

Subject: HPAI ban-lifting inspection in the UK 17-26 September

Hi 💮

I will be in the UK 17-26 September with GACC and MARA officials for poultry inspection. The main purpose of the inspection is to ensure that the future import of poultry and poultry products from the UK poses acceptable risk to animal and public health in China, by auditing UK's Avian Influenza surveillance on poultry and wild birds, biosecurity measures at farms, hygiene control at processing plants, the effectiveness of export certification system, etc.

They will visit England, NI and Scotland to audit 2 farms (1 commercial chicken farm and 1 chicken primary breeding farm), 2 slaughterhouses, 1 AI reference laboratory, and meet with officials from various UK competent authorities DEFRA, FSA, DAERA, SG, etc. Suppose the experts reach a positive conclusion on UK's AI control, we could aim for the AI restrictions to be lifted when HCH visits the UK in December this year, enabling the UK to resume live poultry trade and to start market access work on poultry meat. China imposed HPAI restrictions on UK's poultry and poultry products since HPAI outbreaks were confirmed in the UK in 2014.

My role is to facilitate the visit to ensure minimal frictions and to build good relations with these experts, whose opinions would be key to the ban-lifting decision. All my cost will be borne by UK poultry industry.

- Low Carbon Economy


Biography
