INTRODUCTION

BACKGROUND TO PROJECTS

In 2010 and 2011 RSPB collected seabird tracking data at multiple sites in the UK as part of the EU Interreg funded FAME (Future of the Atlantic Marine Environment) project (www.FAMEproject.eu). Working in conjunction with European partners, the project aimed to monitor and track seabirds along the western seaboard of Europe. The data were collected to further the understanding of the spatial requirements of seabirds at sea both in terms of protected areas and interactions with human activities such as fishing and offshore development. The FAME project tracked birds in the EU Atlantic region, which does not include the North Sea. Therefore, RSPB also began tracking work in the North Sea as part of the STAR (Seabird Tracking and Research) project ([www. http://www.rspb.org.uk/whatwedo/projects/details.aspx?id=365020](http://www.rspb.org.uk/whatwedo/projects/details.aspx?id=365020)). Since the end of FAME funding RSPB has continued to track seabirds across the whole of the UK under the STAR project banner which has been funded by RSPB, JNCC, SNH, Marine Scotland, NE, NRW and the Argyll Bird Club. The following five species have been tracked during the course of the FAME and Star projects: Fulmar, European Shag, Black-legged Kittiwake, Common Guillemot and Razorbill. Additionally, Herring gulls and Lesser Black-backed gulls have been tracked from the Alde-Orr Estuary (Havergate and Orfordness reserves) under a partnership co-funding agreement (Action for Birds in England) with Natural England and black guillemots, storm petrel and puffins have also been tracked using funding from additional sources.

COLLABORATIONS

During the FAME and STAR projects several collaborators have made valuable contributions to the tracking dataset. Liverpool University has contributed tracking data for kittiwakes and shags from Puffin Island (Wales). The Centre for Ecology & Hydrology has collaborated to collect tracking data for shags, kittiwakes, razorbills and guillemots from the Isle of May (Scotland). Oxford University and Plymouth University have contributed data from razorbills on Skomer or shags on the Isles of Scilly, respectively, and The Sule Skerry ringing group provided kittiwake tracks from Sule Skerry (Scotland). Glasgow University added kittiwake tracking data from Coquet Island. BirdWatch Ireland gathered data from Lambay. See Appendix 1 for details. Please be aware of who to acknowledge for the use of the particular data you have been provided with.

SCOPE OF THIS DOCUMENT

This document accompanies raw data or GIS data layers from the FAME, STAR and large gull, and other RSPB tracking projects. It describes the data, sets out caveats to their use and acknowledges funders and collaborators.

METHODS

COLLECTION OF TRACKING DATA

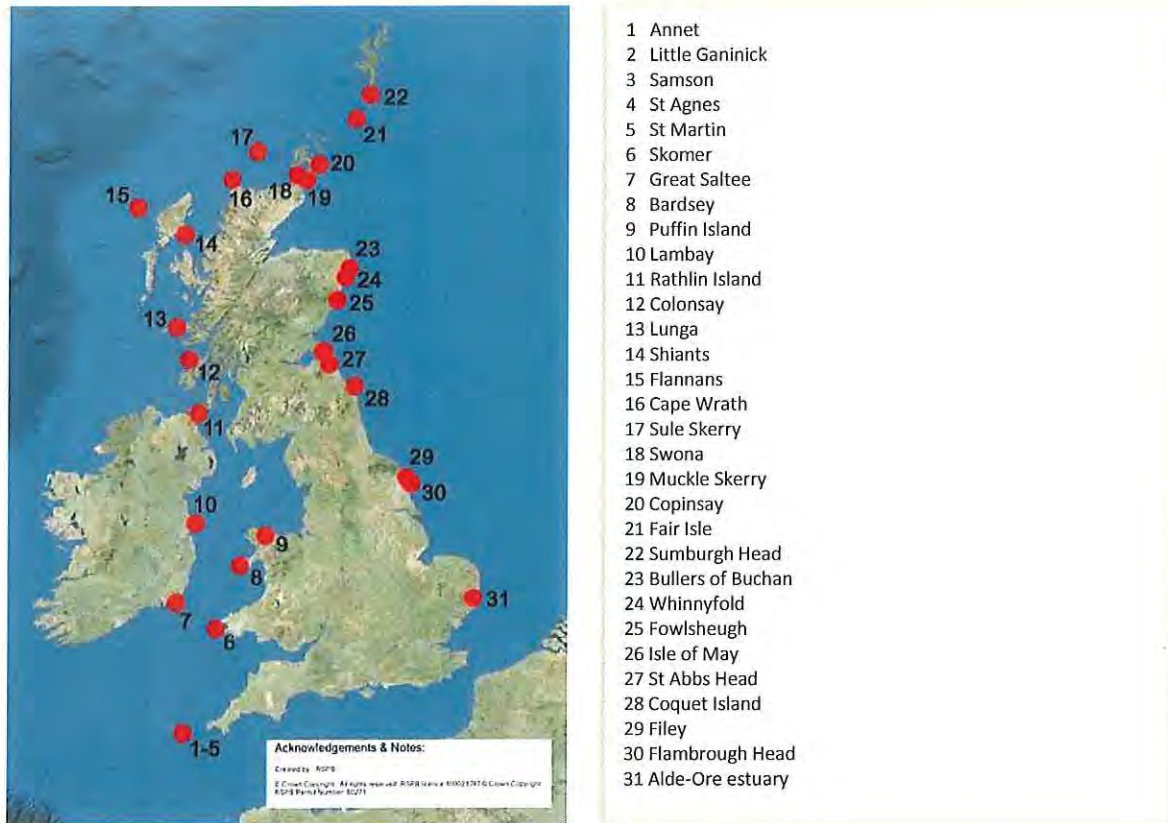


Figure 1. Locations of study sites.

Kittiwakes, razorbills, guillemots, shags and fulmars were tracked at over 30 locations in total (not all species tracked at all sites) either as part of the RSPB's FAME and STAR seabird tracking projects or by collaborators using the same tag technology and similar data collection protocols (Figure 1). Colonies were chosen for safe access to birds and to include a broad geographical coverage. Species were chosen to embrace a range of foraging strategies and behaviours. Most birds were tracked using modified IgotU GT120 tags (Mobile Action, Taiwan) which weighed 11 to 19g and were always less than 3% body weight for all species except kittiwakes where some tags were up to 4% body weight. We make efforts to assess tag effects and details of this can be provided upon request. These tags recorded one position every 100 seconds to an accuracy of approximately 25m. Birds were caught by hand or using a noose pole for tag deployment and were recaptured 1-7 days later to retrieve data (battery life of tag is usually less than 4 days). Tag attachment was temporary using Tesa® tape secured to plumage on the mantle.

DATA ANALYSIS

If you have been provided with raw data this has been only lightly processed. We have removed data with obvious erroneous latitude and longitudes (Longitude with values > 10 or < -15 and latitudes with values < 45 and > 69). We have also removed points that result from a common tag error found with IgotU GT 120's whereby the exact position of last known fix is erroneously repeated after a period when the tag has not been able to get a fix. Points resulting in impossible speeds of over 160km/h have also been removed. We would always encourage users of these data to run further checks for errors that might be particularly pertinent to your analysis. Tag data starts from the point a bird is released with a tag and ends either when the battery runs out or at the point of recapture for tag retrieval.

For trip level data, GPS data were screened for errors and only trips > 1 km (0.2km for shag) and lasting more than 10 observations were included as foraging trips.

GIS layers were created using ArcGIS 10.1. The speed at each location was calculated, assuming a direct route from the previous point. Each point was assigned to a speed band, and consecutive points within a band converted to a line. Lines were simplified by removing internal nodes < 100 m from adjacent nodes.

SAMPLE SIZES

At the time this document was written (2014) RSPB and collaborators had tracked 1446 individual seabirds over a five-year period using GPS tags but this continues to grow each year. The largest sample is from kittiwakes (with 604 birds tracked from 20 colonies by 2014 (or 51 colony*yr combinations)). 319 razorbills from 14 colonies by 2014 (40 colony*yr) and 202 guillemots from 12 colonies by 2014 (26 colony*yr) were also tracked along with 245 shags from 14 colonies by 2014 (34 colony*yr). Appendix 2 gives sample sizes broken down by year, species and colony.

GUIDANCE ON THE APPROPRIATE USE OF TRACKING DATA

While these tracking data represent some of the best available information on the foraging behaviour and distribution of seabirds at sea, care must be exercised when interpreting the resulting maps. The following caveats must be considered and understood:

1. The tracking data cover only a short period of the year
2. Only a small proportion of the breeding population have been tracked at each site
3. The tracking data originates from a limited number of colonies in UK
4. The tracking from each colony represents between 1 - 5 years data. Over longer timescales foraging distributions may vary.

Whilst GIS layers which may have been provided illustrate the connectivity between breeding colonies and marine areas used for foraging, the data are not presented to illustrate “hotspots” where large concentrations of seabirds aggregate, since the relative usage of marine areas by different colonies cannot be determined directly from the raw data. The raw data on usage will reflect the numbers of birds tracked at each colony, rather than the importance of particular areas *per se*. In order to reliably estimate the densities of birds at sea across areas used by multiple colonies, further statistical analysis of the data is required, which has been carried out by RSPB for 4 species and is published as Wakefield, ED, Owen, E, Baer, J et al., (2017) “Breeding density, fine-scale tracking and large-scale modelling reveal the regional distribution of four seabird species” Ecological Applications.

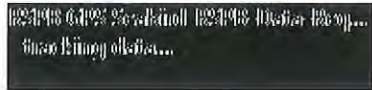

I asked RSPB about this and have been sent the attached forms you can complete and return to RSPB to request these data. I am also waiting for confirmation regarding some other research on foraging ranges but will include that when MS-LOT send the response to all the questions.

MS-LOT are also tracking down the F&T consented wind farms CRM information and I will let you know when we will be sending that on.
