This will clear overnight to leave clear spells and fog patches but another system is expected to bring some potentially heavy rain and strong winds to parts of Scotland on Monday, still with a risk of snow.

1.1.6 6 to 10 day forecast

The weather will remain unsettled throughout the second half of next week. There will be showers and more widespread rain moving in from the west at times, but with some drier and brighter/clearer spells too. Winds will be mainly from the west, so temperatures will be near normal for the time of year. This would suggest that there will be the chance of some cold nights, but any sleet or snow will be mainly on high ground.
