On [REDACTED] 2018, an investigation into a suspected infringement has established that there has been a breach of The South Arran Marine Conservation Order 2015. This is specifically that on [REDACTED] 2018 you deployed fishing gear within the boundary of the South Arran Marine Protected Area (MPA) as defined in Schedule 2 of the South Arran Marine Conservation Order 2015, in breach of Article 4(5) of the aforementioned Order.

A summary of the relevant sections of the order are attached as an annex. However for clarity, Article 4(5) of The South Arran Marine Conversation Order States:

“Prohibited and regulated activities

4. (5) A person must not deploy (by any means) or use any passive gear within those parts of the protected area which are described in Schedule 2.

In order to comply with the relevant regulatory requirements while fishing in EC waters you must not deploy any fishing gear as defined above within the area as defined in schedule 2 of the South Arran Marine Conservation Order 2015.

Although there is sufficient evidence to provide a realistic prospect of a conviction, on this occasion the submission of a report to the Procurator Fiscal is not considered to be necessary in the public interest.

In our view your current fishing methods must be modified to prevent you committing further incursions. If your current plotting equipment is not accurately reflecting either your position or that of the boundaries of and within the MPA and you are relying on this equipment to identify where you fish then you may wish to keep this in mind to avoid further infringements. It would also seem sensible to familiarise yourself fully with its use.

I would also remind you, as discussed with [REDACTED] that any further suspected infringements will be considered in the context of this warning letter and the previous infringements.

Although there is sufficient evidence to provide a realistic prospect of a conviction on this occasion the submission of a report to the Procurator Fiscal is not considered to be necessary in the public interest. I have received a report from British Sea Fisheries Officers in Ayr detailing their suspicions that the vessel which you were master of, [redacted] Breached The South Arran Marine Conservation Order 2015. Specifically that on [redacted] you deployed fishing gear within the boundry of the South Arran Marine Protected Area (MPA) as defined in Schedule 2 of the South Arran Marine Conservation Order 2015 in breach of Article 4(2) of the aforementioned Order. Having carefully considered the report made by the detecting officers, I am satisfied that there is sufficient evidence, and the matter sufficiently serious, for a report to be made to the Procurator Fiscal in respect of a Breach of the South Arran Conservation Order 2015 offence.

However, before taking such action, and in accordance with the provisions laid down in Sections 25 – 31 of the Aquaculture and Fisheries (Scotland) Act 2007, as amended, I am **issuing you with a Fixed Penalty Notice for £2,000 in respect of the alleged offences.**

If you wish to accept this offer of a fixed penalty, you should arrange for payment to be made to the Scottish Government at the address below and using one of the payment methods set out in the attachment to this notice.

**THE AQUACULTURE AND FISHERIES (SCOTLAND) ACT 2007:
FIXED PENALTY NOTICE REFERENCE No. 269**

I have received separate reports from British Sea Fisheries Officers from [REDACTED] and the [REDACTED] detailing their suspicions that the vessel which you were master of, breached fishing vessel licencing conditions and The South Arran Marine Conservation Order 2015.

Having carefully considered the reports made by detecting officers, I am satisfied that there is sufficient evidence, and the matters sufficiently serious, for reports to be made to the Procurator Fiscal in respect of:

- A breach of Fishing Licence condition 1.7 as read with article 32 of Commission Implementing Regulation 404/2011. This is specifically that for voyages between 10 July 2018 and 23 August 2018 you failed to complete and submit a fishing logbook in paper format within 48 hours after completion of landing; and
- In respect of a breach of The South Arran Conservation Order 2015. This is specifically that on 10 May 2018 you deployed demersal fishing gear at a location within the South Arran Marine Protected Area to which deployment of demersal fishing gear is prohibited.

An extract of the relevant legislation is attached to this letter in the form of an Annex.

However, before taking such action, and in accordance with the provisions laid down in Sections 25 – 31 of the Aquaculture and Fisheries (Scotland) Act 2007, as amended, I am **issuing you with a Fixed Penalty Notice for £4,000 in respect of the alleged offences.** (comprising of £2,000 for each of the two alleged offences as detailed above).



If you wish to accept this offer of a fixed penalty, you should arrange for payment to be made to the Scottish Government at the address below and using one of the payment methods set out in the attachment to this notice.

If you wish to accept the offer of a fixed penalty you need only pay that amount by the required deadline which is normally **28 days** from the date of this letter, however, as you already have an agreed extended payment period for a previously issued Fixed Penalty Notice, the due deadline has been extended to the same date of **28 February 2019**. Do not write a letter of acceptance or reply to this letter or do anything else other than make the necessary payment quoting the reference number which appears at the top of this letter.

If you pay the fixed penalty any liability to a conviction for the alleged offence is discharged. **Payment of the fixed penalty is not a conviction, nor can it be recorded as such.**

You may decide that you wish to reject the offer of a fixed penalty. If so you may reject the offer by writing to Tom Robertson, Head of Surveillance and Enforcement at the address given at the bottom of this letter. **NO OTHER CORRESPONDENCE MAY BE ENTERED INTO AS TO DO SO MAY BE SUB JUDICE.**

No proceedings in respect of the alleged offence will be taken against you unless you:-

- (a) fail to pay the prescribed amount by the expiry of the deadline given, or**
- (b) intimate in writing that you do not wish to accept the fixed penalty.**

FISHING LICENCE CONDITION 1.7 OF FISHING LICENCE 24315 STATES:

Reporting requirements

1.7 In accordance with Article 29(2) of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No. 404/2011, the Master shall complete and submit an EU logbook and a landing declaration in paper format in accordance with the provisions in Chapter I of Title III of that Regulation, if the vessel is in membership of a Producer Organisation.

COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING REGULATION 404/2011 STATES:

Article 32

Deadlines for the submission of a fishing logbook, transhipment declaration and a landing declaration in paper format

1. When a Union fishing vessel has made a landing in a port or a transhipment in a port or in a place close to the shore of its flag Member State, its master shall submit the original(s) of the fishing logbook, transhipment declaration and landing declaration as soon as possible and not later than 48 hours after completion of transhipment or landing to the competent authorities of the Member State concerned. The original(s) of such a transhipment declaration and landing declaration may also be submitted by the representative of the master on his behalf.

The South Arran Marine Conservation Order 2015 states:

Prohibited and regulated activities

4. (1) Paragraphs (2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (7), (8) and (10) apply in order to further the stated conservation objectives for the South Arran MPA.

(3) While a fishing vessel is within the protected area the master of the vessel must ensure that any fishing gear, passive gear, pelagic trawl, rod and line, or handline carried on board the vessel is properly lashed and stowed in such a way that it may not be readily used.
