Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Hunterston PARC masterplan document. I apologise for sending these comments after the deadline for the close of the consultation exercise. Scotland's Statutory National Planning Framework 3 identifies Hunterston as a strategic site and asset in Scotland. We welcome Peel Port's work to help guide development of the site over the next 20 years in a transparent and consultative way.

Hunterston is identified in National Planning Framework 3 as a key location in relation to the marine renewables sector. It is described as an area of coordinated action, which would benefit from a joined up approach to delivery of development across a range of activities. Some key aspects are highlighted including industrial and employment use, links with Irvine Bay regeneration and Enterprise Area, the deep water access, manufacturing and support for offshore wind turbines, coastal tourism and connections with the electricity grid. Not all of these activities would be expected to occur within the Clydeport/Peel Port site.

Whilst the area of co-ordinated action is noted by the masterplan, it is not clear how the uses proposed have been co-ordinated with other development interests in the wider Hunterston area. It would be useful if this could be explored further including with local interests. Similarly is it not clear how the approach taken really responds to sensitive land uses around the site and the sensitivities created by the proposed uses. These are important matters requiring careful consideration.

The planning system in Scotland is fully devolved, legislation relating to the planning system in England does not apply to this site. Given that LNG handling and use is identified within the masterplan we would also highlight our 'Circular 3/2015: Planning Controls for Hazardous Substances' (<https://www.gov.scot/publications/circular-3-2015-planning-controls-hazardous-substances/>).

We would like to direct you towards 'Planning Advice Note 83: Masterplanning' (<https://www.gov.scot/publications/pan-83-planning-advice-note-master-planning/>) if you are to revise the document as a result of the consultation. The current draft of the masterplan reads like a visioning exercise, whereas Planning Advice Note 83 states: 'An effective masterplan should explain how a site, or series of sites, will be developed, describing and illustrating the proposed urban form in three dimensions. It should show how that form will achieve the intended vision for the place, and how a distinct and appropriate character will be created. It should also describe how the project will be implemented through a delivery strategy which sets out phasing, timing and funding.'

The document notes that it may have material status for planning decisions but further discussion with North Ayrshire Council about what the document is at this stage would likely to be helpful in the revision, publicity and ultimate expected use of the document for planning decisions and as a tool for informing communities about the future of the site.

More broadly, the Scottish Energy Strategy is clear that in a hydrogen future scenario, increased gas demand is met from a variety of sources in 2050, including imports of natural gas from Europe and LNG from world markets. We also note the role of LNG and Liquefied Petroleum Gas in supplying energy to the Scottish independent Undertakings. Particularly when derived from bio-sources demand for alternative hydrocarbon resources such as LNG could potentially reduce emissions. The Scottish Government is supportive of the uptake of these energy streams, where the current infrastructure is able to meet the expected growth in demand. Investment could support economic development, safeguarding and creating jobs in the energy sector. As you will appreciate, detailed site considerations need to fully considered as part of any consenting process.

I hope these comments are of assistance.
