

ANNEX B

In response to 2, you may wish to note that Police Scotland were not actively involved in quarantine checks until 31 July, well after the time period mentioned in the request.

However, the Cabinet Secretary scheduled a telephone conversation with Chief Constable of Police Scotland on Monday 15 June 2020. I have extracted information from the record of this call and summarised information relevant to your request below.

Those present on the call included: Cabinet Secretary for Justice, Humza Yousaf; DCC Fiona Taylor, Police Scotland; DCC Malcolm Graham, Police Scotland; Clare Hicks, Scottish Government; and [Redacted], Scottish Government. Apologies were received from: Chief Constable Iain Livingstone.

A main point of discussion relevant to your request included: International travel quarantining – this has not impacted on Police Scotland at this time however this could be due to relatively low numbers travelling. Situation will be monitored and flagged should it cause significant impact.

The remainder of information from this call was out with the scope of your request and not included in the summary.

Please note, while our aim is to provide information whenever possible, in this instance we are unable to provide some of the information you have requested because exemptions under Section 38(1)(b) - Personal information – and **Section 30(b)(ii)** - Substantial inhibition of free and frank exchange of views for the purposes of deliberation - of FOISA applies to that information. The reasons why these exemptions apply are explained in Annex C.

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
