Dear Cabinet Secretary,

This week I launched my report, 'Combating modern slavery experienced by Vietnamese nationals en route to, and within, the UK' in the House of Lords.

The report takes an analytical lens to a Vietnamese modern slavery victim's journey - from their recruitment in Vietnam, and their experiences en route to the UK, to what happens when they finally arrive on our shores. In addition, the Vietnamese experience is used as a case study, through which important issues around the transmission of NRM decision outcomes, data quality and lost intelligence opportunities are identified.

Drawing on this evidence I present my recommendations, for Her Majesty's Government (HMG) and partners, in Chapter Seven of the report. These recommendations are framed within the 4Ps (Pursue, Prevent, Prepare, Protect) of HMG's Modern Slavery Strategy.

The only way to eradicate modern slavery is from a position of understanding, taking evidence led action that is rooted in the experiences of those who have suffered, the victims. Only then can we truly improve victim care, prevention, the pursuit of criminals and ultimately bring an end to this vile crime. To do so will require taking an evidence based approach and I trust that my report will be an important resource in this endeavour.

Thanks for this. I have passed the tables to Police Scotland and the Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service to check that they are content and to see if they have any further comments.

In terms of the report itself, I think it reads well. However, I wonder if there is scope to have a separate chapter (probably just a page or so) on Scotland (and presumably NI and Wales) rather than stitching it into the main report?

From our point of view that would cover the engagement with Police Scotland as set out in the report but also the Commissioner's NRM consultation in Edinburgh, meetings with the Cabinet Secretary and Lord Advocate, participation in the Strategy consultation events, membership of the Strategic Oversight Group and your membership of the Strategy Implementation Group.

That would highlight the Commissioner's UK wide role and prevent his engagement with Scotland and other parts of the UK being overshadowed.

Under section 42(16) of the Modern Slavery Act, the Lord Advocate may remove from an annual report, any material whose publication the Lord Advocate thinks might prejudice the prosecution of an offence under the law of Scotland.

Similarly, under section 42(10), the Scottish Ministers may remove from the report any material whose publication may jeopardise the safety of any person in Scotland or might prejudice the investigation of an offence under the law of Scotland.

We will need to have this clearance and input before we give the final version of the report to our Cabinet Secretary and ask his permission to lay it before Parliament.

I am therefore going to send this draft to both the Lord Advocate and Police Scotland to get their thoughts. Once we have the final version of the report, we can flag any significant changes.

Just to remind you again that our Cabinet Secretary will not be available from 7 to 22 October, so the very last date we can receive the final report and get his clearance is by close of play on Wednesday 4 October.

1. Working with Scottish Government on the development of Scotland's Trafficking and Exploitation Strategy.

The Commissioner has continued to engage with Scottish Government providing policy support and advice during the development of Scotland's Trafficking and Exploitation Strategy.

Part 5 of the Human Trafficking and Exploitation (Scotland) Act 2015 puts a duty on the Scottish Ministers to produce a trafficking and exploitation strategy setting out the Scottish Government's strategy to work with partners to make Scotland a more hostile place for human trafficking.

The Commissioner is a member of the Human Trafficking and Exploitation Strategic Oversight Group (SOG), chaired by the Cabinet Secretary for Justice, which supervised the development and publication of Scotland's Trafficking and Exploitation Strategy. The Strategy was developed in partnership and in the process the Scottish Government sought the views of a wide range of stakeholders, including those who had experienced trafficking. The Commissioner contributed his views in writing, as well as took part in the consultation event in Glasgow and those attending welcome his input.

The Trafficking and Exploitation Strategy was laid before Scottish Parliament in May 2017. The Strategy outlines three key action areas: 1) Identify victims and support them to safety and recovery; 2) Identify perpetrators and disrupt their activity; 3) Address the conditions, both local and global, that foster trafficking and exploitation.

The Commissioner and his office will continue to engage with the Scottish Government, through the SOG and beyond, and will be involved in the implementation process of the Strategy covering all three action areas.



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

ACTION AREA 1 - NOTE OF MEETING ON 20 SEPTEMBER 2017



Note of last meeting

1. The note was agreed. Actions were covered in subsequent discussions.

Awareness raising

2. An update was given on the awareness raising campaign and the various elements thereof.

The launch event itself had had good coverage. The short film will run till the end of September. The digital ads have also had good take up. The local 'stunts' had generated local media interest as well. The Modern Slavery Helpline have been asked for an update on numbers accessing the webpage or phoning the helpline as a result of the campaign.

s giving a radio interview as part of Anti Slavery Week in October and BBC The Social have adapted two of TARA's case studies for use on their page.

The group will need to consider how to keep the momentum going once the campaign has come to an end.

Training/awareness raising

3. The group will develop and agree a basic awareness raising pack that will complement the training disc produced by Police Scotland. Once the pack has been gathered together, some regional 'train the trainers' events should be held. Powerpoint or similar would allow individual organisations to tailor the basic pack to their needs.

It was agreed that the meeting on 6 December should focus on pulling the pack together. In order to achieve that, members of the group should send materials that they use/are aware of to by 6 November @gov.scot)

The basic messages will be the same for adults and children, but the Child Trafficking Strategy Group may want to add specific information in relation to children.

The view was that a flowchart would be a useful thing to include in the pack, so that attendees could have something to refer back to.

It was accepted that a number of things such as Duty to Notify will need to be added at a later stage, but it was felt that the group should still press ahead with developing the pack.

It was suggested that it would be useful to invite meeting on 6 December to get her input.







Speaker profiles

James Wolffe QC – was appointed Lord Advocate in June 2016. As Lord Advocate, Wolffe is the chief legal officer of the Scottish Government and the Crown in Scotland for both civil and criminal matters, and is Scotland's chief public prosecutor.

Neil Rennick - has been Director of Justice since April 2014. In this role within the Scottish Government he is responsible for civil and criminal law, courts and legal services, rehabilitation of offenders and support for victims and witnesses of crime.

Panellists – has been the Head of the Victims and Witnesses Unit in the Scottish Government since February 2017. The unit has the policy responsibility for combatting human trafficking and addressing the needs of vulnerable witnesses and victims in the criminal justice system. Senior Operations manager at Migrant Help, an NGO which provides specialist support for victims of human trafficking. Migrant Help have services based in Scotland, Northern Ireland and the north of England and are a recognised first responder in the NRM.

President CIIr Alison Evison – Alison is a Councillor for Aberdeenshire and President of the Convention of Scottish Local Authorities (COSLA), Scotland's longstanding representative body for 32 local authorities. COSLA is supporting Scottish local authorities in developing collaborative approaches to contribute to the Scottish Government's Human Trafficking & Exploitation Strategy. COSLA also chairs 'Action Area One' within the strategy, which focuses on identifying victims and supporting them to safety and recovery.

The Scottish Guardianship Service works with children and young people who arrive in Scotland unaccompanied and separated from their families, providing support to asylum seeking and trafficked children and young people.

NOTE OF MEETING ON 15 AUGUST 2017



Background and context

1. The main theme of Action Area 3 is to address the issues that foster trafficking and exploitation. The Strategy document contains a number of actions, which will form the backbone of implementation and will be the specific issues that the group will be required to report on in terms of delivering the Strategy. However the group is not limited to these and the Cabinet Secretary for Justice has made clear that the Strategy is to be a living document with flexibility around the terms short, medium and long term.

The terms of reference for the various groups involved in implementing the Strategy was shared and agreed.

Actions and outcomes

- 2. An initial table setting out the relevant actions and outcomes had been provided and the group discussed and gave an update on these. (see attached document)
- 3. Points raised in the general discussion were:
 - IJM and GLAA can both help to input to the guidance for businesses on transparency in supply chains.
 - The need to ensure that the messages given by the awareness raising campaign empower those who hear them to know that there is something they can do. The case studies used should demonstrate the possible positive outcomes.
 - Public sector front line service such as housing also need to be aware and to know what to
 do when they encounter a possible trafficking situation.

awareness raising can best be carried out in the housing/homelessness/rough sleeper sector.

- Clearer links need to be made with the New Scots Strategy Secretariat to follow up
- Whilst work with the Independent Anti Slavery Commissioner is important, there is a need to be aware of wider international work too.
- The Strategy Implementation Group will be asked to consider establishing a corporate group and an NGO group, both of which will act as conduits of information to and from their sectors with regard to trafficking and exploitation. **Secretariat** to take forward
- Links could also be made with the Child Poverty Bill team. Secretariat to follow up
- highlighted mapping work on potential victims that had been carried out in Merseyside. Will share this with the group.

- 4. There was a suggestion that an academic might be a useful addition to the group and some names were put forward. **Secretariat to consider**



Re: Consultation on and the Reform of the UK's National Referral Mechanism

Dear Colleagues,

On 10th January 2017 you will recall I wrote to the then Minister for Vulnerabilities, Safeguarding and Countering Extremism, Rt. Hon Sarah Newton MP, outlining my concerns of the shortcomings of the UK's National Referral Mechanism (NRM).

<u>This letter</u> explained how victims were being routinely let down and itemised systemic failures where intelligence gathering opportunities were missed, allowing perpetrators to act with impunity.

Between March and July of this year, under the leadership of my Director of Strategy, an extensive consultation took place across the UK through meetings held with NGOs, health care professionals, police, local authorities, immigration services, government officials and, most importantly, survivors of slavery.

These meetings have allowed me and my team to better understand the deficiencies and challenges of the current NRM, as well as the potential solutions. Contributions from survivors provided me with the most compelling reasons for change; their experiences and the failures they encountered **cannot** be defended.

On 11th September 2017 I again <u>wrote a letter</u> to the Rt. Hon Sarah Newton detailing the findings of the consultation and providing a number of further recommendations. Since the initial letter sent in January, I have had a number of meetings with the former Minister and our respective teams, with a joint commitment to provide a fit for purpose NRM.

As a <u>contributor to the consultation</u>, I am writing to thank you for assisting my office by providing crucial insight and expertise. Your experience of working with survivors of this serious crime has been hugely valuable. Without contribution from those on the front line, and without input from those who have suffered, the accuracy and significance of this consultation would have been greatly reduced and potentially meaningless.

As you will be aware the Government have made <u>announcements of a radically reformed NRM</u>. These announcements are positive steps towards adequate support, and will contribute to

increasing the numbers of perpetrators brought to justice. This further demonstrates commitment from the UK and shows great leadership in the fight against this crime.

In the coming months I will continue to work with stakeholders and the Government to ensure the new measures are implemented efficiently and effectively, and essentially with the wellbeing of victims and their long-term recovery kept firmly at the centre.

Once again, thank you for your valuable contribution and for all you do to support those who suffer at the hands of evil exploiters. I look forward to our continued partnership in the future.
