Many thanks for your reply.

The plan is to arrange a series of meetings across Mr FitzPatrick's portfolio as Minister for Parliamentary Business – this includes elections, FOI and the Open Government Partnership. Precise timings are unknown but I imagine we're looking at a series of 60/90 minute 'slots' - at this stage we're at the scoping out interest/availability part of the process.

The visit will be built around the meeting with Ms Doherty. However, we're hoping that other portfolio meetings can also be arranged at Ministerial/senior official level - hence approaching you for FOI interests as I understand responsibility for FOI sits with the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform (I'm not aware of other approaches being made with respect to meetings with your Minister in context of the Office of Government Procurement but will inquire).

If Mr Donohoe was available for a meeting that would obviously be great. The aim of the proposed meetings would be for Mr FitzPatrick to be informed about Irish policy developments e.g. on FOI and to provide background on current practice/developments in Scotland.
