

Apologies for the delay. We were waiting to confirm the location for artival which is now the Pire Training Centre at Edinburgh Airport which is located at the end of Turnhouse Rd. I've attached a map as it's accessed via the Maybury Rd at the Maybury roundabout as opposed to the usual way to approach the airport. The FTC is at the very end of Turnhouse Road, almost by the runway, and is on the right. It is signposted when you get there.

As a bit of background, the proposed visit came about after our CEO John Watson met the minister at the Edinburgh Chamber of Commerce dinner last month.

Crosswind was set up to develop 150 acres around the airport into residential, commercial and retail developments and as part of that, we want to create a dedicated Digital Quarter to make Edinburgh more attractive to global and local technology companies given the unique connectivity of the site both nationally and internationally.

We're also in discussions with City of Edinburgh Council, Scottish Enterprise, Edinburgh and Heriot Watt universities among others as we develop our plan and have a meeting with the Scottish Government's chief planner scheduled for early May.

We will begin formal consultation next month with a view to submitting a planning application later this year. There are a lot of developments in West Edinburgh but Crosswind is the only brownfield site and has already secured financial backing from our parent company so we're in a good position to progress subject to planning permission.

I've attached the press release from last month to explain the background to the development in more detail. I've attached a suggested itinerary along with biogs of the main Crosswind Board attendees. We're planning to spend the first part explaining the background and plan for Crosswind in the context of the West Edinburgh strategy.

We've also got some new branding to unveil around the name for the site which we'll show the minister are also aiming to have the first cut from some economic analysis we've had done on the number of jobs,

economic value of the Crosswind development with particular emphasis on our plans for a 'Digital Quarter'.

We're proposing a visit to the Crosswind South site. There's nothing on there just now though there's a fair bit of work being done nearby by the airport but will give you an idea of the size and scale. We'll provide transport and hi-viz clothing.

STRATEGIC DEVELOPMENT OF EDINBURGH SITE TO ATTRACT JOBS AND INVESTMENT

A plan to bring thousands of jobs to Edinburgh and attract global technology companies while helping develop home-grown digital businesses has been unveiled.

A dedicated 'Digital Quarter' will be the centre point of the 150-acre Crosswind site development near Edinburgh Airport.

The development of this strategically important, brownfield site will open up derelict land, build affordable housing, develop commercial properties and create local amenities.

Working with other agencies, the company behind the plan, Crosswind Developments, aims to create a unique Scottish 'digital community' which would augment Edinburgh's existing qualities as an attractive location for global companies.

The Digital Quarter would provide the kind of transport connections, offices, housing and leisure facilities that global technology companies expect when choosing where to locate, allowing Edinburgh to better compete with key existing European destinations.

The Crosswind site is within easy reach of much of Scotland's main population centres and is located next door to Edinburgh Airport which has more UK and international connections than any other Scotlish airport.

John Watson, chief executive of Crosswind Developments, said the site offered a unique opportunity.

"Scotland, and Edinburgh in particular, should be an ideal location for global technology jobs but without a dedicated approach to creating the kind of environment technology companies are looking for, it's much harder to bring that investment here," he said.

"These companies want modern, state of the art offices, world class connectivity, an environment that is attractive to its workforce with easy access to global connections. A pool of high quality graduates is another important factor.

"Crosswind is, perhaps, one of the best connected, undeveloped sites in Scotland with immediate access to air, rail and road transport. It will have a focus on the kind of housing, working space and leisure facilities that people demand.



"Working with others, we believe we can make this part of Edinburgh one of the most attractive locations in the world for these companies while also nurturing home grown start-ups."

While many global technology firms are located in large cities, smaller centres are becoming popular as a smaller footprint allows shorter commutes, easier access to amenities and a better work/life balance. Cities like Amsterdam, Dublin and Berlin have all been successful in attracting the kind of firms the Digital Quarter could house.

"We will be working closely with all our partners, and the local communities, to ensure that our plans meet all their needs," said Mr Watson.

"This is a fantastic opportunity not just for Edinburgh but the whole of Scotland. Our relationship with Edinburgh Airport will help us develop strong UK and international connections and gives the site a unique advantage."

Mr Watson has joined other developers and delegations from the City of Edinburgh Council and the Scottish Government at MIPIM, the world's largest event for property developers and investors, which is taking place in Cannes this week.

Crosswind, which was set up by infrastructure investment giant Global Infrastructure Partners which also owns Edinburgh Airport, operates as an independent company with its own board of directors and is now moving into the consultation and planning phase of the project.

Alistair Darling, the former Chancellor of the Exchequer and an Edinburgh MP for 28 years, chairs the Crosswind board which includes Lesley Sawers, the Equality and Human Rights Commissioner for Scotland who has over 30 years experience at a senior level within both the public and private sectors, Andrew Sutherland, the Joint Managing Director of Miller Developments who brings extensive experience of the commercial property and housing sectors, investment specialist Andrew Gillespie-Smith and Mr Watson.

The development is expected to generate a significant capital investment in Edinburgh and Scotland's economy. The project aims to fit its ambitions with the Scotlish Government and the City of Edinburgh Council's economic strategies and would strengthen the economic resilience of the local communities surrounding the site.

Crosswind has been working with a number of partners on the plans including Lichfields Planning Consultants, engineering and development consultants Mott MacDonald, Corstorphine + Wright architects, commercial estate agents Cushman & Wakefield, legal advisers Shepherd & Wedderburn and design agency Project.

Project Background

The project is being undertaken by Crosswind Developments, which was set up by Edinburgh Airport owners Global Infrastructure Partners (GIP) as an independent company with its own board of directors. It is chaired by former chancellor of the exchequer Alistair Darling, and includes Lesley Sawers, the Equality and Human Rights Commissioner for Scotland. Ownership of the Crosswind brownfield site is due to be transferred soon from GIP to the developers.

Crosswind was set up to develop 150 acres around the airport into residential, commercial and retail developments and as part of that, they want to create a dedicated Digital Quarter to make Edinburgh more attractive to global and local technology companies given the unique connectivity of the site both nationally and internationally. They are in discussions with City of Edinburgh Council, Scottish Enterprise, Edinburgh and Heriot Watt universities among others as it develops its plan and have a meeting with the Scottish Government's chief planner scheduled for early May. Crosswind will begin formal consultation next month with a view to submitting a planning application later this year. It has financial backing from the parent company so is in a strong position to progress subject to planning permission. The site is a sensible site to develop with infrastructure such as a runway already in place.

Sensitivities

Edinburgh's Strategic Development Plan (SDP), Local Development Plan and the NPF all identify Edinburgh Airport / West Edinburgh as a strategic growth area. The SDP is sitting with Scottish Ministers for approval. The development would require to align with the West Edinburgh Transport Appraisal (WETA) study. There would be likely be a need for additional transport infrastructure and developer / parties will still need to contribute to WETA, even with the proposed £20 million City Deal contribution. The Airport / Crosswind has indicated it would work with the Council on a link road from Gogar roundabout. There are multiple landowners including Murray Estates, the airport, Royal Highland Society, Council plus smaller landowners with slightly different priorities.

Crosswind Development, Edinburgh Airport - Planning Status

Proposal

This briefing relates to proposals for the redevelopment of the existing auxiliary "cross wind" runway at Edinburgh Airport. At present, all vehicular traffic to the airport uses the existing Eastfield Road from the A8 Glasgow Road. The available details of the Crosswinds Development set out that the auxiliary runway would be redeveloped to provide a new access road to serve the airport, along with further business and residential development. The second runway closed in 2018. The site is shown at annex 1.

Gordon Dewar, Edinburgh Airport Chief Executive, has previously (2017) been reported in the press that he: expected the development to include "high-end" offices at the southern end of the site, with light industrial units and warehouses at the north end, such as for use by companies flying goods in and out. He said a "relatively modest" amount of housing would be included to complement a major residential development just to the east of the site, around Turnhouse Road.

In March 2019, proposals for a digital quarter were announced by Crosswind Developments. It was reported that they hope to apply for outline planning permission either later this year or in early 2020. Crosswind Developments chief executive John Watson stated the development "will have a focus on the kind of housing, working space and leisure facilities that people demand," and that "Scotland, and Edinburgh in particular, should be an ideal location for global technology jobs but without a dedicated approach to creating the kind of environment technology companies are looking for, it's much harder to bring that investment here."

The NPF3 sets out that development will require continued co-ordination and planning to achieve a successful business-led city extension which fulfils its potential for international investment, new jobs and high quality place. This means any planning applications in the area shown on the map, and meeting the definition have to be notified to Scottish Ministers before determination. This Direction does not commit Scottish Ministers to calling in any such application, but it does reserve their right to intervene in the processing of the application.

The site, along with the remainder of the land surrounding the Airport is included within Annex A of The National Planning Framework 3 which sets out that Strategic Airport Enhancements at Edinburgh are to be designated as National Developments where the development meets listed criteria, the most relevant of which here is criteria c construction of buildings for business, general industrial or storage and distribution use where the gross floor space is or exceeds 10,000 square meters or the development is or exceeds 2 hectares in the area identified for associated business development at Edinburgh, Glasgow and Prestwick Airports."

Edinburgh City Council - Edinburgh Local Development Plan

The Relevant planning policies of the City of Edinburgh Council are set out in the adopted Edinburgh Local Development Plan (November 2016). Policy Emp4 Edinburgh Airport is set out in this development plan and applies to this land. This supports the development and enhancement of the airport within the defined boundary. Proposals for ancillary services and facilities will only be permitted where it can be demonstrated that these have strong and direct functional and locational links with the airport and are compatible with the operational requirements of the airport. All development proposals within the airport boundary must accord with the West Edinburgh Strategic Design Framework. Land to the north of the existing airport boundary is safeguarded to provide a second main parallel runway, if required in the future, to meet air passenger growth forecasts. Within this area, green belt policy will apply (policy Env 10). Proposals which would prejudice the long-term expansion of Edinburgh Airport will not be supported.


Housing - Establishment of Acceptability

The contentious issue with this development, and for that matter the Edinburgh International Business Gateway will be the degree, if any of Housing, permissible. This has not been established yet. It is a matter for City of Edinburgh Council to consider in the first instance. 




WEST EDINBURGH DIRECTION (Scottish Government)








WEST EDINBURGH DIRECTION (Scottish Government)
