“Thanks to the enormous efforts of our vaccination teams, Scotland’s COVID-19 vaccination programme is now delivering ahead of our expectation.

“This poll was conducted before we reached the milestone of more than one million people at greatest risk from Coronavirus (COVID-19) in Scotland having had their first dose of the vaccine.

“We reached this milestone in the biggest vaccination programme ever delivered in Scotland last week and I would like to thank everyone who is working tirelessly to make this a success, and also every individual who has taken up their offer of a vaccine.
