Purpose:

The Aberdeen to Central Belt Reference Group exists to:

- provide assurance to the Minister for Transport and the Islands, as well as to the Cabinet Secretaries for Rural Economy & Connectivity and Economy, Jobs & Fair Work, that progress is being made to improve connectivity between Aberdeen and the Central Belt; through improved journey times and enhanced capacity.
- identify rail related initiatives that seek to exploit the economic and social value of the line to the communities it serves; and
- seek to secure the best possible return from the additional £200 million investment committed to as outlined in the MOU signed by Aberdeen City Council, Aberdeenshire Council and Scottish Government to the development and operation of the Aberdeen to Central Belt rail corridor


Terms of Reference:

In specific terms, the Reference Group will work collaboratively to:


- review and assess timetable, rolling stock and infrastructure options to improve journey time and enhance capacity between Aberdeen and Central Belt (including consideration of the value of double tracking Usan Junction and the South Esk viaduct).
- assess rail freight journey time and capacity needs and business opportunities, how these
 might most efficiently be addressed and realised. identify and promote initiatives (with, as
 necessary, other stakeholders) that exploit the potential of the line between Aberdeen and
 the Central Belt for the benefit of proximal communities, business and tourism.
- take cognisance of the opportunities arising from current rail projects being delivered within the North East; including; Aberdeen to Inverness and Revolution in Rail service improvements, and have regard to the competitive journey time impacts of the AWPR, A96, A9 road projects.
- · commission work-streams to inform its considerations.

Membership:

The Aberdeen to Central Belt Reference Group shall comprise:

- The Reference Group shall be led by

- The Reference Group shall comply with any obligatory confidentiality rulings

- Any costs associated with membership of the Reference Group will be met by the relevant participant's home organisation.

Products:

- The Reference Group Lead will provide the Minister for Transport and the Islands and the Cabinet Secretaries for Rural Economy and Connectivity and Economy, Jobs and Fair Work with a progress update at least every four months.
- Ensure that DfT (as the Authority for cross border franchises), RDG (as the body representing
 all passenger and freight rail companies), Caledonian Sleeper rail franchise and relevant
 local authorities (Aberdeen City, Aberdeenshire, Angus, Dundee City, Perth & Kinross and
 Stirling & Fife) are regularly apprised of relevant aspects of the Group's work.

USAN (RAIL) JUNCTION

Lines to take:

- The inaugural meeting of the Aberdeen to Central Belt Rail Reference Group
 was held on 22 May. This is the group intended to identify the optimum use of
 the £200 million investment (announced alongside the Aberdeen City Region
 Deal); which will focus on improving journey time and capacity on the route
 between Aberdeen and the Central Belt.
- The group will; review and assess timetables, rolling stock and infrastructure options, which includes consideration of whether double tracking between Usan Junction and the South Esk viaduct at Montrose will offer the best enhancement or whether alternative options provide the best possible return from the £200 million investment.
- I am pleased with the collegiate approach being taken by our stakeholders.
 The work undertaken by this group will be subsequently set out in an agreed
 programme of activity which once concluded will, in due course, result in the
 selection of a preferred option to be delivered within the 10 year period of the
 city region deal.

Background

- The Minister for Transport and the Islands, Humza Yousaf, on 17th March 2017 announced a dedicated team for the North East to address rail issues.
- The Scottish Government is determined to improve overall performance, capacity and journey times on this key corridor.
- The purpose of the Team will be to review options for capacity improvements between Aberdeen and Dundee, as well as potential options for double tracking Usan Junction and the South Esk viaduct at Montrose. Drawing together regional and railway interests, members will include with representatives from Transport Scotland, Nestrans, Tactrans and Network Rail; as well as the ScotRail Alliance, Freight and passenger rail service operators.
- The team commenced its work on 22 May 2017 at its inaugural meeting, and agreed its modus operandi for going forward. The next meeting of the team is due to be held late August/September, date to be confirmed.
- The team is expected to commence its work in May, with the inaugural meeting taking place on 22 May 2017, at Endeavour House, Dundee. The team will agree its modus operandi at this meeting for going forward.
- Our aim is to ensure the rail service between Aberdeen and the Central belt improves transport connectivity and provides enhanced performance when travelling between cities.



It was agreed at the last meeting of the Aberdeen to Central Belt Reference Group on the 10th October 2017 that a copy of the written update which was to be provided to the Transport Working Group Joint Board would also be provided to Tactran.

The joint board meeting is scheduled for today therefore please see below the update which was provided.

The Aberdeen to Central Belt Reference Group has met on two occasions in 2017, on 22 May and 10 October, with the next meeting taking place early 2018. Transport Scotland is delighted with the level of participation and approach taken by the members of the group at this early stage.

We look forward to continued progress over the forthcoming months, to agree the best possible outcomes from the £200 million investment committed to the development and operation of this rail corridor.

The recently established group is currently taking forward two strands of work, which includes:

- identifying rail freight needs and how they might be addressed, which includes identifying and promoting freight initiatives that exploit the potential of the line for the benefit of communities, local business, and stakeholders;
- review and assessment of the Network Rail work with a focus on identifying journey time, capacity and infrastructure improvements (including consideration of the value of double tracking Usan Junction and the South Esk viaduct).

ABERDEEN TO CENTRAL BELT - REFERENCE GROUP

Purpose

1. To provide an update on the activities of the Aberdeen to Central Belt Reference Group.

Priority - ROUTINE

Background

- 2. In addition to the Scottish Government's contribution to the Aberdeen City Region Deal, the Scottish Government is also providing £254 million to allow a more significant step change to the economy of the North East. Of that £254 million, £200 million will be used to improve capacity, performance and journey times between Aberdeen and the Central Belt, through identified rail initiatives which support the Scottish Government's aspirations for the corridor.
- 3. The work being undertaken to progress initiatives is being directed, under the Chairmanship of by the Aberdeen to Central Belt Reference Group, which has a membership drawn from across the rail industry as well as local government and interested parties. The Group is currently progressing the development of potential options, including double tracking between Usan to Montrose, through two work streams (Rail Freight and Journey time & Capacity).

Update

- **4**. The Group has been working well with active engagement of all participants with a clear focus to realise the agreed outcomes. In October, the Group commissioned the investigation of a comprehensive option assessment of the route. That detailed work is expected to conclude in the summer.
- **5**. Mindful of the need to ensure that wider local stakeholders are kept fully apprised, presentations were given at the NESTRANS quarterly meeting (6 November) and the Aberdeen City Region Deal Joint Committee (10 November) on the work of the Group. As work progresses further updates will be provided.
- **6**. On the wider political front over the last 4 months there has been parliamentary interest with ministerial correspondence and 6 parliamentary questions. Liam Kerr MSP has submitted 4 of the parliamentary questions seeking clarification on the consideration of dualling the rail track between Montrose and Arbroath at Usan and the proportion of the £200m which will be allocated to achieving this. There have been a few press enquiries seeking details on the progress of the Group and the work of the Group has been subject to an FOI request.

Conclusion

7. The Minister is invited to note progress to date.
