Taxation

Multiple announcements in a Kezia Dugdale speech [29/02/16, Scottish Labour Website]:

- Increase the basic rate of income tax. No longer plan to introduce a rebate of £100 for individuals earning below £20,000 as UK Government plans to increase the personal allowance mean this is no longer necessary. [BBC, 30/03/2016]
- Bring back the 50p top rate of tax to invest in education.
- Keeping the income tax higher rate threshold at the current level (rather than adopting the UK Gov plans for increases).
- Oppose the abolition of Air Passenger Duty.
- Scrap the council tax and replace it with a property tax, a tourist tax and land value tax on vacant, economically inactive land. Under the proposals, properties worth £180,000 or less would be taxed £450, plus 0.35% of the property value. For properties worth more than this, the portion of the value above £180,000 would attract a rate of 0.9% of the property value. The maximum charge would be capped at £3,000, with a cap on year-on-year increases at 3%. [BBC Website, 22/03/16]
