The post mortem examination of Allan Marshall's body also found that he had underlying severe coronary artery disease.

FAI

4. As Mr Marshall was in legal custody at HMP Edinburgh at the time he died, his death was subject to a mandatory inquiry under section 2(4)(a) of the Inquiries into Fatal Accidents and Sudden Deaths etc. (Scotland) Act 2016. The FAI was heard over various dates in 2018. Mr Marshall's family was represented at the FAI.

Determination

- 5. In his determination, Sheriff Liddle identified 7 precautions that he considered could have reasonably been taken, that might realistically have resulted in the death of Marshall being avoided. Sheriff Liddle also identifies 3 defects in the system of working which he has determined contributed to the death of Mr Marshall and makes 13 recommendations about steps he considers might realistically prevent deaths in similar circumstances in the future.
- 6. SPS has eight weeks to provide a written response to Sheriff Liddle's recommendations. I will provide a further update once officials from my office have had an opportunity to fully consider Sheriff Liddle's recommendations with

ALLAN MARSHALL – FATAL ACCIDENT INQUIRY (FAI) – SUNDAY MAIL

Purpose

1. To inform you that SPS Communications branch have been contacted by the Sunday Mail this afternoon who have advised that they have obtained a copy of the CCTV footage that was used as a production in the Allan Marshall FAI and that they intend publishing stills from the footage. They refuse to disclose who provided them with the copy of the footage.

Timing

2. Immediate.

Background

Allan Marshall, was remanded to HMP Edinburgh on 2 March 2015 having been charged with the following offences, Criminal Justice and Licensing (Scotland) Act 2010 S38 (1) (using threatening or abusive behaviour) and Police and Fire Reform (Scotland) Act 2012 S90 (1)(A) \times 2 (assaulting or impeding police). Mr Marshall died on 28 March 2015 at Edinburgh Royal Infirmary. The cause of death was a brain injury due to a cardiac arrest which occurred during physical restraint. The post mortem examination of Allan Marshall's body also found that he had underlying severe coronary artery disease.
- 4. As Mr Marshall was in legal custody at HMP Edinburgh at the time he died, his death was subject to a mandatory inquiry under section 2(4)(a) of the Inquiries into Fatal Accidents and Sudden Deaths etc. (Scotland) Act 2016. The FAI was heard over various dates in 2018. Mr Marshall's family was represented at the FAI.

Interim Orders

- 5. SPS have instructed to seek interim orders to prevent the CCTV being published tomorrow morning on the basis that:
 - As a responsible public authority, SPS considers it essential that the rights of all
 interested parties, including its employees, are considered and a balancing exercise
 undertaken prior to any decision being taken on whether to release the CCTV;
 - The Article 2 and Article 8 ECHR rights of the individuals in the footage are engaged and would be potentially infringed by the release of the information. It is in our view paramount that those individuals are contacted prior to any decision being taken and given an opportunity to be heard;
 - The Prison Officers Association (Scotland) must be given an opportunity to address the court on behalf of its members;
 - The rights of other individuals, who are or would be identifiable in the footage, but who did not give evidence and/or were not represented at the Inquiry, must be weighted in the balance.

6. The Interim Orders Hearing will take place later this evening and SPS will be represented by Murdo Macleod QC. Mr MacLeod represented SPS in the latter stages of the FAI. I will update you on the outcome of the hearing.

Update from Colin McConnell

As per my submission yesterday, please see below an update from last night hearing and details of my next steps.

Lord Beckett heard submissions from Senior Counsel, Murdo MacLeod representing SPS in regards to the interdict being sought by SPS, to prevent the Sunday Mail from publishing in whole or in part video footage, or stills of the restraint of the late Allan Marshall. By the time that matter was heard, shortly after 12pm, the matter of the still photos being published in the Sunday Mail had become academic as the prints of the paper were by then with the distributors.

Solicitors representing the paper had assured our solicitors that the images printed had been pixelated so that individuals could not be identified. Our Solicitors were not shown copies of the pictures, but this was confirmed in Court, there was therefore at the time no argument to make on that issue. Of continuing concern however was the intention of the paper to publish the CCTV footage, especially since it was felt that the Sheriff's Determination having named the officers involved might enable those officers to be identified from moving video images. Lord Beckett appeared to accept that the footage was in a different category than the still images. Jonathan Mitchell, QC, who appeared for the paper confirmed that it was still the intention of the paper to publish the footage. He advised that his clients were willing to give an undertaking not to publish for 72 hours to enable discussion between the parties.

His Lordship said he would need to be addressed on section 12(3) of the Human Rights Act 1998 if he was to consider restraint in an Art 10 situation. He left the bench for parties to consider. It was agreed after consideration that it would be preferable to look at authorities in detail and that a postponement would enable that to be done. It would also enable there to be further consideration by the POA as to whether they had continuing concerns and would also wish to make representations. While Counsel for the paper would not give an undertaking without taking specific instructions from the editor that we would be able to view the video in the form that they were proposing to publish, it seems likely that they will allow that to be done on Monday.

Having seen the pictures published this morning, the degree of pixilation is concerning. Staff are potentially identifiable as the back of their heads, identifying marks such as tattoos and uniform types are clearly visible, no attempt has been made to pixelated this information.

Next Steps

• If the video has been pixilated in the same manner as the pictures used this morning in the Sunday Mail, this is a real concern. I am still awaiting confirmation in regards to whether SPS and our solicitor's will be allowed to see the footage that is to be published. In the meantime our solicitors are preparing for court again on Tuesday, at which time we will likely seek an interdict to prevent the publication of the video

footage, particularly if the level of pixilation is to the poor standard used in the photographs, which potentially could lead to staff being identified. Unless you instruct me otherwise.

A short life working group (SLWG) will continue the review of C&R, addressing the recommendations made in the determination, paying particular attention to learning on: the recognition and understanding of medical conditions which may be triggered or exacerbated by the use of force; decision-making and dynamic risk assessment when deploying use of force in unique environments which frequently present new and complex challenges to best practice methods of de-escalation; and improving staff understanding of the role and responsibilities of the Supervising Officer. 16. The SPS would welcome the advice and support of Scottish Government in commissioning external assurance for this review process. Within operational resilience training, this would ordinarily include professional expertise from other custodial settings (or has previously been the case with C&R, comparable settings such as secure care), the involvement of discreet subject matter experts in de-escalation, the use of force and maintaining safety in custody, and the oversight of someone with an understanding and appreciation of the complex needs of the prison population in Scotland, and the prison environment itself, such as the Chief Inspector of Prisons.

Dear Margaret,

Following the recent publication of the Fatal Accident Inquiry (FAI) determination into the death in custody of Allan Marshall in March 2015 at HMP Edinburgh, this letter updates Members on actions taken in response.

Firstly, I would like to express my sympathy and condolences to the family of Allan Marshall. I understand SPS are meeting with Mr Marshall's family early next week.

I believe firmly in a Justice system that is rooted in compassion and that protects the Human Rights of all that pass through it, be they victims, witnesses, perpetrators or those accused of crime. However, it is concerning to note the Sheriff's determination concludes that, in this tragic incident, there were defects in the system that contributed to the outcome.

When tragic incidents do occur it is essential that appropriate actions are taken in response. Mr Marshall had been remanded in custody at HMP Edinburgh on 2 March 2015, having been charged with using threatening or abusive behaviour and assaulting or impeding the police. Mr Marshall died on 28 March 2015 at Edinburgh Royal Infirmary. The cause of death was a brain injury due to cardiac arrest which occurred during physical restraint. The post mortem also found that he had underlying severe coronary artery disease. During the incident, 5 prison officers were also injured and required hospital treatment.

The Crown Office has confirmed that there was a criminal investigation following this incident. As you will be aware, decisions about who is prosecuted and who is not are taken by the Lord Advocate who is constitutionally accountable, acting independently of Government.

The Crown advises that, at its conclusion and having considered the evidence, Crown Counsel determined that there would be no criminal proceedings. For any death in custody, where there have been no criminal proceedings, an FAI is mandatory. The FAI commenced in November 2018 and proceedings took place over 25 days. In his determination, Sheriff Liddle makes 13 recommendations about steps he considers might realistically prevent

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deaths in similar circumstances in the future. In line with provisions within the Inquiries into Fatal Accidents and Sudden Deaths etc. (Scotland) Act 2016, SPS are rightly reflecting on the recommendations in detail and will provide a full response to all the recommendations within 8 weeks.

SPS has confirmed that in the immediate period following Mr Marshall's death a number of learning points and specific actions were identified and implemented, including additional training for staff.

SPS has also confirmed that, following the FAI determination, relevant actions are being taken or are under review relevant to all of Sheriff Liddle's recommendations, in particular with reference to control and restraint. Control and Restraint (C&R) Training is routinely undertaken by SPS frontline staff. Following the FAI determination, the SPS has established a working group to address the recommendations made in the determination, paying particular attention to the recognition and understanding of medical conditions which may be triggered or exacerbated by the use of restraint. SPS will seek additional external expert advice as part of this review.

SPS has also acknowledged the need for external assurance of this review process. Therefore, I have advised Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Prisons today that I will write to her formally this week asking her to undertake external assurance of the SPS's review of C&R training and actions following from the FAI recommendations, in conjunction with relevant independent experts, as required.

SPS has also advised me, that they have sought a copy of transcripts of all evidence given during the FAI proceedings to consider whether any further actions are required in light of the FAI process, in relation to those involved in the original incident.

Having met prison officers across the prison estate I know, and I am sure Members of the Justice Committee will agree, that Scotland's prison officers do an excellent job in increasingly challenging environments.

Let me again express my condolences to Allan Marshall's family. Any death in our care is a tragedy and I am determined that our justice system continues to learn and improve so we can avoid such tragedies from happening again in the future

I trust this information is helpful and I am happy to update Committee Members in due course.
