2017 and our	original Fol request was 2 October 2017 relating to living cost support for dents. Officials became aware of the missed deadline when she emailed in on 31 October response was issued on 3 November 2017. The correspondence had not been correctly Fol case hence the delay.
November 20	requested a review of our failure to respond to her Freedom of Information request on 7 017. This was carried out on behalf of the Director for Advanced Learning and Science provided a response to the company on 22 November 2017. This explained the reasons for

our failure to respond on time to her Fol, and offered our apologies for the delay. We also detailed how we would look at future correspondence to ensure that further Fol's were not missed.

- We also received a further request under Fol from on 15 November 2017 and a response was provided within the timescales on 11 December 2017.
- has now written in to complain that she has not received a response to her FoI review request and has indicated that she will be making a complaint to the information commissioner.

### Scottish Government response

- As soon as they were made aware of this, officials quickly identified the mistake and re-issued the responses to the correct email address (yesterday 13 December).
- At the same time we offered a full apology and explanation of what had happened, providing full contact details and offering her an opportunity to phone us directly to discuss further if she thought that would be helpful.

Dear Education/Equality Ministers

On 2 October I sent you a Freedom of Information Request.

You failed to respond within the legal timescale (nobody from your end indicated that you needed extra time, but in any case the deadline is not legally allowed to be extended).

I therefore sent a reminder when the deadline expired, with a request for full compliance within a further day, which was ignored.

When I eventually received the significantly late response - which did not include any explanation whatsoever for the failure to comply with the legal deadline - I was informed by your department that I had the right to request an internal review of how it was handled.

On 7 November I therefore requested an internal review on the basis that your response had been unacceptably late, in breach of the law.

I received a same-day read receipt. On the following day I received a formal acknowledgement of my request from on behalf of Aileen McKechnie (who I had been informed would be undertaking the review). Demonstrably my request for a review was received. I urged Ms McKechnie to ensure that she completed the review within the legal deadline period. I naively imagined that under the circumstances, care would be taken to ensure timely compliance. It seems I gave the people at your end too much credit.

The deadline for Ms McKechnie to complete your internal review expired a whole week ago. Meanwhile I have heard nothing from her, or from anyone else at your end, at all. This adds insult to injury and is utterly

unacceptable. As I took pains to draw attention to the legal requirement for timely compliance, I can only infer that the repeated failure to comply is wilful and deliberate.

I am therefore escalating a complaint to the Information Commissioner's Office. I strongly suggest that you ensure the review is belatedly completed within the next 24 hours unless you wish to confirm still further by inaction the Government's complete disregard of its legal duties under the FOI Act.

I have been wholly appalled by the "response" I have received to the concerns I raised with you about postgraduate student funding, and in particular the inherently discriminatory impact of the applicable regulations. I have established that in creating the indirectly discriminatory policy which underpins the regulations which negatively impact on me (and many other students), the Scottish Ministers utterly failed to undertake an Equality Impact Assessment, which you are required to do by law. It is also demonstrable that the department which created that policy has a woeful misunderstanding of various pertinent issues, based on erroneous assumptions (no doubt because they failed to undertake an EIA as is legally required). I pointed out various issues which they had demonstrably failed to understand, but they did not engage with those issues and have ignored my correspondence.

The unacceptably poor response I have received both to my original FOI request and to my subsequent request for an internal review of how it was handled, is consistent with (and compounds) my dissatisfaction with your response generally to the concerns I raised with you, and this has destroyed my faith in the Government's integrity.

As I stated in my email of 15 November, 'In the absence of any satisfactory explanation [for your failure to respond to my FOIR by the legal deadline] will have to infer that I was being victimised (as defined by the Equality Act) for making it clear that I considered I was being subjected to detrimental treatment in contravention of the Equality Act, and for stating that I would take legal action in that regard if necessary". Your department's abject failure to engage appropriately with the internal review process which your department invited me to initiate confirms to me that I am indeed being victimised.

Meanwhile your agents SAAs are continuing to ignore my application for support for part-time postgraduate study. They have not rejected my application, they have simply ignored it. That is unacceptable.

I infer that your ongoing failure to comply with FOI legislation demonstrates an ongoing act of victimisation as defined by the Equality Act. This is compounded by your agents' victimisation of me by ignoring my application for funding. I do not intend to accept this abuse.

I await your response with interest. I have lost all confidence in the Scottish Government and I consider that the way I am being treated is disgraceful.







It also favours private school pupils, who are now more likely to benefit from an appeal than state school pupils. Its sole purpose was to save the SQA money - which these figures confirm it has done. But the price is being paid by hard pressed school budgets being charged hundreds of thousands of pounds by the SQA, and by pupils denied the chance of an appeal. It is a disgrace, because our exam system should be run in the interests of our pupils, not the SQA's accountants. The SQA answer to Scottish Ministers, and the buck for this stops with John Swinney. He is responsible for a gross unfairness of his predecessor's own making, and he should end charging for appeals right now."


