I would like to offer my congratulations on your appointment as Regional Improvement Lead for the Northern Alliance which has now been confirmed. I believe the Regional Improvement Collaboratives have a critical role to play in providing expert and practical support for our teachers and schools. This support will be crucial in realising our vision for education – closing the unacceptable gap in attainment between our least and most disadvantaged children and raising the attainment of all.
