With thanks to policy and SpAds, I have drafted the following comment – based on both Mr Yousaf's original Tweet and drawing from FM comments on ITV *GMB* this morning – which reveals the intention to write to the Home Secretary on this point.

:: Global bid – as you know, while agreed in principle to undertake a bid for Global, we are awaiting confirmation that Mr Yousaf would have sufficient information in briefing to undertake this today; clearly time is moving on, so it may be something to consider for the morning, following publication of *The National* piece.

Justice Secretary Humza Yousaf said:

“I believe the Home Secretary must give serious consideration to denying Mr Trump entry to the UK if he tries to travel here after leaving office in less two weeks' time. The UK Government has that power if an applicant's presence is not conducive to the public good.

“Clearly the dreadful scenes and the tragic loss of life surrounding the confirmation of the US Presidential election result yesterday should be condemned and provide a glimpse of the kind of violent disorder we would all want to avoid in any circumstances. I will be writing to the Home Secretary asking her to give serious consideration to this matter.

“Quite separately of course, and as the First Minister has pointed out, the law in Scotland currently makes clear that no-one should be travelling into or out of the country unless they have an essential purpose for doing so. This is a critical requirement for all of us in Scotland and across the UK as we work collectively to tackle the threat of coronavirus to public health, life, and our NHS.”

Humza,

I seldom get involved in politics but thank you for your proposal to ban Trump from the UK which I totally support owing to the actions of the man over his years in politics and particularly yesterday when he was singularly responsible for the attack of the US Capitol. I am however more concerned that he should be barred from Scotland if that was possible.

I have a particular interest in US politics since my eldest daughter lives in Florida and we have a second home there to allow us to visit but over the past four years the impact of Trump focussing on immigration has made visits to the US uncomfortable with calls to me and my family to go back where we came from. This has however been more temperate than comments made to young people of Chinese or Asian origin who have been born in the USA but belittled since they look different from white Americans. 
