Discussion on outstanding actions from previous meeting to ensure that group (17 April) members are fully informed and Proposal to release a refresh of GIRFEC Policy Guidance engaged going forward advised attendees that the GIRFEC policy team is considering a proposal to refresh the GIRFEC policy guidance in response to feedback from key stakeholders. It proposed that the GIRFEC National Implementation Support Group will oversee this work and that it would be refreshed in partnership with stakeholders. The purpose of the refresh is state and reaffirm GIRFEC policy guidance and Scottish Government's commitment to the GIRFEC approach. The substance of the policy will remain unchanged. However it is recognised that it would be helpful to include reference to new evidence, policies and language to support strategic managers and others working with children and families locally to develop a better understanding of the policy landscape and expectations. This will help ensure local practice accurately reflects the national policy ambition. This work will provide the basis for the development of practice guidance and communications materials.
