It remains our position that we feel that impacts from these viewpoints are not likely to lead to significant effects- especially from Yellow Craig, Ravensheugh Sands and Tantallon. As noted within the scoping report, scoping meeting, and subsequent note, our approach will be to follow EIA guidance and focus the EIA on those impacts that are likely to lead to a significant effect. The feedback received throughout the scoping meetings was that consultees were very supportive of this approach.

As discussed at the meeting, the VP's have been selected to provide a representative overview of the potential impacts, if we were to include 5 viewpoints in East Lothian at c. 50km from the nearest likely proposed turbine we don't believe this would materially add to the assessment. We feel that the viewpoint from Dunbar adequately provides a representative view for East Lothian at such distances.

We feel that the additional wires and justification note produced for ELC, provided sufficient information to demonstrate that impacts from these viewpoints are not likely to lead to significant effect and therefore we maintain that they should not be included within the EIA .

We consider the Magnitude of Impact may be moderate, in that it is potentially a partial loss or alteration of one or more key elements/features of baseline conditions, in this case the sea view/horizon. Using your matrix on page 41, this would represent a Major/moderate impact which is significant. We therefore request a full assessment and photomontages for the viewpoints both at Dunbar (which has the potential to be significant on its own due both to recreational and residential use) and North Berwick Law – due to its high sensitivity as noted above.

It is our view that the impact on the landscape and seascape as a whole has the potential to be significant, and the purpose of the ES is to understand the nature of this impact. This could include the impact of the development on views from East Lothian overall, even though not all of these views might alone and in themselves be significant. We consider that the additional wireframes would allow wider public understanding of the impact (or lack of) on views from the beaches and attractions in East Lothian, and would therefore aid their participation in decision making. We are not requesting photographs from these viewpoints but that the wireframes already produced be included.

To allow for a focussed and proportionate study however we have not requested that full analysis be done from each of these additional wireframe viewpoints, nor the provision of the amount of photomontage material suggested by SNH in their guidance on visual representation of windfarms.

Thank you for your email.

We do understand the sensitivity of North Berwick Law in terms of being a popular summit hill walk providing panoramic views, and in consultation with SLR, we agree that it will be included as a specific viewpoint within the assessment for the Revised Development.

In terms of the East Lothian coastline and the wirelines that were produced for our meeting, we are pleased that you also find them useful in showing the limited impacts that would occur and we agree to include them as illustrative wireline viewpoints within an appendix to the ES, which would be referenced in the main document with a summary assessment.

We would like to clarify that we still propose to retain the 50km study area as whilst we are prepared to include a full assessment of North Berwick Law as a specific viewpoint we do not consider that this view is representative of effects on the wider coastline where significant effects are very unlikely due to lower lying land and curvature of the earth.

We hope that you find the above approach acceptable.

To allow for a focussed and proportionate study however we have not requested that full analysis be done from each of these additional wireframe viewpoints, nor the provision of the amount of photomontage material suggested by SNH in their guidance on visual representation of windfarms.

It remains our position that we feel that impacts from these viewpoints are not likely to lead to significant effects- especially from Yellow Craig, Ravensheugh Sands and Tantallon. As noted within the scoping report, scoping meeting, and subsequent note, our approach will be to follow EIA guidance and focus the EIA on those impacts that are likely to lead to a significant effect. The feedback received throughout the scoping meetings was that consultees were very supportive of this approach.

As discussed at the meeting, the VP's have been selected to provide a representative overview of the potential impacts, if we were to include 5 viewpoints in East Lothian at c. 50km from the nearest likely proposed turbine we don't believe this would materially add to the assessment. We feel that the viewpoint from Dunbar adequately provides a representative view for East Lothian at such distances.

We feel that the additional wires and justification note produced for ELC, provided sufficient information to demonstrate that impacts from these viewpoints are not likely to lead to significant effect and therefore we maintain that they should not be included within the EIA .
