Dear all

I have just received a telephone notification from [REDACTED] (Greig Seafood Shetland Ltd - FB0440) of an escape of approximately 1000 harvest size Atlantic salmon (~5.4kg average weight) from a wellboat in Shetland.

The fish were being transferred from the site Bomlo (FS1076) in the Setterness area to Lerwick for harvest. The harvest was completed around 9am this morning when it was noted that the number

of fish received by the factory was approximately 1000 less than expected. On inspection of the wellboat the grid/gate covering the outlet from the well to the valves had come loose. The wellboat was operating on open valves for part of the transport down the east coast of mainland Shetland. At present the exact details of the route taken whilst on open valves is not known.

Greig Seafood Shetland do not intend to attempt recapture as the exact location of the escape is not known. The site is not experiencing any current health issues and the fish were reported as some of the best they have harvested.

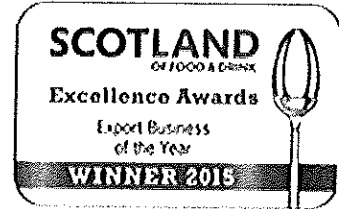

This morning we received a letter from Invicta Trout to inform us of an escapes event that took place between the 23 May 2016 and the 30 June 2016. Between 100-200 rainbow trout are thought to have escaped during that time. The site had experienced extreme winter storms which caused damage to the river bank and are thought to have washed out the lower part of the pond which enabled the fish to escape. 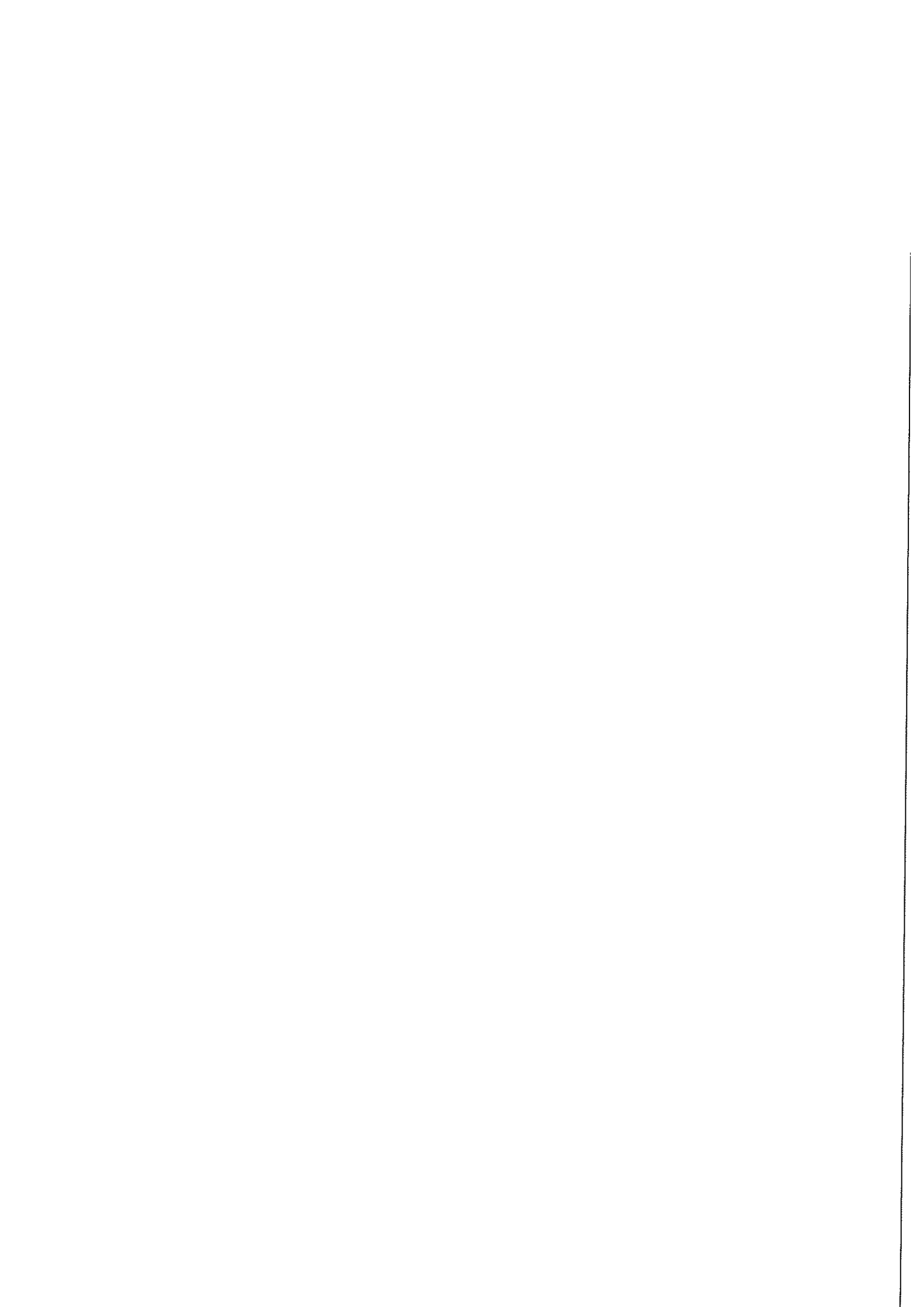

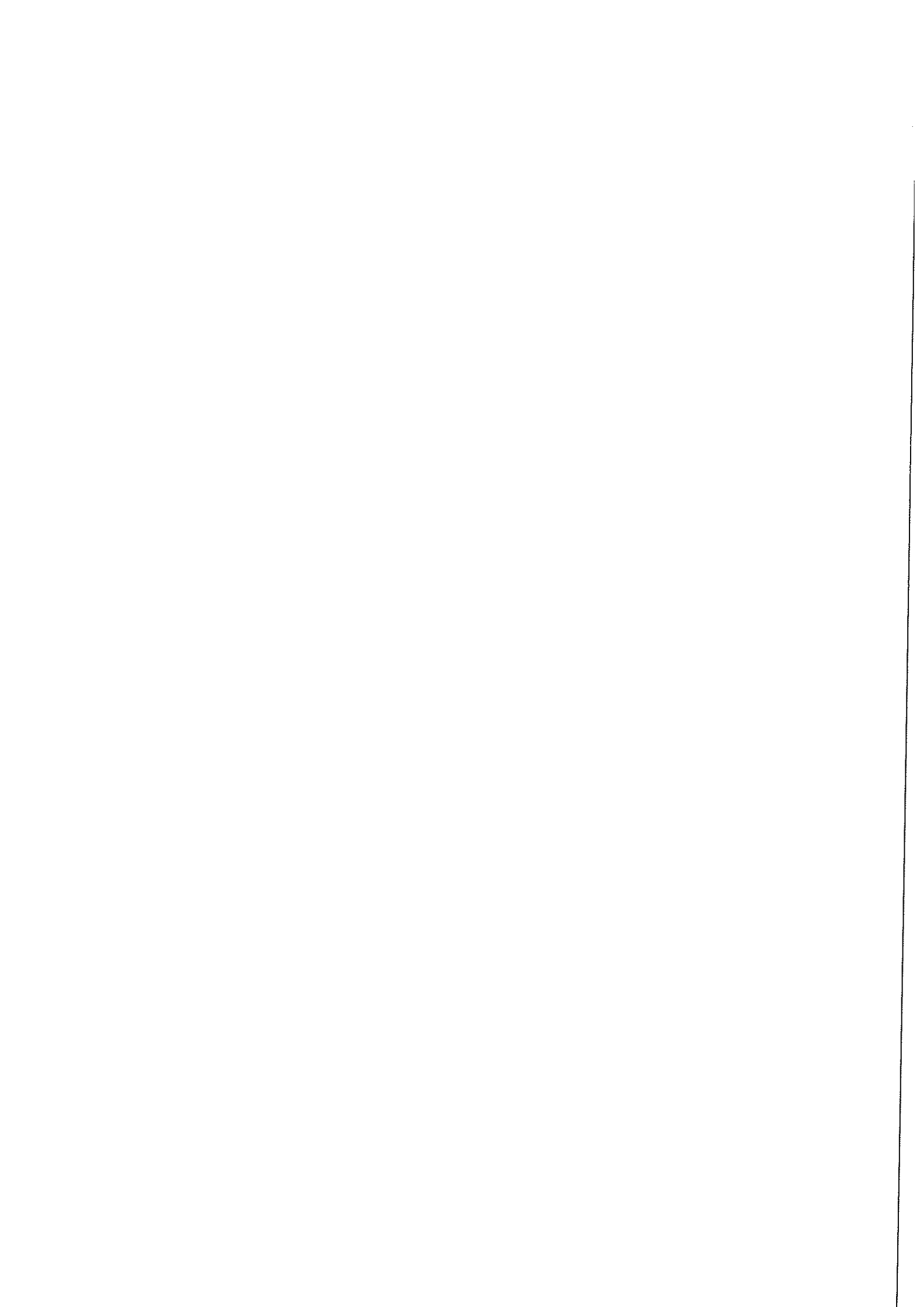

Dear Marine Scotland,

Please find an final escapes report from Loch Arlenas for the loss of approx. 50-70 Atlantic Salmon smolts (65-75g). On counting the fish at transfer, we counted more than expected in the cage, (+1952) (counter accuracy +/- 2%) but we still estimate that we lost 50-70 fish as per initial notification. Pipe work is now in side containment netting , so if pipe or connections between pipes burst fish will be contained. Risk assessment and method statements has been revived and updated.

I have just been updated on the circumstances surrounding the potential escape at the Hellisay site. Three cages were affected, these were bearing the brunt of the waves during the storm. 10 upright stanchions (over three pens) has 'popped up' allowing the handrails to drop down to close to the waterline. These were caused by a failure of the pins that hold the stanchions in. The stanchions were popped back in and pins are to be replaced. In addition to this they have used strops to provide further security until the pen supplier provides more robust pins.

The site contact was confident that there would have been no escape of fish as top lines were not below the water line. The top net is reported to be secured with Velcro every couple of feet.

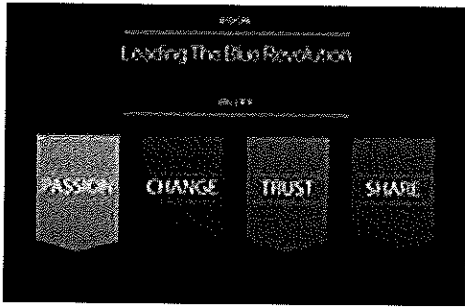

- Difficult to say how many are in the river but they have been capture as far down stream as Dumfries approx. 7 miles down river

- This source of escapees seems to be an annual occurrence and has been so for a number of years

- Is there an estimate of numbers being observed in the river;





Cc SEPA, Marine Scotland Licencing (fish health inspectorate), SNH

Following the most recent episode involving the presence of rainbow trout in the River Cairn in the vicinity of your fish farm at Newtonairds, the subject was raised at the Nith District Salmon Fishery Board (NDSFB) Meeting on Monday 4th of July. I appraised members of the circumstances surrounding the incident and circulated photographs of some of the rainbow trout which I captured whilst undertaking investigations. In addition, I circulated a copy of your email dated 10th June 2016 in which you refer to potential explanations as to how the rainbow trout are present in the Cairn.

The Board Members were very concerned about the presence of these non-native species of fish, with the potential to seriously impact on the resource that our Board is statutorily charged with managing. NDSFB spends considerable time and resources to protect, improve access, improve habitat and control predation on salmon and sea trout throughout the Cairn and cannot tolerate the added burden of dealing with rainbow trout. At this time when salmon and sea trout populations are under significant threat, added competition for habitat and food, not to mention the predatory nature of these fish, is simply unacceptable.

The Board Members were surprised with your emailed explanation from which it can be inferred that there is doubt as to whether or not the rainbow trout originate from your fish farm at Newtonairds. Whilst the fish are not tagged or marked, it is reasonable to make the assumption that the rainbow trout originated from the fish farm which produces rainbow trout and out flows into the Cairn where the rainbow trout were found.


You explain in your email that you are taking steps to "plug any holes" and escape routes from your fish farm pools and indeed you intimate that knowing the size of the fish that I captured in the Cairn whilst investigating the incident, would narrow your search given that fish of that size are only kept in certain ponds. Can I ask on behalf of the Board what steps you intend taking to remove the rainbow trout that are now in the Cairn? If you cannot remove them then the Board will have to take steps to do so using trained staff and electrofishing equipment. We estimate that the time required to conduct this work would be three days, which at current costs equates to a sum of £3,416.88.

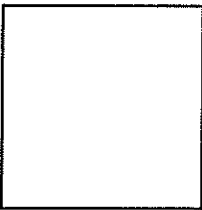
In order to prevent any further incidents, can I suggest that you install a fish proof structure into which all of the ponds within your fish farm spill. The system should have individual sections that can then eliminate individual ponds from any investigation involving escapees. The final discharge should be double screened prior to final discharge.

Creag an T'Sagairt (Loch Hourn) is a sea water Atlantic salmon (*Salmo salar*) site operated by Marine Harvest (Scotland) Ltd, located at NG803096 in Loch Hourn. At the time of the inspection 12/12 120 metre circle cages were stocked with 762,167 2016 Q3 Atlantic salmon at an average weight of 3.1 kg and 61,607 2017 lumpsuckers at an average weight of 50 g. Marine Harvest (Scotland) Ltd are the only finfish operator in the loch.

An escape of Atlantic salmon occurred on 01/07/2017, notification of escape event received by FHI on 03/07/2017. Confirmed losses of 7 fish in total, 4 live fish and 3 morts. No attempt to recapture the fish was made. Seawater co-ordinator notified DSFB and SSPO. Escape event became apparent during a bath treatment (Salmosan) when salmon were observed outside the cage in the open water. Recapture of the fish was not attempted due to the location of the fish in open water and the difficulty of trying to recapture with hand nets. At this point the net was dropped to relieve the tension and to release any potential snags in the net. As a medicinal treatment had been carried out, divers were unable to be used to examine the net for holes. Site staff deployed a camera to examine the net and could find no obvious holes. The next day divers examined the net, initially not finding any holes, after removing morts a 8" x 8" square hole was observed at the bottom of the net where there is a double layer of mesh around the uplift. Divers repaired the net.

The cause of the hole in the net is thought to be either snagging caused by movement of the uplift during net lifting or possibly a net hook from the top of the cage had come loose and fell into the cage, as the well boat was tied up to the cage and the net lifted, causing a snag in the net. Site manger thinks it is less likely that the hole was caused by the uplift as it is heavily weighted to remain stable and in place at the bottom of the net. There are no exposed jutting points on the uplift and piping and joining sections are well taped up, the uplifts are also regularly pressure washed to remove fouling which may be abrasive. During the inspection of the site an uplift had been brought up from a cage for cleaning and was observed as clean with no apparent jutting edges which could cause snagging.

An enhanced containment inspection was carried out at the site. Inspection of records showed the specifications for equipment used on site (cages, nets, moorings) were suitable for purpose and are checked following documented SOP's. Net mesh sizes were shown to be suitable for stock on site and net strength testing had been carried out to the manufacturers advice. SOP's in place for procedures which could increase risk of fish escape (treatment, regarding, harvesting, inputs etc.)

In response to the event protocols have been updated by Marine Harvest as follows: Uplift should be confirmed to be on wear pad during daily morting by visual inspection by camera. Longer net hooks to be installed which should be more secure when in cage tops. Agreed with FHI to include net hook checks as part of all pre and post net lifting checks.

Following the completion of the enhanced containment inspection recommendations were made for the following documented reviews to be undertaken by Marine Harvest (Scotland) Ltd:

A documented review of the use of secondary equipment (e.g. uplifts, tarps, mechanical lice treatment equipment etc.) is undertaken. The review should investigate compatibility of secondary equipment with primary equipment (nets, cages) and procedures in place for the use and inspections of the equipment.

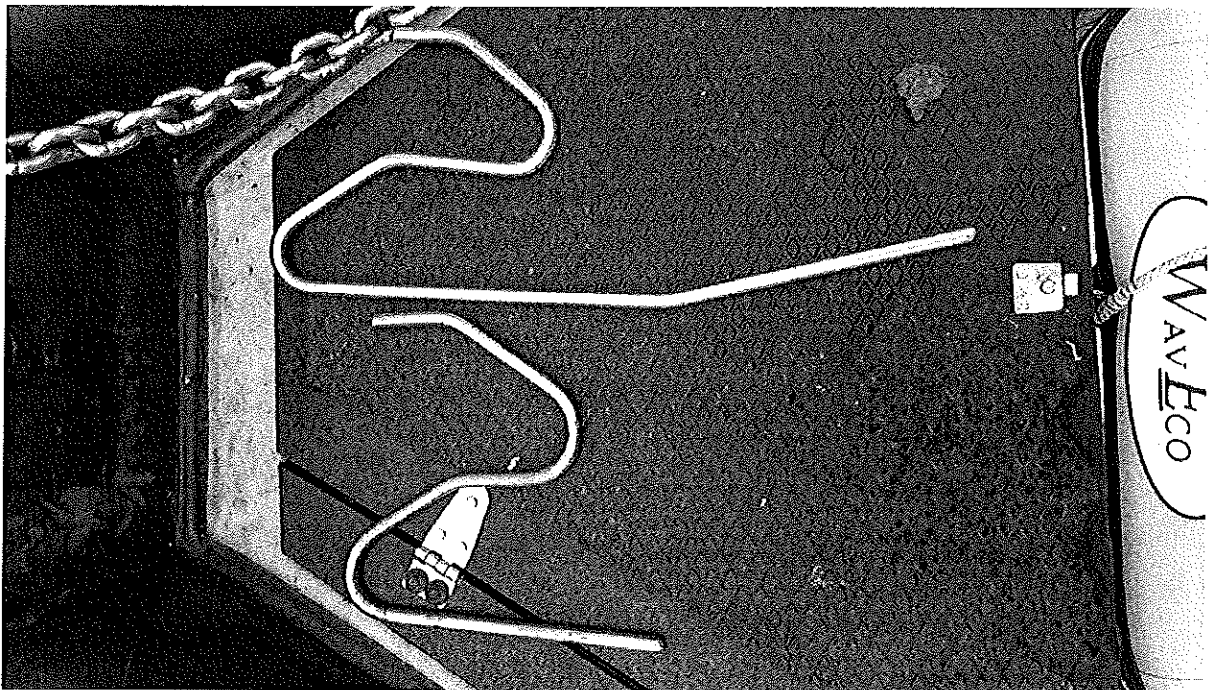


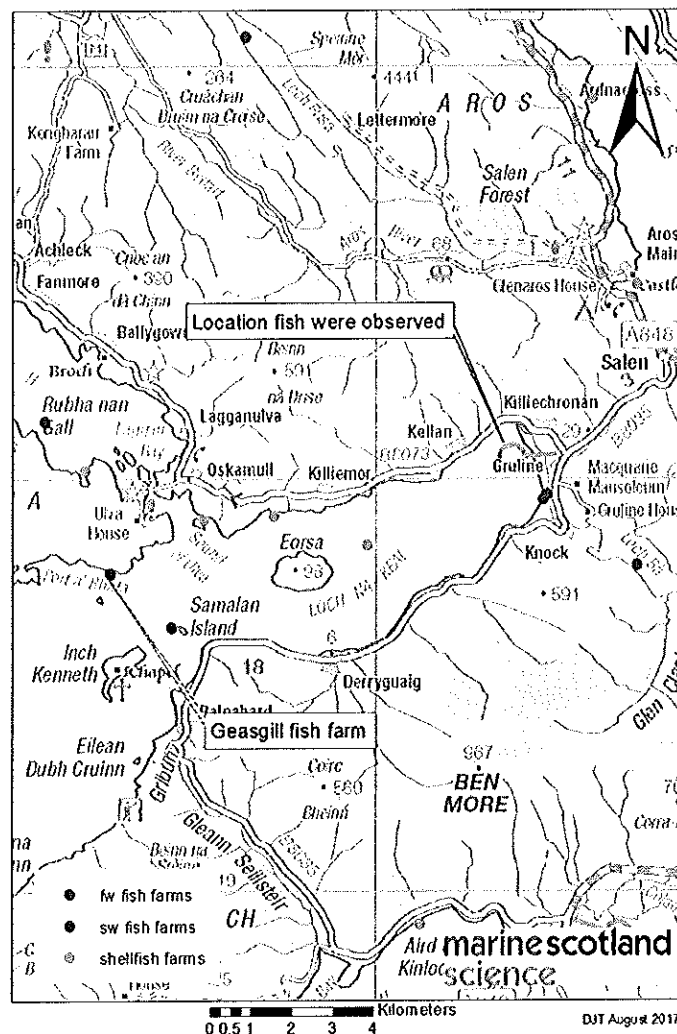
Photo of net hooks used on cages, the bottom hook representing those currently used on site, the upper hook with longer tail to be replace current hooks.

Escapes investigation at Geasgill Fish Farm

Background

The Inspectorate received a report on the 18/8/17 that porpoise and seal activity was noted to be increased at the mouth of the River Ba, Loch Na Keal, on the Isle of Mull, this activity was being attributed to feeding on a large number of Atlantic salmon. Further communication was received on the 19/8/2017 confirming that a fish of suspected farmed origin had been caught on the river Ba and a photo of the fish was provided. No reports of an escape had been submitted to the Inspectorate at this time. A further twelve fish had been caught on the river by the evening of 19/8/17, and by 21/8/17 over fifty had been caught.

Location escaped fish were observed and location of Geasgill fish farm



Initial FHI Investigation

The on-call Inspector contacted the Scottish Salmon Company on the 19/8/17 as being the only operator in the immediate area to enquire if an escape may have occurred, initially the company was not aware of any issues. Later in the day the company contacted the on call Inspector to report that there was a drop in feeding rate in pen 3 at the Geasgill site (FS0839), it was considered that an escape may have occurred and an initial notification of escape was submitted (MSe190817SAL1) by

the Senior Biologist. The company agreed to get divers onto the site as soon as possible to check the nets and also to arrange a well boat to count the fish. A Fish Health Inspector was sent to the site to conduct an escapes investigation and enhanced containment inspection, this was completed on the 23/8/17.

Site Inspection

The Geasgill site comprises of twelve 100m plastic circle pens stocked with 704,341 Atlantic salmon at an average weight of 2.8kg. The stocks were reported to be in good health with some background proliferative gill disease and amoebic gill disease being detected but no treatments had been required.

On arrival to the site dive records were provided confirming that a full subsurface inspection of the nets had been completed on the 15/8/17 with two small holes on pen 10 and 11 (2.5cm and 4cm) had been observed and repaired, given the size of the stock this was not considered a containment issue.

The site had been treated with the Hydrolicer starting on the 11/8/17, standard practice would be to dive check pens before crowding however this was not done as the divers time was prioritised to a neighbouring site where an on-going mortality event was occurring. Given that the dive check on the 15/8/17 that reported no containment issues, the escape did not occur from equipment failure up until the 15/8/17.

The manager reported that on the 17/8/17 whilst treating pen 3 with the hydrolicer, the top line of the net was observed to have dropped below the waterline. The standard procedure to crowd the pen is to untie the rope that ties the top line of the net to the handrail, the net is then lifted by crane using the net rope and the weight is tied to the rope that attaches the top line to the handrail. This procedure is repeated on every second net rope which ensures that the top-line is supported enough to keep it above the water.

On this occasion five net ropes had been lifted in succession causing the top-line to fall below the waterline. The site manager had been in the control room of the hydrolicer operating the machinery and had left site staff to crowd the fish. It was not known how long the top line had been below the waterline however once the manager observed this, the top line was lifted to rectify the situation. Based on his observations the manager did not suspect that an escape of fish could have occurred at this time.

Following the report that an escape could have occurred it was noted that the feeding rate had dropped in pen 3 the feeding cameras and the RONC (remotely operated net cleaner) were used to inspect for any holes in the pen. Whilst the bottom of the net could not be fully inspected it was decided that a new net would be installed as a precaution, this was put in place on the 22/8/17. No holes were observed whilst removing the net however a full inspection will be conducted at the net station. On the day of the site inspection a full containment inspection had been conducted by divers and no issues were reported.

Circumstances leading to escape

There are currently sixteen members of staff working across the four production sites in Loch na Keal and Loch Tuath, ten of these are new recruits and have site experience ranging from two weeks to two months so onsite training is on-going. Treatments with the Hydrolicer are always attended by a senior member of staff however given the equipment and the monitoring required the senior member of staff cannot completely oversee the entire operation and it is necessary that staff can work with some autonomy following training of procedures. In this instance inexperienced members of staff did not follow the standard procedure to crowd the pen resulting in the top line dropping below the waterline.

Whilst the manager initially did not consider that an escape had occurred he conceded that given the reduced feeding rate in pen 3, the size of fish being caught in the River Ba and the incident that occurred whilst treating pen 3 an escape is likely to have occurred at that time.

Containment Mitigation

Following inspection of training records it was apparent that a number of the new members of staff had not undergone the companies containment induction programme. It was also noted that for the Hydrolicer procedure there was no documented risk assessment, standard operating procedures or a contingency plan. This was discussed with the Manager and Senior Biologist and it was agreed that the company will review the existing containment induction programme and a practical training session will be given to all members of staff going forward. A review will be given to all handling activities to ensure that all new procedures are risk assessed and appropriate SOPs are developed.

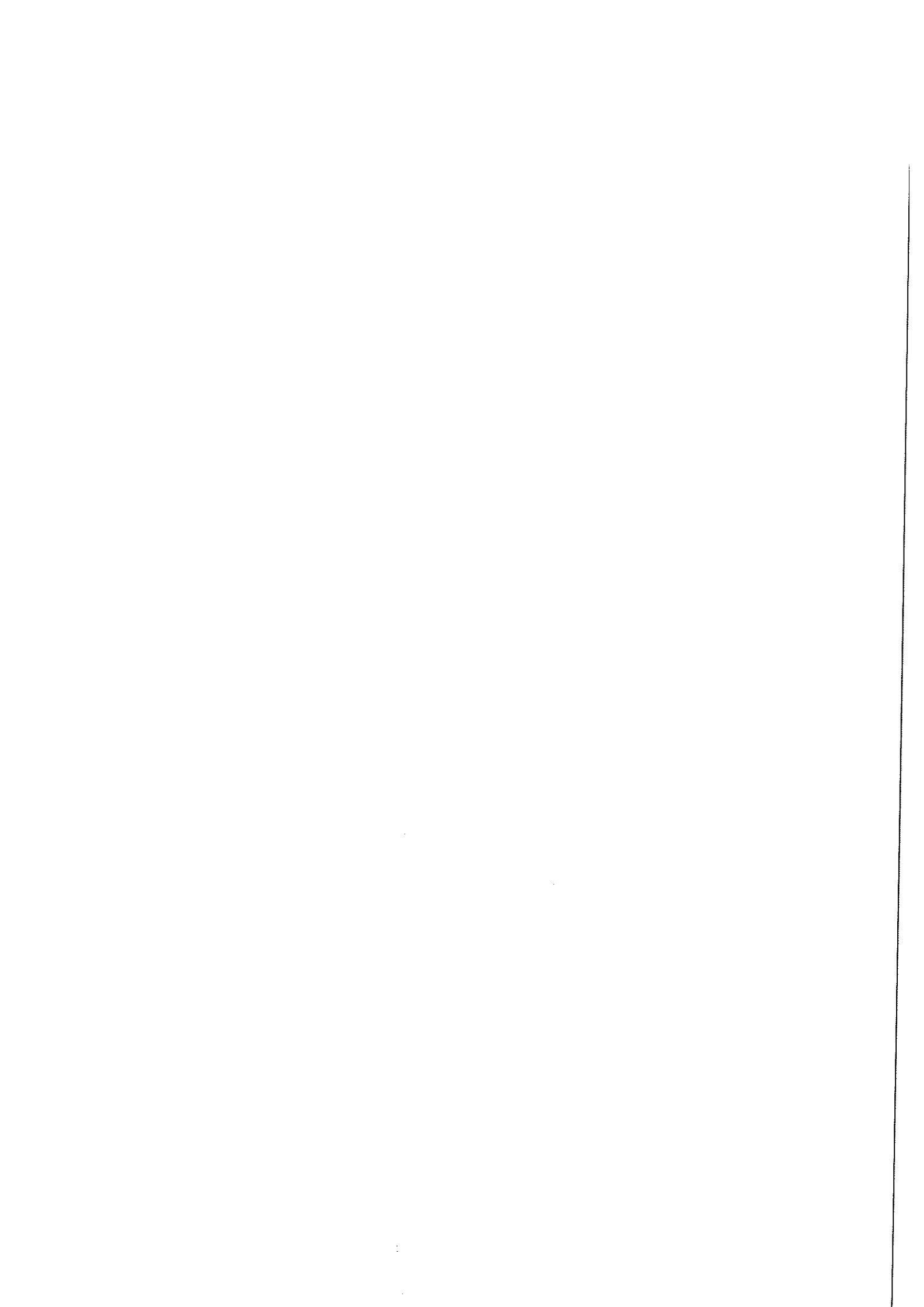
Summary

The escape from the site was the result of a combination of staff inexperience and a lack of understanding of the crowding procedure resulting in standard practice not being followed. It was discussed with the site manager why inexperienced members of staff had been left to crowd the pen, however the manager had considered that sufficient training had been given and that the crowding procedure would be followed correctly.

It will be a recommendation of Marine Scotland that all procedures on site which may give rise to a risk of escape should be reviewed and appropriate levels of staffing and staff experience should be detailed prior to such procedures being undertaken.

The planned review of the containment induction programme and the practical training session for staff should raise awareness of the importance of containment and also reinforce the standard operating procedures. The review of all on site procedures and ensuring that appropriate levels of experienced staff are onsite at such times where there is an increased risk of escape should reduce the likelihood of an incident of this type reoccurring.

Scadabay Losses

Further to the report of loss of salmon at our site at Scadabay, we have completed our investigation into the matter and have concluded that nil fish were lost.

The site has now been fully harvested and, given the overall performance for the cycle, we have concluded that the most likely explanation for the reduction in biomass was early mortality which was undetected due to adverse weather conditions.

We have since made a number of changes to site infrastructure and processes at high energy sites to reduce the risk of predation and the likelihood of early mortality. Further, the frequency of inspections has been increased to allow early identification and reporting of mortality.

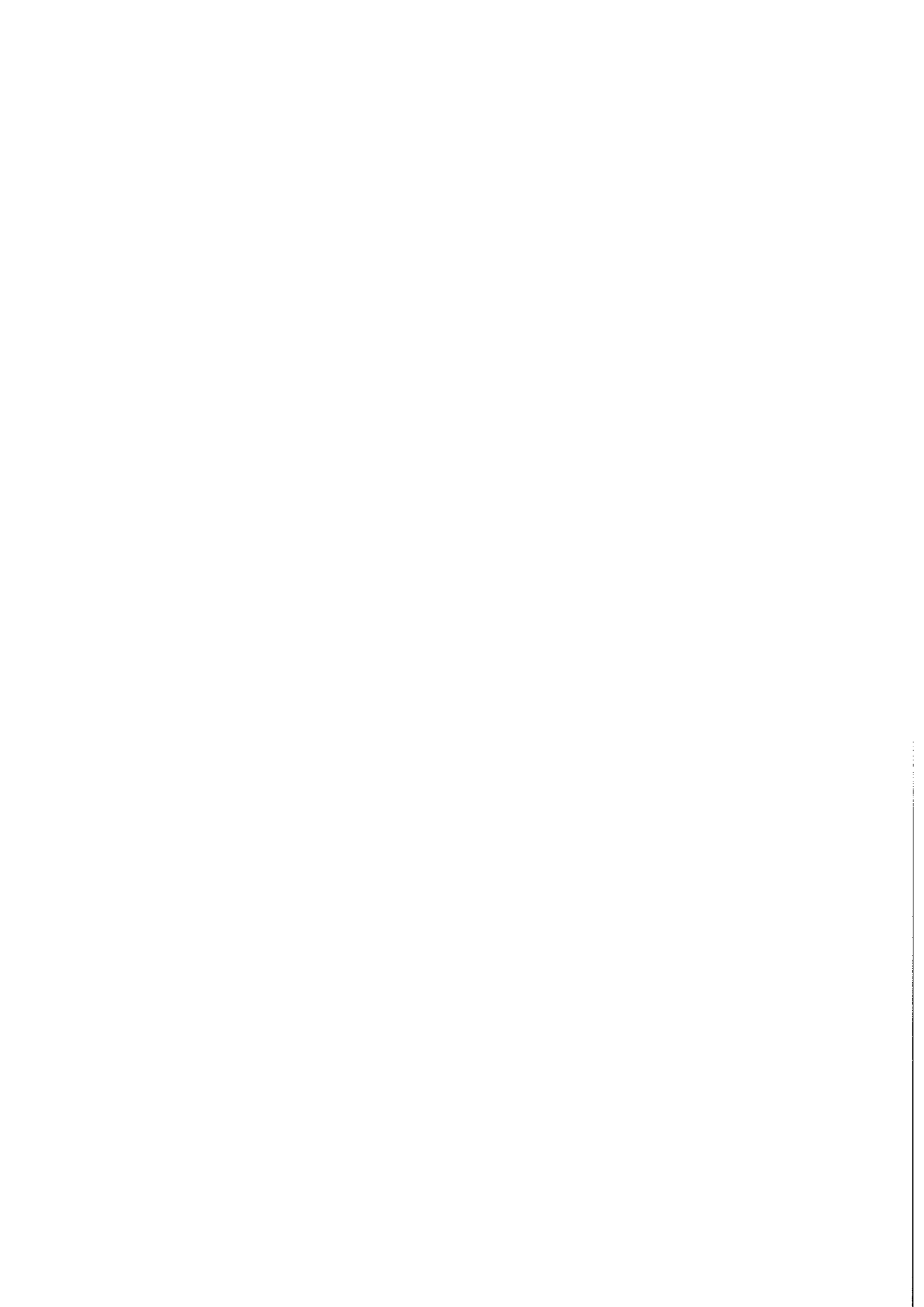

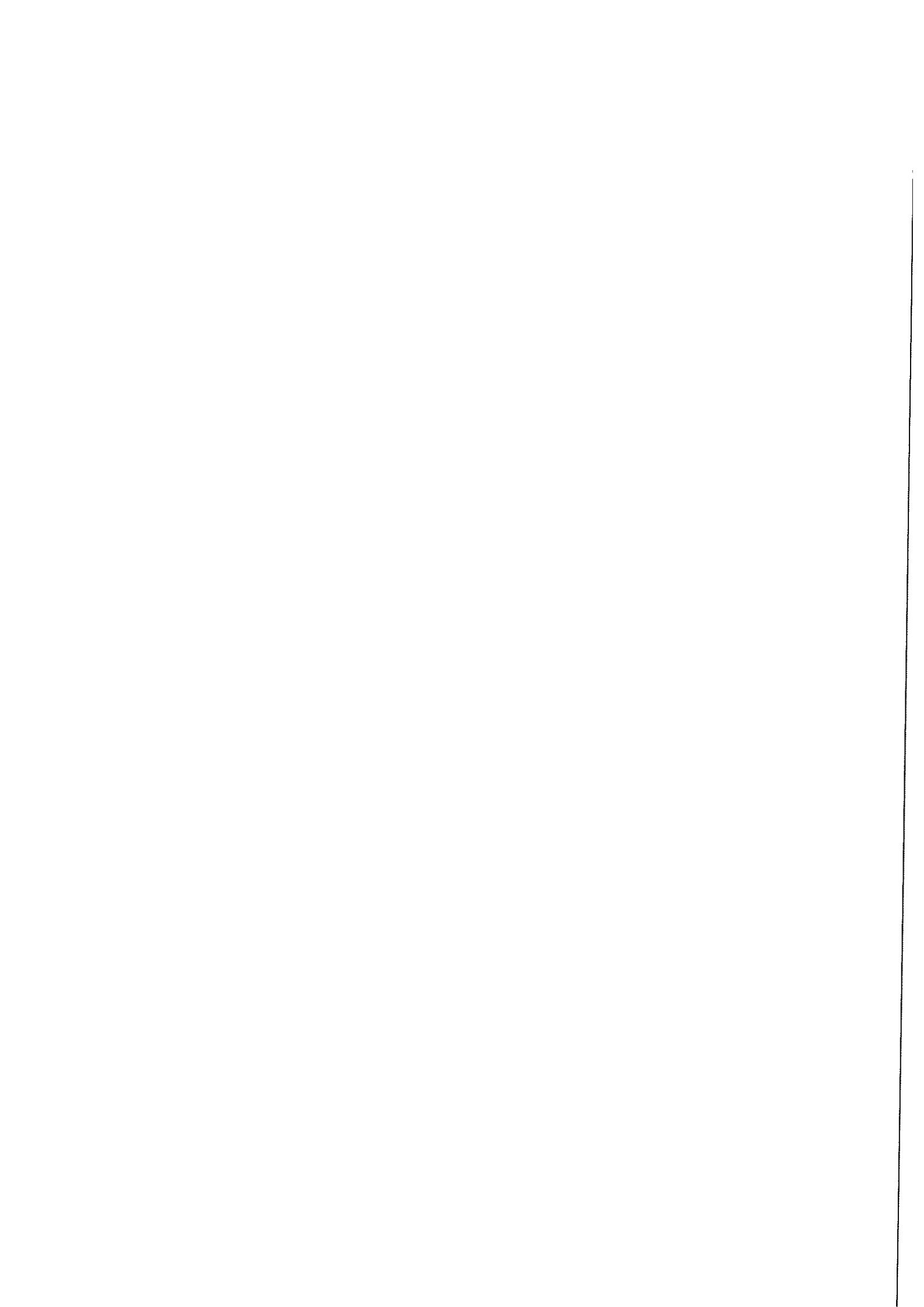

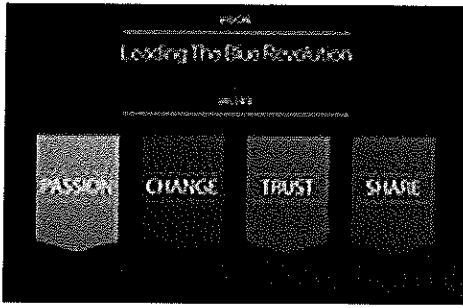
Thanks for letting me know – I have attached both the initial and final notifications to you again, as there was an error on the initial notification.

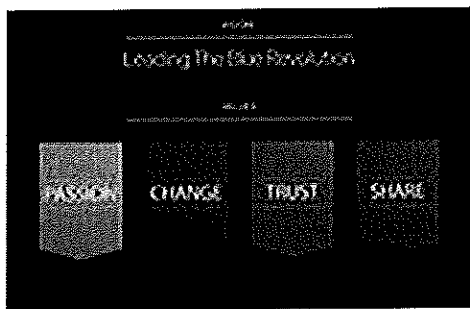

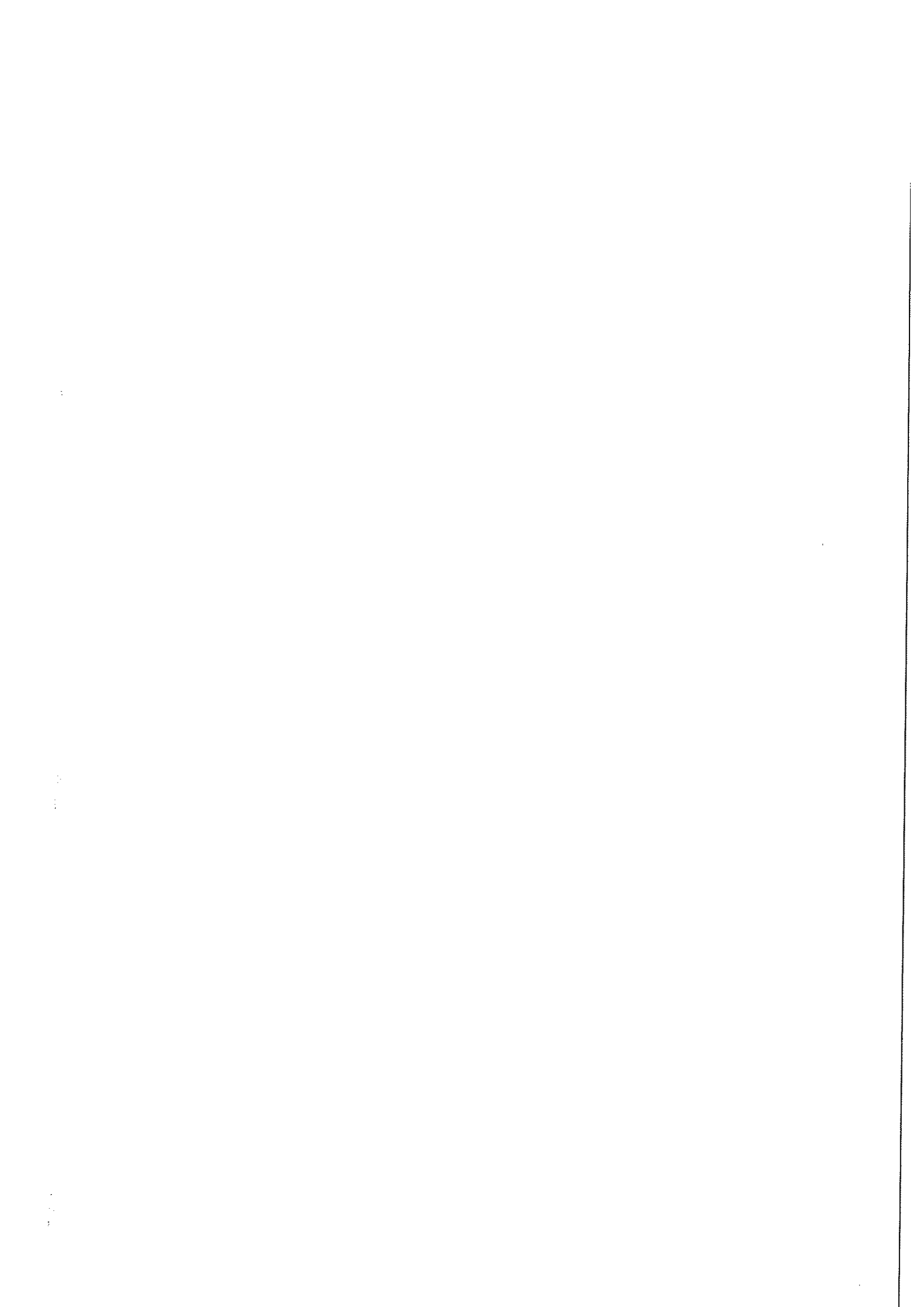

Hope you had a good holiday!

I just wanted to raise with an issue I was made aware of last week during my visit to the Setterness sites. I was informed that the cage of fish currently held on Bomlo (FS1076) had been transferred on to the site from Bight of Foraness (FS0292) following damage to the cage last month. The outer ring had become split and had taken on water so the fish were transferred to Bomlo as there were no empty cages at Foraness to accommodate the fish. It was reported that the damage occurred probably due to pulling by the barge where it was connected to the cage by a rope.

It is a requirement of the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009, as amended, that the operator of an APB must notify the Scottish Ministers of the circumstances on a fish farm which gave rise to a significant risk of an escape of fish (regulation 31D, 1(b)). I have discussed with a couple of colleagues and we agreed that the circumstances would have given rise to a significant risk of escape.

Please could you complete an initial and final notification form for this incident (link to forms and guidance attached) and provide information on the actions taken to prevent this happening again.
