
Dear Mr. Ewing,



Dear Minister,

First of all, allow me to greet you and express my appreciation for your ambitious and inspiring reform programme. I am certain that it will have a transformational impact nationally.

I feel very much linked to Scotland at this moment as I was Head of the School of Economics and Finance at the University of St. Andrews before being appointed Minister of Education of the Government of Catalonia. I learned a lot at St Andrews, and that has assisted my goal to serve my co-citizens and to make my country a better place to live in. I said farewell to St Andrews with a deep gratitude for allowing me to serve Catalonia at this historical moment.

I am writing to express my deep concern following the recent attacks to democracy in Catalonia. Since 2012, over a million people every year have been peacefully demonstrating for the right to self-determination for our nation. The government to which I belong was elected democratically with the mandate to hold a referendum, which has been set for 1 October 1st. Unfortunately, the Spanish government has ignored such a demand and brought about a de facto state of emergency last Wednesday September 20<sup>th</sup>, which infringes upon this democratic right of every nation.

These attacks are an alarming threat to our shared values of democracy, freedom of expression, and respect for diversity. They are at the heart of our European Union. As Minister of Education, I strive to uphold these values for every learner, classroom and school in Catalonia. I believe that we cannot accept any backward steps with regards to such basic civil rights, which will also be critical to the cohesion of our increasingly diverse societies.

I hope that we will have the opportunity to meet soon to discuss how we can work together to build a better future for our younger generations. I would also be very pleased to welcome you to Barcelona.

Le Clara,

Thank you very much for your letter of 22 September. I very much appreciate your kind words on what we are doing to improve education in Scotland, particularly in the light of your close personal links with Scotland and St Andrews. I know that you share my belief in the importance of excellence in education and I wish you well with your own endeavours.

My colleagues and I have been watching with growing concern recent events in Catalonia. The Scottish Government does not have a view as to whether or not Catalonia should become an independent state, that is a matter for the people of Catalonia, just as Scotland's future is a matter for the people of Scotland. However we do believe strongly in the right of self-determination as an important international principle which must be respected.

Whilst the constitutional positions of Catalonia and Scotland are not the same and the frameworks in which our countries operate are very different, our own experience here in 2014 shows that it is possible for two Governments with diametrically opposed views on the constitutional future to come together to agree a process that allowed the people to decide. It is essential that civil rights and democracy are respected at all times by all nations and I sincerely hope that there can be dialogue between the Catalan Government and the Spanish Government to ensure a peaceful resolution in the coming days.

I thank you again for your warm greetings and wish you well for the important days ahead.
