FLAG FLYING POLICY

ISSUE:

The Scottish Conservatives have claimed the SG is reducing the number of days when the Union flag will be flown on SG buildings, limiting it to Remembrance Day only and not on Royal birthdays and anniversaries.

Former First Minister, Alex Salmond has subsequently issued a press release confirming that he changed the Scottish Government's flag flying policy following a conversation with Her Majesty The Queen at Balmoral in 2009. As a result, the SG's flag flying policy was changed from 2010, with the Royal Banner being flown at St Andrew's House on designated days associated with Royal birthdays and anniversaries. Prior to that the Union flag had been flown on such occasions.

In light of the press coverage, the First Minister has also responded directly on social media stating that the update to the flag flying guidance was administrative and a sensible step to take by civil servants.

The current policy remains unchanged since 2010.

The Royal Banner will be flown on 14 separate occasions to mark Royal occasions during 2018. The Union flag will be flown on Remembrance Day from St Andrew's House and Victoria Quay in 2018 as it was in 2017

The flag flying operational guidance is reviewed annually to confirm dates for the forthcoming year. The guidance is published on the Scottish Government website. The 2018 operational guidance – published on 31st December 2017 - clarified how the policy should be applied in the relation to the use of the Royal Banner at St Andrew's House and the Saltire at VQ.

Top Lines

- The Royal Banner ("Lion Rampant") is the more senior flag and is flown from St Andrew's House, the seat of the Scottish Government. It is the most appropriate way for the Scottish Government to pay its respects on relevant Royal occasions.
- The Union flag will continue to fly from St Andrew's House and Victoria Quay (the only 2 core SG buildings with flag poles) on Remembrance Day.
- There will be no reduction in the number of days in which the Union Flag will be flown on SG buildings.
- Public bodies can request a copy of the SG flag flying guidance. However, they are under no obligation to take account of it.
- The latest operational guidance does not require any organisation to depart from its current flag flying practice.

FLAG FLYING POLICY

Media Lines issued on Wednesday 24 January

- Scottish Government has released the following lines of clarification, "The current Scottish Government policy on the flying of flags, including the flying on Royal occasions was established in 2010. In line with this policy, the Scottish Government, by Royal Assent, has flown the Royal Banner ("Lion Rampant") and the Saltire on royal occasions since 2010. The current First Minister has made no change to the Policy.
- Non-Departmental Public bodies such as Historic Environment Scotland, the Courts Service and the General Registers of Scotland are able to adopt their own policy.
- The operational guidance on applying the policy was updated in December 2017. This was not a change of the policy and the updating of the guidance was not a decision of the First Minister or any Scottish Government Minister

If so, I would suggest text for News in brief along the lines of the text already found on Saltire:

Flag flying policy

The protocol and honours team is responsible for ministerial, royal and ceremonial protocol, honours nominations and ceremonial issues such as flag flying and bank holidays. They look after ceremonial issues such as when specific flags should be flown on government buildings in Scotland. To find more about when flags will be flown at St Andrew's House and Victoria Quay, check out our <u>flag flying guidance</u>.

For the carousel, perhaps just the words "Our flag flying guidance".

James – just for clarity, the Saltire text says 'flag flying policy', but the gov.scot says 'flag flying guidance'. Is there a distinction and should it say one or the other?
