I hope all is well with you and look forward to meeting up soon as I understand our teams are engaged in trying to arrange a joint leadership event in Edinburgh.

On the more immediate issue of the recent announcement by the UK Transport Secretary about the review of UK railways, an issue which you know we have a keen interest in, I'd like to share our view.

In July 2017, through the High Level Output Specification, the Scottish Ministers reiterated their clear vision for how Scotland's rail industry can make a major contribution towards inclusive, economic growth. To achieve this, we must have a rail industry that is fully aligned with Scottish Government priorities.

Although we have delivered many significant successes on Scotland's railways, there have been a number of challenges, particularly in recent years. Our firm belief that better services and greater value for money can be secured leads us to share many of the concerns that has prompted this latest rail review. In particular, the need for greater empowerment, integration and accountability on the Scottish route.

There have been conversations at Ministerial and official level about the review, and I welcome the assurances given that Scottish interests will be fully represented. I believe that this can be best achieved through the following:


- Scottish representation on the proposed expert panel. In this context, I would suggest Bill Reeve, Rail Director at Transport Scotland, who has a wealth of wider railway expertise as well as an in-depth knowledge of devolved railway matters.
- A working group be established at official level, which would have a specific role to consider any matters within the review which had an impact on the Devolved Administrations. This would include DfT, Transport Scotland and the Welsh Assembly Government.



It is very much in our shared interests to make sure that the rail review is a success and I hope these suggestions are considered in that light. My Rail team look forward to working with DfT colleagues on this and other railway matters over the coming months.
