Next steps:-

You are required to carry out pre-application consultation prior to making your application. In brief you will need to carry out the following steps:

- Notify SNH, SEPA, MCA and NLB of your intention to apply for a marine licence at least 12 weeks prior to submission of an application. The prescribed format for this notification is detailed in Section 23 of The Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 ("the Act");
- Publish in a local newspaper a notice detailing the licensable marine activity for which the licence is to be sought and the pre-application consultation event. The prescribed format for this advert is detailed in Regulation 7 of the Regulations;
- Hold at least one pre-application consultation event to which the public and the bodies above are invited;
- The event must be held no earlier than six weeks of the later of the first two points above; and
- Produce a pre-application consultation report using the form detailed in the regulations.

Comments made to the applicant are not representative to the Marine Scotland Licencing Operations Team (MS-LOT). If Inch Cape Offshore Wind Limited submits an application for a marine licence to MS-LOT, an opportunity will be given for representations to be made to the Scottish Ministers on the application.

Pre-application Consultation Proposal

Following provides MS-LOT with Inch Cape Offshore Limited (ICOLs) proposal for carrying out public consultations in line with The Marine Licensing (Pre-application Consultation) (Scotland) Regulations 2013.

ICOL has identified two major public events that will focus on those areas and local communities affected by the ICOL proposals. These events take place in August in Arbroath and St Andrews and provide an opportunity to engage widely with the public and key stakeholder groups who will be exhibiting and visiting the festivals. Furthermore ICOL will organise two ICOL run events, one in Arbroath and one St Andrews at the beginning of October. These two events will allow ICOL to individually invite key stakeholders.

Arbroath Sea Fest is an annual festival of the sea held along Arbroath's seafront and is held on 5-6th August. ICOL would take a stand at the event for one day. As the of the town's main events, it offers an opportunity for wide public engagement through a dedicated stand, which would include clear information about the project and provide an opportunity for the public to ask questions and have their views recorded. The stand would be clearly branded and notification about the stand would be placed in the event programme and in the local media. The nature of the event also enables discussions with environmental, sailing and fishing groups who will be present at the event. Staff from the project would be available at all times at the event.

St Andrews Lammas market is a week-long historic festival that is recognised across Fife and beyond, which takes place in the town's historic centre. The event includes opportunities for stalls on 14th and 15th August. ICOL would take a stand at the event for one day. A dedicated stand would include clear information about the project and provide an opportunity for the public to ask questions and have their views recorded. The stand would be clearly branded and notification about the stand would be placed in the event programme and in the local media – primarily The St Andrews Citizen. The nature of the event also enables discussions with environmental, sailing and fishing groups who will be present at the event. Staff from the project would be available at all times at the event.

The two ICL run events will be held in fully accessible indoor locations in Arbroath and St Andrews.

ICOL would display clear information about the project and provide an opportunity for the public and stakeholder to ask questions and have their views recorded. The events would be clearly branded and notification about the events would be placed in the local media. Staff from the project would be available at all times at the events. The events would be run through the afternoon and into early evening to allow those working to attend. ICOL would issue individual invitation to key stakeholders within the local area eg community councils.

These four events would be the primary, public means of engagement with the local community and local stakeholder groups, we would ensure that the adverts and website would include clear information about how the public could make their views known in writing or via email.

The two ICOL run events will be advertised in local papers no less than 6 weeks prior to the event. ICOL will to advertise both public events in local papers no less than 5-6 weeks prior to the events.

A draft copy of the proposed advert is attached (dates still to be completed).
