Good afternoon [redacted s38(1)(b)].

To confirm, these regulations were passed by the Committee earlier today. Next step is the regs being voted through by Parliament, which we expect will be next week, and subsequently agreeing a signing date with the Cabinet Secretary for them to come into force, which we expect will be w/b Dec 7th or 14th.

I should make you aware that the possibility of further correspondence between the Committee and UEFA was raised today. During the discussion on the regulations, Committee members questioned the Cabinet Secretary about the impact of the pandemic on the organisation of the tournament. At some stage in due course, the Committee may wish to seek clarity on issues such as ticket allocation in the event of reduced capacities. We can discuss with you at appropriate point in due course.

Subject: UEFA Euro 2020 (Glasgow) RPP - Trading and Advertising Regulations

Good morning [redacted s38(1)(b)], I hope you're well.

We're turning our attention from the excitement of Scotland qualifying for their first major tournament since France '98 to the UEFA European Championship (Scotland) Act and the laying of the Trading & Advertising regulations - the final set of regulations associated with the Act.

The Cabinet Secretary for the Economy, Fiona Hyslop, has been invited to provide evidence on the regulations to the Culture, Tourism, Europe and External Affairs Committee next Thursday, November 26.

We have timetabled these regulations for next week so that they are laid and can be considered by the Committee before a number of EU exit related regulations are laid later in November / December. Subject to the regulations being approved, Glasgow City Council will need to prepare guidance and engage further with those traders and advertisers affected.

While the scale of supporters at the stadium and fan zones will ultimately be dependant on the Covid context in Scotland, we are of course proceeding – at this moment - on the basis that Trading and Advertising regulations are still required for the tournament in three event zones – Hampden Park, Merchant City and George Square.

In advance of the committee appearance next week and laying of the regulations, subject to Parliamentary approval, our event partners at Glasgow City Council have flagged a couple issues.

The main concern is around a further negative impact on existing street traders. Given the restrictions around Covid that have already impacted street traders (no football crowds, no footfall near street trading), the regulations for Euro 2020 and the requirement to move street traders out of the event zones would come at a time where street traders have already been hit hard financially. Having potentially just got over one set of restrictions, the Euro 2020 regulations would be another negative impact for them. This may be even more apparent as Scotland have now qualified. We recognise that, ultimately, this would be a matter for the Host City and Scottish FA to discuss with UEFA regards any scope for flexibility, however I wanted to put this on your radar and get your initial thoughts? The Host City are of course required to offer alternative street trading arrangements - and we recognise this would be all the more important in light of the situation above – but I understand that process itself will have its challenges in light of Covid.

Another factor to consider is that *if* there is no crowds permitted next summer, in order to ensure the legislation is proportionate we would be expected to give

consideration to revoking the trading provisions. In this scenario, we would appreciate the value to UEFA of the advertising provisions remaining in place, given scope for TV coverage, etc, however without crowds it would be difficult to justify trading provisions. The likelihood is that most traders would not operate anyway - given there would be no crowd – but there are some existing traders who would want to trade on their usual sites.

Final point, presumably the other countries who were required to introduce primary legislation are in a similar position. Do you have any update on progress with them and their considerations around legislation in light of covid?

I appreciate there isn't perhaps definitive answers to much of the above at this stage – and that you'll be very much focussed on other matters at this time - but I essentially wanted to update you on the the Cabinet Secretary's committee appearance and latest with the Euro 2020 Act in Scotland

Subject: EURO 2020 Gateway Meeting - Actions from 1st June meeting

Hello all,

Please see the following note of the actions raised at yesterday's Euro 2020 Gateway meeting.

Actions:

- Advice to be developed with Ministers and appropriate Public Health input around what will be permitted at stadium and fanzone with Glasgow in Level 2 or 3. (Lead – SG ME Team)
- Initial advice will be drafted around stadium plans but will not be finalised until after the results of the Physical Distancing review are available (results expected in the next 24-48 hours) (Lead – SG ME Team)
- Clarity is needed on the forum which partners might use, in event-time, if the epidemiological context changes and modifications or other decisions related to the Event are required. (ME Will collate views which are sought from SG public health policy, clinicians, (PHS, Health Board, and SG), licensors / EHOs and event orgs.)
- Confirmation will be sought from Ministers and Clinicians around what has been understood and agreed around plans and movement of people between the hospitality area and the picnic area of the Fanzone. (Ideally this will be confirmed ahead of Friday's Multiagency meeting.) (Lead – SG ME Team)
- [redacted s38(1)(b)] will confirm the position around protocols should any players develop symptoms while in Scotland. (Lead - [redacted s38(1)(b)])
- [redacted s38(1)(b)] to re-share the seating plan for the Fanzone to help provide clarity. (Lead - [redacted s38(1)(b)])

An update on the food and drink situation at the stadium. This has now been finalised from UEFA senior management.

Position:

As a result of current COVID-19 safety guidelines in the UK, unfortunately food and drink concession stands within Hampden Park stadium will not be open.

Free drinking water will be provided and a small amount of food (e.g sandwiches, snack bars, chocolate bars, crisps, fruit) will be allowed to be brought into the stadium.

Please make sure the food is packaged in the clear bags that will be provided at the start of the entry procedures to the stadium. Each spectator will only be allowed to take one bag into the stadium.

You will not be able to bring bottles, cans or any form of drinks containers into the stadium.
