My colleague passed on your e-mail.

I'm grateful for your offer of help. However please note that, in close liaison with the Taoiseach's office, we are already some way down the line in terms of developing Mr FitzPatrick's visit programme for Dublin. Content focusses firmly on Mr FitzPatrick's portfolio interests and reflects Ms Doherty's specific request to discuss management of parliamentary business in Scotland. The Minister's time in Dublin will also be shorter than originally envisaged, reducing scope for adding to the programme.

The plan is to arrange a series of meetings across Mr FitzPatrick's portfolio as Minister for Parliamentary Business – this includes elections, FOI and the Open Government Partnership.
