – while noting that there is particular engagement between the commissioner and the Children's commissioner for England re the camps in Calais, together with engagement more generally, has there been similar general engagement with the Children and Young People's Commissioner Scotland?

Page 20 – training – noting law enforcement officer training manual being developed by the IBA, and that there will be a series of events across the UK, can you let us know the details of the Scottish event(s)? While at the event we discussed the Prime Minister's new modern slavery taskforce. The Home Office have indicated that membership of the task force would not be available to Scottish Ministers and we discussed the Scottish Government's view that despite that, the Scottish Ministers should indeed be a member. We discussed the Scottish Government's view that a truly UK wide taskforce required the involvement of devolved administrations, and you indicated that you would raise the issue of membership with the Prime Minister's office.

We have been in discussion with officials from the Northern Irish Executive on this issue and they have confirmed that their Ministers have similarly not been asked to join the taskforce. Northern Irish officials have indicated that they are also of the view that NI Ministers should also be a member. 


