



Dear Fergus,

At the May 2017 meeting of the aquaculture Industry Leadership Group (ILG), you proposed a working group on the Vision 2030 recommendation on introducing Innovation Sites, and asked SAIC to facilitate that happening. This letter is signed by 17 members of the industry, the SSPO and SAIC, and is submitted on their collective behalf.

In response, the industry has quickly come together to form a group comprising both producers and suppliers, and to frame proposals. The aim is to design a regulatory and licensing framework for Innovation Sites that would progress the Scottish Government's and industry's aspiration for sustainable and balanced growth across the sector.

The aquaculture industry in Scotland is already investing substantially in innovation – developing innovative technologies and processes that could increase productivity, and improve environmental and fish health management. However, progress on, and deployment of, such developments requires an enabling regulatory framework.

The working group's discussions have highlighted that there are models for such approaches in other leading aquaculture nations – in particular, Norway's licensing schemes for R&D and innovation – that Scotland could adapt or tailor. Below we summarise our proposals for an Innovation Sites framework in Scotland, which we see as a basis for future discussions with policymakers and regulators.

1 Green development licences

In 2013 Norway created a system of 'green licences' (alongside its existing system of commercial and R&D licences), with the primary aim to stimulate the use of new technology for commercial use.

We believe an equivalent mechanism could be designed for the Scottish regulatory and commercial context, with companies able to apply for a green development licence at an existing site or at new sites, allowing them to trial innovative technologies, products and processes, to assess environmental, efficiency and productivity benefits. As in Norway, a 'deploy and monitor' approach could be used. This approach should respect natural heritage designations, and be accompanied by a greater degree of modelling prediction and environmental monitoring in order to safeguard the environment.

2 Consenting framework for sites with higher biomass

2.1 Current consenting practice in Scotland effectively precludes producers from gaining consent for farms above 2,500 tonnes maximum allowed standing biomass. We believe this limit to be arbitrary, and that it should be lifted, based on advanced modelling and sound science.

2.2 In addition, Norway's system of 3-6 licences being combined at specific farms (with consolidated biomass of, typically, 2340-4680 tonnes) could be adapted to Scotland, allowing producers to use a rotational strategy for farming and leaving fallow a suite of sites to boost productivity and enhance environmental and fish health performance. Such a mechanism could be introduced at specific existing and new sites, or in specific area management zones, with a system of deploy and monitor. We believe that having fewer, larger sites would improve lice control, through less connectivity and the potential to use more consolidated lice control techniques.

2.3 Enhanced monitoring of these trial measures would offer regulators confidence that the new regime was not providing lower environmental management than the current regime.

3 Licences for new high-energy and exposed sites

We understand stakeholders' interest in farming at exposed and high-energy sites. The emerging developments in Norway around this are exciting, and we see scope for an Innovation Site framework to include licences for higher biomass for such sites (with assimilative capacity of sites in exposed locations substantially above the current 2,500 tonnes limit). However, the investment, testing and skills development needed to create such sites in Scotland are substantial and not affordable at the current scale of Scottish operations: to see them as the principal solution for productivity growth risks stifling the other technological and regulatory innovation that is required to raise production by 2020 and 2030. We therefore believe these novel and radical platform technologies should be viewed as a potential medium-term solution in Scotland, allowing the industry here to monitor ongoing progress overseas.

4 SEPA proposals on Depositional Zone Regulation (DZR)

During the working group discussions, concerns were raised about the proposed DZR regime (on which SEPA is currently running a consultation, and to which individual members of the group will send detailed responses before its close on 30 September 2017). The industry does not believe this regime will deliver sustainable growth in Scotland, and is concerned it has potential to hamper innovation and development, as it is currently presented. We do, however, recognise the need to adjust the regulatory regime. The variety of farms and locations in Scotland means that one size does not fit all. The introduction of a flexible approach to development, whilst ensuring the highest levels of environmental performance, should be the key to developing farms in the most appropriate locations.

The group would be happy to discuss this framework with you, along with our proposed 7 criteria for evaluating licence applications (environmental performance and potential; social benefit; economic benefit; support for local supply chain; technical innovation; regulatory innovation required; and potential for a site to promote knowledge/skills/people development in Scotland's academic base and industry), and other emerging detail around fees, allocation of licences, how to

generate local community benefits from Innovation Sites, and how to ensure a competitive marketplace for larger and smaller producers.

In advance of such discussions, we believe our proposals have potential to:

- improve environmental performance and knowledge
- promote development of technologies and practices which increase the industry's ability to sustainably meet its 2030 targets
- create optimum economic benefit to Scotland, and
- generate local community benefits.

We look forward to discussing them with you at the next meeting of the ILG, and would be happy to provide further material to you or your team before that time.

MEETING BETWEEN SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT AND INDUSTRY ON INNOVATION IN AQUACULTURE, 13 NOVEMBER 2017

Key actions

- 1. Marine Scotland will proceed to explore options for moving from the current terrestrial-based planning system to an alternative consenting regime. Timescale 3-5 years.
- As well as pursuing the approach at (1) shorter term progress should still be made on making improvements within the current system, building on the work of the Independent Consenting Review.
- 3. There is a shared understanding that the pre-application process within planning can be improved. The Chief Planner will consider what improvements can be made.
- 4. Marine Scotland will review the advice currently provided to local planners on the impact of sea lice on wild salmonids.
- 5. Strategic engagement with the Heads of Planning in relevant local authorities should be developed to help create an enabling environment for innovation. This will be progressed jointly by Marine Scotland and SG Planning colleagues.
- 6. The concept of an R&D site would help to deliver innovation and should be pursued on the basis of proposals from the sector.
- 7. It would be helpful for the relevant regulatory bodies (Marine Scotland, SEPA, SNH and VMD) to adopt a broad approach of 'deploy, monitor and share' in considering proposals for innovation and change, within agreed parameters for protection of the environment. Scottish Government will seek to develop a joint policy statement to that effect.
- 8. The Chief Planner will examine the options for better reflecting the advent of new DEPOMOD in the planning system, such as changes to Permitted Development Rights for existing sites.
- 9. At the AILG meeting on 8/12/2017 Scottish Government and industry will look to present Mr Ewing with an agreed way forward with regard to innovation, based on the points outlined above.


