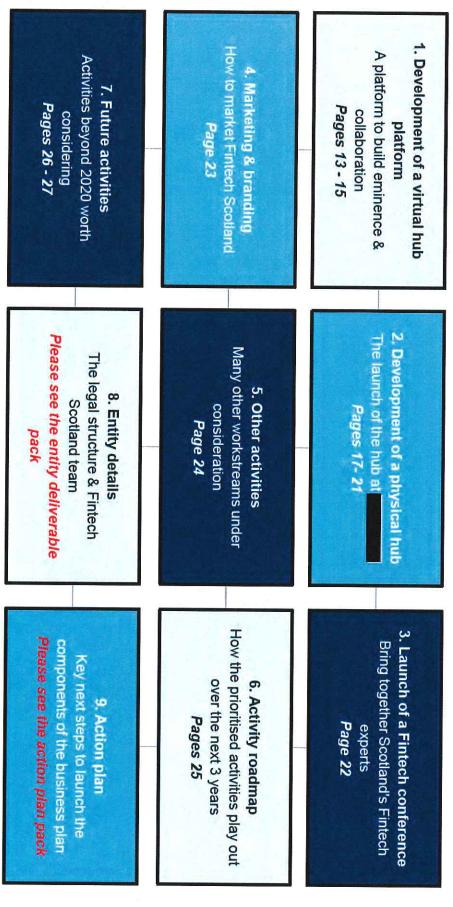

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virtual hub platform. Following the Fintech consultations, a number of very specific requirements were drawn up based on the ecosystem's input on what they would like included in a

These requirements can be split into the public features for anyone to access as well as secured member features for those in the Fintech ecosystem in Scotland. Having the secure login, and members features alongside public features would provide a full virtual platform for Scotland's Fintech ecosystem:

Secure login feature for members	The website requires two sections – a public landing page with minimal features as well as a secure login section with extensive services for ecosystem members.
Public platform requirements – for members & non-members	
Adverts for Fintech in Scotland Members / non-members	An area to showcase the various Fintech companies and specialties in Scotland to the general public.
Fintech news (Scotland) Members / non-members	A space to share the latest in Fintech news happening in Scotland through posts and the sharing of articles. Certain articles can be selected to only be shared with members.
Scotland ecosystem map Members / non-members	A mapping of all organisations in the Fintech ecosystem in Scotland as well as appropriate global Scots. Members will have access to contact details and any known individuals in this list.
Blogs Members / non-members	The apportunity to post blogs with opinions and insights into Fintech in Scotland. These blogs can be shared to members only or to the wider general public.
Calendar of events Members / non-members	A calendar with all upcoming events, meet-ups or conferences Events can be shared privately to members or to the general public to build awareness.
Social media links	For all aspects of the website, social media links (Twitter,

Linkedin etc.) will be available as well as links to the Fintech Scotland twitter and Linkedin pages.

. Development of a virtual hub platform – Requirements (Revenue generating)

The real differentiator between a virtual hub platform and a website promoting Fintech in Scotland is the value that can be created for each member looking to access different services. The 'members only' platform will enable people to network, connect, share challenges and goals, scout new technology, and access talent networks.

Development of a virtual hub platform - Phased delivery

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prototype was created, based on the requirements, by Deloitte and shared with FiSAB who approved the design and purpose of the platform. Due to its importance, the development of the virtual hub platform has been discussed on multiple occasions with the Fintech Steering Committee. An initial

In terms of the next stages of development for the virtual hub platform, it is sensible to split the development into two key stages to reduce initial cost while ensuring progress towards the full platform aspiration:

- Stage one "outward facing" an initial website launched to promote Fintechs from Scotland and showcase Fintech Scotland on a global stage
- Stage two "Inward facing" following the launch of the initial website, a virtual platform could be launched to tackle the rest of the requirements. These final requirements will help to service the ecosystem in Scotland by providing a secure area of the site to help collaboration and provide services.

Progress to date.

- Stage one the marketing & profile stream has stated that this aspect of the virtual platform can be created quickly and should be launched as soon as possible. This strategy stream are looking to launch this as soon as possible.
- Stage two Deloitte have provided a proposal for this work. All possible vendors should be considered for the creation of this before a final decision is made and development can begin

Stage development of the Fintech virtual hub platform

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Stage one - initial Fintech Scotland website

To build an immediate digital presence, an initial Fintech Scotland website could be launched to provide basic information on Fintech in Scotland.

- Estimated cost & development time: £10-20k, 1-2 weeks
- Implementation date: ASAP

Stage two - Fintech Scotland virtual hub

Once an initial website has been launched, this can be developed over time through a series of sprints into a fully functioning virtual hub with all the features outlined in the previous pages.

- Estimated cost & development time: £75k-£90k, 3-4 months
- Implementation date: by end of 2017

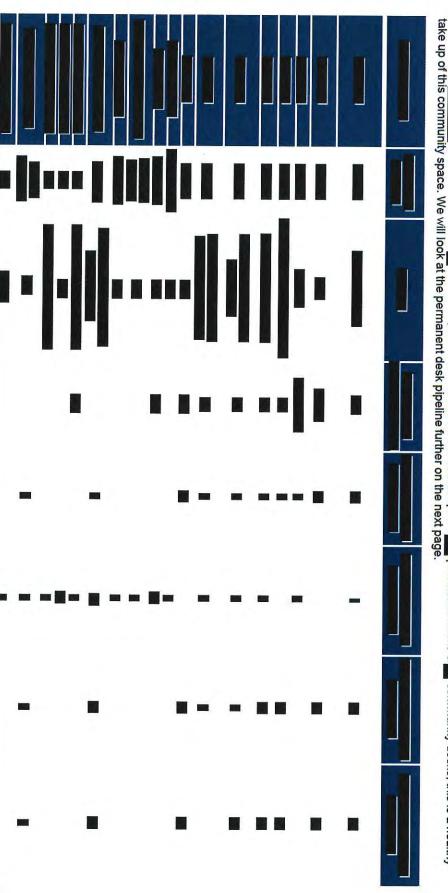
