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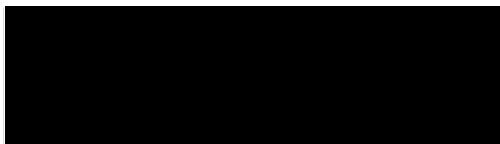
Dear Colin

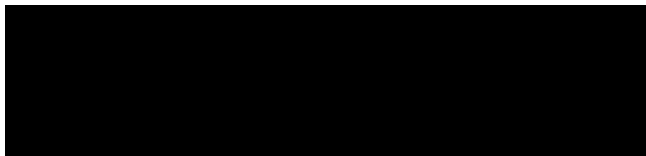
North West Mull Community Woodland Company: community acquisition of Ulva - letter of support

The Mull Fisherman's Association(MFA) is an Island wide community organisation representing the interests of the Island fishermen which includes the fishermen working from the safe moorings and pier at Ulva ferry.

Having consulted with the fishermen who are directly affected by the Ulva sale, the majority are supportive of the community proposal to buy the Island of Ulva and the adjacent Mull facilities including the Pier.

The full support however, depends on an agreement, that should the community buyout be successful, then (the Mull side)of the Ulva pier and surrounding area be secured for the benefit of the fishermen for the life of the community ownership of Ulva and that if necessary developments to improve this facility for fishing will have the backing of the community management team.
