Many thanks for your email which is great news. We have completed the submission to UEFA as per today's deadline.

Further to our earlier conversation, please see below some points where I believe clarity would be beneficial. As mentioned, the next Multi Agency Meeting for the Fan Zone licence is on Friday (immediately prior to the Gateway Event Process meeting) and it would be helpful if a response to the below was available in advance of both these meetings.

I'd be grateful if you could confirm that:

1. The 3,000 capacity for Glasgow Green is per session – **Yes, 3,000 capacity per session.**
2. The food & beverage area is classed by the Scot Gov as a hospitality space and is therefore subject to the hospitality guidance (which plans are already compliant with in terms of physical distancing) **Yes.**
3. All other areas of the Fan Zone are compliant with regulations and guidance for live events as they will operate at 2m physical distance? **Yes – in line with current regulations or in line with relevant sectoral guidance, for example football participation in line with sportscotland guidance.**
4. The capacity cap of 3,000 per session does not require an exemption from regulations, or exception from any guidance **No exemptions from current regulations or exceptions from guidance are required, assuming continuing progress through the levels and subject to confirmation of the split of the numbers between the event and hospitality spaces.**
5. Any future exemptions to regulations or exceptions to guidance, which may be required should the local authority not continue to progress through the levels, will be managed through the Gateway Event Process

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6. Any change in regulations or guidance will not result in the withdrawal of this approval (subject to the provision in relation to the prevalence of the virus as stated in your email below).

5 & 6 –Should any future exemptions, or exceptions be required, this will be managed through the gateway process – as would any considerations around prevalence of the virus potentially impacting the fan zone taking place.

Once again, many thanks for all your assistance in receiving the necessary approvals from Scottish Ministers.

Scottish Ministers have approved the proposed capacity of 3000 people for the UEFA EURO 2020 Fan Zone in Glasgow Green.

Upon confirmation of this position to UEFA, the Local Organising Structure should reinforce that it may be necessary for the Scottish Government to reverse the decision permit attendance at the fan zone before or during the event, subject to prevalence of the virus.

The Scottish Government and national clinicians welcome further consultation on fan zone operational planning as part of the gateway process for flagship events, with clinical input to review progress, operational details and epidemiological conditions.

To confirm, under the current legislation and proposed delivery model, no exemptions from The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Restrictions) (Scotland) Regulations 2020 are expected to be required to enable the event to be staged, subject to progress through the levels continuing to be made.

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1. Background

On 5 March 2021 Scottish Ministers gave conditional approval for a Fan Zone to take place in Glasgow 11 June – 11 July 2021, as part of the city's EURO 2020 celebrations. The Fan Zone will create a festival atmosphere with a sporting and cultural programme providing an opportunity for communities to gather and celebrate together.

The conditional approval granted the necessary exemptions from The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Restrictions) (Scotland) Regulations 2020 to enable the event to be staged. The exemptions permitted 1.5m physical distancing in the main hospitality area and a capacity cap of 3,000 spectators per session. This approval was conditional upon the prevalence of the virus on 28 April.

On 5 April 2021 Scottish Ministers approved a spectator capacity of up to 25% for the EURO 2020 matches at Hampden Park. The Scottish Government has retained the right to reverse this decision should it be required due to a change in the prevalence of the virus.

2. Introduction

This submission requests confirmation that approval can now be given for the Glasgow Green Fan Zone on the basis of the same exemptions as the conditional approval given on 5 March 2021. It is understood that Scottish Ministers retain the right to reverse this decision should it be required due to a change in the prevalence of the virus (in line with the approval for spectators at Hampden Park). The Host City is required to submit the Scottish Government's final decision on the Fan Zone to UEFA on 28 April.

This paper outlines the key developments in operational planning which have taken place since the conditional approval was granted. This planning builds upon the principles, safety measures and risks identified in 'Ministerial Submission 1' on 1 March 2021. The later decision date of 28 April 2021 for final approval for the Fan Zone (to allow additional time to understand the likely epidemiological context at the time of the event) introduced some additional operational and financial risk to the City. A decision was therefore taken by the City and LOC Board to progress with Option 2 from the original submission, which was a single Fan Zone in Glasgow Green.

3. Fan Zone Operational Planning Update

Following the decision to proceed with a single Fan Zone at Glasgow Green, operational planning has progressed significantly. Below are the key operational planning updates. The full operating plan is in development based on the principles and mitigations discussed with partners and clinicians.

3.1. Key Information

Location	Glasgow Green
Dates	11 June – 11 July
Times	12pm -10pm (5pm-10pm on 11 June) 12pm – 11pm for knock-out stage matches (if required)

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Spectator capacity per session	3,000
No. of sessions	3 per day (11 - 23 June) 2 per day (24 - 11 July)

3.2. Sporting & Cultural Programme

A full sport activity programme will be in place at the Fan Zone encouraging participation in physical activity. This will include a multi-use sports pitch where community groups who have been part of the EURO 2020 'Play Your Game' programme can be part of the EURO 2020 celebrations. The pitch and other sport activations will provide opportunities for spectators to take part in a range of sports, beyond football.

In addition to match days when all UEFA matches will be screened and the sport and commercial partner activations will be ongoing, a programme of cultural content will fill the 9 non-match days/evenings (and some of the afternoons when there is only an evening match). Examples of programming include:

- film screenings, music performances, interactive workshops and spoken word/storytelling
- showcasing, celebrating and exploring music, heritage and community arts projects from city projects
- comedy nights
- a look towards the hosting of COP26 in Glasgow
- celebrating heroes who have emerged through the coronavirus pandemic

3.3. COVID Mitigations

UEFA, the Scottish FA and Glasgow Life (on behalf of Glasgow City Council) are committed to working with partners to provide a safe environment for the people of Scotland and visitors to celebrate the tournament in a COVID secure environment. The organisers will use their high levels of professionalism, skills, knowledge and experience to design and incorporate COVID mitigation measures into the extensive existing health and safety systems and planning.

In line with the conditional approval from Scottish Ministers, planning is on the basis of:

- 1.5m physical distancing within the seated hospitality area (measured mouth to mouth), with additional mitigation measures
- 2m physical distancing for standing and circulation areas, and queuing lanes.
- A capacity cap of 3000 spectators per session

The Fan Zone will be a largely seated venue. A portion of the venue will remain standing to allow spectators to visit sponsor and sporting activations. The booking of tables will be available for a maximum of 6 people, and bookings will be allowed as per the government guidelines at the time of the tournament.

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In addition to the above, the operation of the Fan Zone will adhere to COVID guidance where available (hospitality, construction, sport & leisure), including the following mitigations:

- Sessions to limit dwell time
- Ticketing requirement to capture Test & Protect information
- Food & drink ordering and payment service to minimise risk of transmission
- Face coverings (except when seated with food and drink)
- Enhanced cleaning regime
- Additional toilet capacity (beyond event guidance) and handwashing
- Managed queuing and circulation areas
- Communication – pre-arrival information, signage, messaging on big screen, commentary
- COVID secure person search policy at entry to the Fan Zone
- Medical Provision in line with current event guidance and with additional COVID protocols
- COVID Secure Venue Risk Assessment

3.4. Ticketing

All sessions in the Fan Zone will be ticketed. The ticketing system will capture the data required for Test & Protect purposes. Spectators will be asked to confirm that they are adhering to current guidance in terms of sitting in household bubbles at the time of booking their ticket.

Tickets are free for all sessions where EURO 2020 matches are being screened. The cultural programme is currently being developed and ticket charges may apply for selected performances on UEFA 'rest days'.

3.5. Food & Beverage

The current plan (based on existing) restrictions is for a full table service operation for food and drink. This will only change if hospitality guidance permits (e.g. spectators queuing in person at the food concessions). There will be a limited menu available to support efficient service and the organisers are investigating the possibility of advance ordering via the ticketing system.

The application is for the Glasgow Green Fan Zone to be granted an alcohol licence for the space within the perimeter fence line and the Alcohol Management Plan is currently being developed by the Licensee for review by multi-agency partners.

3.6. Capacity

The spatial capacity of Glasgow Green far exceeds the 3,000 peak spectator capacity of the Fan Zone. Operational planning (stewarding, medical provision, toilets etc) will also be sufficient to facilitate a higher capacity. The City and LOC Board have agreed that, should the Host City and partners deem it operationally feasible, a request to increase the capacity to 5,000 can be made to Scottish Ministers.

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At this stage, however, the focus is on safely delivering the Fan Zone for 3,000 spectators in a COVID secure manner with all the appropriate safety measures in place. The currently capacity will remain at 3,000, but will be kept under review. If it is considered safe to request an increase to 5,000, this would be subject to a further submission to Scottish Ministers.

4. COVID-19 Planning Process

The plans in Section 3 have been developed following consultation with multi-agency partners (including Environmental Health, Licensing, NHSGGC, Police Scotland) and national clinicians.

All planning principles, mitigations and risks outlined in 'EURO 2020 COVID-19 Ministerial Submission 1, 1 March 2021' remain unchanged and have been integrated into the planning outlined in this paper, and the operating plan which in its final stages of development.

A further meeting took place on 19 April 2021 with the Deputy National Clinical Director and Event Policy Officials to discuss the details of the planning outlined in this paper. Following feedback from the DNCD, the team will continue to work with partners of on the plan for transitions between sessions. Discussions and further planning will be presented to clinicians and officials through the Gateway Events Process.

5. Conclusion

Following conditional approval from Scottish Ministers on 5 March 2021 for the EURO 2020 Fan Zone (subject to the prevalence of the virus on 28 April 2021), this paper provides an update on operational planning for a Fan Zone in Glasgow Green. Confirmation that final approval can be given is sought prior to UEFA's deadline of 28 April 2021 when all EURO 2020 Host Cities must submit confirmation of the plan for their Fan Zone(s).

All partners remain committed to staging EURO 2020 in a safe environment for tournament participants, spectators, staff and the local population. The Fan Zone will create a welcoming venue where all aspects of the football tournament, sport activities, culture, health and wellbeing activities, and an array of food and drink can be enjoyed. The event will provide significant international profile for Scotland on the global stage with iconic broadcast and media images from Hampden Park and across the City reaching estimated audiences of more than one billion. In addition, it will bring vibrancy back to the City, support businesses and provide an opportunity for the people of Scotland to celebrate together once again.

Good morning all.

I can confirm a number of points this morning following approval from Scottish Ministers.

The seated food and beverage area of the Fan Zone includes live entertainment and therefore is an 'Outdoor seated live event' as defined in events sector guidance - however Scottish Ministers have agreed to an exception for reduced physical distancing from 2m to 1.5m for this event space within the UEFA EURO 2020 Fan Zone in Glasgow Green from 11 June to 11 July, 2021; and an exception for staff delivering the food and beverage offering within this space to operate in line with hospitality sector guidance, which may, on occasion, include working to 1m.

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Broader activity within the Fan Zone should operate at 2m - or subject to relevant sectoral guidance for specific activity (i.e. youth football).

The previously approved capacity exception remains – 3000 overall per session.

Upon announcement of the Fan Zone, event organisers should reinforce that the Scottish Government can reverse any decision to permit attendance at the Fan Zone before or during EURO 2020, subject to prevalence of the virus. The Scottish Government is currently reviewing local authority Levels and will provide an update later this week.

Further to a conversation with [redacted – 38(1)(b)] this evening, and our subsequent call, the Fan Zone Ministerial Submission will go up tonight on the basis of the following:

1. The vehicle for approving the event is the Event Sector Guidance given the nature of the event (match screenings, cultural programme, activations etc)
2. As a live event, the Fan Zone will be planned and operated within the event sector guidance, with the following exceptions:
 - Physical distancing will be reduced from 2m to 1.5m for spectators seated in the food & beverage area
 - The peak spectator capacity will be 3,000
 - Back of house hospitality areas may operate on occasion at 1m, where it is not practicable to maintain 2m

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I note that a hold has been issued for the next Multi Agency meeting to take place on Thursday morning and would anticipate receiving a response from Ministers in advance of the meeting.

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Thanks for following up and apologies again for not having a resolution for you on this yet.

We had a helpful meeting with [redacted – 38(1)(b)], clinicians and the SG hospitality lead yesterday. This allowed us to talk about the fan zone proposal (which is now more fully developed), expected progress through the levels, review of physical distancing, and potential development of guidance on hospitality (including screening of key football matches). I think our conclusion, in particular now having better clarity on timescales for physical distancing review and having understood the extent of the cultural programme and where in the fan zone this will take place, is that we should work on the basis the current hospitality space is instead an event space. We can discuss with the group tomorrow in more detail but our initial view is that it would be better to revert to Ministers and ask them to give in principle approval on that basis. We'd be looking to do this asap if we agree that tomorrow.

I hope that gives you some reassurance on progress and happy to discuss key dates for the licensing perspective when we meet tomorrow so we can try to keep this aligned moving forward.

I attach the updated presentation which was given by Glasgow Life to the Multi Agency Group Members on 30 April 2021. This was attached to my email sent to Lucy on 29 April. You will see on page 11 that Glasgow Life has confirmed that there will be two areas within the fan zone – a Family Picnic Area and a Beer/Beverage Garden Area with the capacity split being:

- Bookable capacity for the Family Picnic Area – 300 people
- Bookable capacity for the Beer/Beverage Garden – 2700 people

It also details that all spectators require to comply with the Covid hospitality guidance. On page 13 of the presentation you will note it states that the cultural programme will be delivered in the Beer/Beverage Garden. I have attached the draft cultural programme received from Glasgow Life. Please note this programme is still subject to change and approvals from relevant Glasgow Life senior management and the EURO 2020 Senior Officer's Group.

Based on this information and your email below there are a few matters I require clarification on from the Scottish Government. I have detailed these matters below and would be grateful to have clarification from you by close of play tomorrow to enable me to progress the Multi Agency meetings.

1. Given the proposed cultural activities (live events such as DJ set, comedy, jazz festival, drag night, band night, celtic connections etc) being provided within the Beer Garden why is the SG classing it as a hospitality venue rather than an "event" and subject to the SG event guidance or an exemption from the SG?
2. I note you say that the hospitality sector guidance is likely to be reviewed shortly – is it likely that *all* the activities within the proposed cultural programme will be permitted under

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hospitality guidance? If so, this could lead to an overlap between the SG event guidance and the SG revised hospitality guidance.

3. At present the activities in the cultural programme would be classed as an "event" (not currently permitted under current SG hospitality guidance) and would be subject to the SG event guidance and 2 metres social distancing being adhered to. If the SG permit these activities under (revised) hospitality guidance is social distancing then going to be permitted at 1.5metres and not 2 metres?

Noted regards the position with the Multi Agency Group. I do appreciate that the licensing team are seeking absolute clarity given there will be public scrutiny of any decisions taken.

In broad terms, the approval granted by Scottish Ministers is for a capacity of 3,000 people per session for the Glasgow Green Fan Zone. Ministers are reassured that the gateway process will provide an opportunity to further consider detailed operational planning.

That decision to approve 3,000 people per session recognises that there would be a mixed space of 1) seated hospitality (1.5m PD) with a live entertainment offering as part of that & 2) event activation areas (2m PD).

In terms of 1, we do not consider that any exemptions to regulations are required. Should there be a requirement for an exception in hospitality guidance once we are closer to the event, and the position is more certain, we will take the relevant course of action. We expect tourism and hospitality sector guidance, particularly the advice regarding live music and live sport on big screens within hospitality, to be reviewed shortly.

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In terms of 2, no exemption to regulations is currently required. Specific activity within the activation area should follow relevant sectoral guidance, for example football participation in line with sportscotland guidance.

In terms of the capacity of the event activation areas - the 'Outdoors free-standing' capacity limit in events sector guidance is currently: 250 in Level 2, 500 in Level 1 and 1,000 in Level 0. Whether we need to introduce an exception for this part of the Fan Zone offering will be dependent on what Level Glasgow has progressed to (and the final confirmation of what the configuration of 3,000 people is between seated hospitality and event activation).

Separately, I've updated [redacted – 38(1)(b)] regarding exemptions in regulations that will be taken forward in respect of the stadium. [redacted – 38(1)(b)] should be able to update on this.

I hope the above is helpful. Granted, there are moving parts and the position with exemptions in regs versus exceptions in guidance can be complex.

- *Scottish Government approves LOS Glasgow's plan for Glasgow Green Fan Zone, subject to the state of the pandemic nearer the start of the tournament -*
- *Up to 6,000 people per day can attend ticketed Fan Zone sessions for 31 days of the tournament -*

Following Steve Clarke's UEFA EURO 2020 Scotland squad announcement last week and confirmation last month that approximately 12,000 spectators will be able to attend the four matches at Hampden Park, there was more good news for football fans today with the confirmation that plans for a Fan Zone in Glasgow will go ahead for this flagship event.

The UEFA EURO 2020 Local Organising Structure (LOS) Glasgow is pleased to announce that a Fan Zone will be created at Glasgow Green. Open for the 31 days of the tournament from 11 June to 11 July 2021, it will accommodate up to 6,000 people per day, split between two sessions. All sessions in the Fan Zone will be ticketed.

The LOS Glasgow partners (Scottish FA, Glasgow Life, Scottish Government, Police Scotland and VisitScotland) are committed to providing a safe and COVID secure environment for Scotland fans to connect with and celebrate the tournament. A festival atmosphere will be created, providing an opportunity to enjoy an exciting programme of sporting and cultural activity.

The outdoor Fan Zone will be a largely seated venue and will be subject to relevant physical distancing requirements. Plans for the Fan Zone and the status of the pandemic will continue to be monitored in the run up to the tournament. As well large screens showing all UEFA EURO 2020 matches there will be a 10m Festival Tower hosting a range of sporting, cultural and digital content.

There will be a range of food and beverages showcasing the very best of Scottish produce, and a family friendly sport activity programme will be in place at the Fan Zone encouraging participation in physical activity. This will include a multi-use sports pitch where community groups which have been part of the UEFA EURO 2020 Glasgow 'Play Your Game' football programme across the city will be part of the celebrations. The pitch and other sport activations will also provide opportunities for spectators to take part in a range of sports, offering something for everyone.

Tickets for all match sessions are **free of charge and available to book from tomorrow (Tuesday 25 May)** through the UEFA EURO 2020 Glasgow website <https://euro2020.scottishfa.co.uk/> with the ticketing process managed by, See Tickets.

On days when there are no matches, the Fan Zone will host an outdoor cultural programme. Details will be announced shortly, including where ticket charges will apply for selected performances.

Helping to welcome visitors to the Fan Zone and enhance their experience with their local knowledge and enthusiasm will be the Host City volunteers, known as Volkswagen Mobility Makers.

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Welcoming the news, Councillor David McDonald, Deputy Leader, Glasgow City Council said: “We are delighted that the Scottish Government has given approval for the UEFA EURO 2020 Fan Zone at Glasgow Green to take place, subject to the status of the pandemic nearer the tournament, hopefully enabling the city to play its part in the wider event celebrations.

- As is always the case for events of this nature, an application for a temporary public entertainment licence has been submitted to Glasgow City Council which requests permission to stage the Fan Zone 11 June – 11 July, 12:00 – 22:00 hours. In the latter knock-out stages of the tournament, some 20:00 hrs kick-off

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matches may run into extra time and penalties, in which case the Fan Zone will remain open until the conclusion of the match (23:00 hours at the latest).

- Event plans will be assessed by partners against epidemiological conditions and COVID measures will continue to be monitored in the run up to and throughout the tournament to ensure they remain appropriate.
- There will be no road closures as a result of the Fan Zone, however, a limited number of parking restrictions will be necessary. A small amount of parking spaces will be suspended on the south side of Greendyke Street, between London Road and Charlotte Street. This will occur from 16:00 hours on the 9 June – 10:00 hours on the 13 July 2021. There is still ample parking available and with no road closures being implemented, no alternative parking arrangements have been arranged.

It is not a requirement for ticket holders to show a negative result from a COVID-19 test to gain access to the Fan Zone or the stadium on match days. That's correct in that we have been working on the basis that testing will not be required as a means of entry to either the fan zone or stadium.

While that position hasn't changed, SG would like to discuss further public comms and messaging around encouraging fans to take a test prior to attending match days or attending the fan zone.

I would suggest lines meantime which reaffirm that event plans will be continually assessed and reviewed by partners before and during the tournament, perhaps acknowledging that this includes public messaging to encourage attendees to take lateral flow tests before and after entering the fan zone.

This same request has made its way to SG – we will defer to Glasgow Life as event organiser, but reaffirm that event plans will be continually assessed, etc.

Thanks very much.

For your info, Health Secretary Humza Yousaf also mentioned testing for the fanzone during an interview this morning on BBC Good Morning Scotland today.

He said: “We have taken the decisions we’ve taken around the fan zone which, of course, we’ll make sure there’s appropriate testing and so on and so forth around those venues.

”But what we’ve done is to make sure we’re not taking any risks but actually making sure that the situation is as safe as possible for those who are entering the stadium or indeed the fan zone.”

I was just looking to find out how this testing would be organised (if that is the plan). Would people with tickets be expected to take a lateral flow test before attending? And how would they show proof of that?

John Swinney suggested on the BBC's Sunday Show this morning that all those attending the Glasgow Green Euros fanzone will have to take a Covid test.

He said: "The fan zone as you talk about, they are going to be very regulated environments so there will be significant constraints upon who can get in and what testing has got to be undertaken to enable that to be sustained.

"So combining that with what we do in individual localities to make sure people are taking all the necessary steps to suppress the virus, I'm confident that we can achieve that.

"We can only do that if we follow the sustained approach we have taken to make sure that we keep the virus under control."

I've spoken to someone who bought a ticket for it last week, and he says that testing is not mentioned at the booking stage or in the T&Cs emailed to him with his confirmation.

Also, just looking at the booking site, the only info there is that the fanzone will be following hospitality rules (number of households capped etc).

Many thanks for all your help on Friday and Saturday and I hope that you managed to get some downtime over the weekend.

Niamh and I met the Cabinet Secretary this morning and he was keen to get a bit more information on the additional interventions around test kits/spot checks related to the Fanzone. Specifically he is interested in:

1. Postage of tests to ticket holders – some additional information as to how many tests we think will be posted out in the first few days this week, and when we anticipate being in a position where all ticket holders will have been sent a pack? Test kits were collected today that will allow the first tranche of 8,000 to be posted. These should start to arrive by Thursday this week. An order has been placed for additional kits that will be issued as a second tranche to the remaining ticket holders, circa. 9,000. I'm advised this order can be fulfilled in 1-2 days and, subject to this, would anticipate these deliveries will reach households by Monday/Tuesday next week.
2. Distribution of tests on-site – do we have an indication of how many packs of tests (on average) have been handed out each day over the weekend? Saturday 12 June – 643 packs. Sunday 13 June – 542 packs.
3. Spot checks/survey – the Cabinet Secretary is interested in when we might start to see some of the data flow from the spot checks coming through, in order that this can inform any changes in our comms/other approaches to the Fanzone events. Do you know when any initial data/feedback might be available? I will follow up on this separately. Feedback from site shows this engagement has been positively received by attendees.
4. Testing Bus – I updated the Cabinet Secretary that the bus would be in place again today (as previously indicated) and for the subsequent Scotland games as requested. He is also interested in whether it might also be available for the latter games of the tournament when interest/numbers of attendees may rise. I explained that this would be dependent on other demands across the Health board area for testing, but that I would feed this in for consideration. Noted, thank you. Deployment will be kept under review and consideration given to stationing testing provision at the Fan Zone or possibly to other areas associated with the event e.g. around Hampden.

I would be most grateful for any update/response on the points above, if at all possible in the course of this afternoon, to allow us to provide that information to the Cabinet Secretary.

Very happy to talk through any of the above in more detail if helpful.

Many thanks for ongoing support on this. Cabinet Secretary has now replied on the note in advance of his media visit to Fan Zone tomorrow, and the issuing of a proactive news release ahead of that.

Cab Sec is keen the testing Bus is available in site at the Fan Zone for every Scotland match, and to be able to say that in NR today and tomorrow. Are you able to confirm that is possible?

Mr Yousaf is also extremely keen to be able to say definitively what we are doing on the issue of posting/distributing test kits to fans prior to arrival. He recognises we may not have it perfected by Monday but would like us to be able, by tomorrow at the latest, to outline our intentions. Can I check exactly what the last remaining check is there (in terms of being able to say anything about intentions publically) - is it the ticket company checking with their lawyers on the data sharing issue?

He would also be keen to explain – at least broadly – our plans for spot checks / survey so we need to ensure this point is being covered in the further comms handling being sent to Cab Sec later today.

I think the remaining issue on this last one is confirmation from Joanne that event organisers can provide staff to undertake spot check in sample of attendees. Any update on that?

In terms of a brief update for the Cabinet Secretary tonight, would you/colleagues be comfortable with us saying the following (and grateful for assistance with what we can say in the highlighted sections below)?

Testing Bus

Arrangements have been put in place to have a testing bus on site at Glasgow Green, initially from Saturday 12 – Monday 14 June (between 11.30am and 4.30pm) providing an on-site testing lateral flow testing centre (or will it be a lateral flow test collection point? Testing only, separate arrangements for collection/ distribution).

At this point there is no commitment to provide this facility beyond Monday but that position will be kept under review and dependent on both levels of uptake over the weekend and wider demands across the Health Board area.

Posting of Test Kits

All ticket holders have already been emailed/contacted by the event organisers to emphasise the importance of self-testing with signposts to UK Government portal and existing collection points.

Final confirmation from the ticket company is required in relation to their position on sharing customers contact details to allow test kits to be posted [the Council are pursuing this with the ticketing company and expect to receive this by.....? as a matter of urgency].

In anticipation of that agreement being reached Glasgow City Council and Greater Glasgow and Clyde Health Board have progressed plans to allow them to distribute test kits to participants by post via existing Glasgow City Council contractual arrangements (alternative options with DHSC and APS were also considered but have been discounted as either not being suitable or not possible). It is our intention to send one box of 7 pack test kits to every person that has booked a table (of up to 6 people) at each session at the fanzone – this will require approximately 30,000 test kits to be sent out over the course of the month.

NHS NSS will deliver 10,000 packs of tests to Glasgow City Council on Monday [kits will be collected by us, not delivered] to allow the posting of tests to commence in the course of Monday [Monday is not confirmed, timescales are subject to data access, transport of test kits to, and engagement with, our contractor] and throughout next week, with an order for a further delivery of up to 40,000 test kits to be provided by NHS NSS to the Council later next week. It is anticipated that kits will have been posted to all participants by XXX [hope to be underway by end of next week. Not for the update - postal issue may be staggered according to when attendees have tickets to attend rather than issuing all kits at once, the approach is being confirmed].

In the interim period between now and the postal process commencing on Monday, Glasgow City Council has access to around 3,000 test kits that they plan to use as an initial supply over the coming days for distribution/collection on-site at Glasgow

Green [would the intention be to offer these to people as they leave a session and head home? Yes. There may also be distribution on site – the approach will be refined over the weekend as the team see what works best operationally].

Upon receipt of the confirmation that the organisers are able to share the necessary data to support this planned activity, colleagues at Glasgow City Council will refine their planning arrangements for the postal distribution and provide a further update on those plans [in the course of tomorrow? Monday but sooner if possible].

Spot Checks/Survey of Attendees

[redacted – 38(1)(b)]– need some text from you in here in terms of the ask that has been made and challenges with being able to speak to [redacted – 38(1)(b)] today to understand what is possible by way of staffing]. Subject to confirmation that the event organisers can provide staff to undertake this survey work, we would initially propose that a sample of the attendees at each session (X%) are asked whether or not they followed the guidance to undertake a lateral flow test at home before the event. This information would be gathered and fed back into Health and Social Care Analysis to be collated and included as part of the ongoing reporting on the event. If that data shows low levels of compliance with testing over the early period of the event then we can look to enhance the question set to seek further information on the reasons why people were not testing to allow us to better understand where our communications/messaging approach around pre-event testing needs to be adapted.

We expect to have a response from the event organisers on this aspect [in the course of tomorrow] and on the assumption that they can support this, we would look to commence the survey/spot check element from Monday of next week.

I also understand that the Cabinet Secretary is planning to visit the fanzone on Sunday and would like to be in a position to announce the testing bus/postage of test/spot check plans in advance of that. Is this something that you anticipate that we can reach a final position on in the course of tomorrow? **The testing bus is confirmed and will be on site for the visit on Sunday.**

- Postal issue is subject to access to ticket holder personal data, held by See Tickets. A response is awaited from them.
- Postal fulfilment options/ timescales are being explored, incl. Council leading this using existing contractors. Use of the existing DHSC/Royal Mail contract and the SG/APS contract have been confirmed not possible. Timescales and numbers of kits issued per day etc. will be subject to receipt of data and kit.
- To date, all ticket holders have been emailed to emphasise the importance of self-testing with signposts to LFD Direct Gov't portal and existing collection points.
- We have arranged with NSS to collect 10k kits on Monday. NSS is placing a larger order of 40k for delivery later next week.

We have been asked to provide an update for Ministers this afternoon on the various components of the actions that have been requested. In order to prepare that update would it be possible to have a short text contribution on how we would propose to use the Criticom option, when that could start, when NSS would need to deliver kits to GGC, how many kits we can issue per day, and when we would expect to have fulfilled the request to send c30k kits out to ticket holders? This is all of course still contingent on a positive outcome on the legal/data protection consideration but I wanted us to be ahead of the ask when it comes in with some prepared text.

It would also be helpful if you were able to provide an update on the use of the testing bus for the event, which I understand Linda was exploring (when it could be there etc) to include. I understand that Mr Yousaf is planning to visit the fanzone on Sunday, but not sure whether having the bus available for that is a remote possibility or not.

There is also a separate question about how/whether we could implement some sort of survey of participants at the event to ascertain the extent to which attendees undertook recommended testing in advance, but I am still waiting for further information from our events colleagues on that.

Thanks for chatting just now. To confirm, DHSC doesn't have an established way of distributing test kits to many individual addresses.

As discussed GCC has a delivery mechanism with Criticom which was used for the VOC response work. We agreed that in the absence from something from DHSC this should be used as option 1 – with the proviso that GCC needs NSS to deliver the kits and needs clarity on the data protection point, and that it would take a number of days to stand up this option. A second option is using SG's contract with APS if Criticom can't deliver, but this is likely to have the same amount of steps in the process (or have more).

We can share our legal team's view on data protection once they have the organiser's legal view. Hopefully we can get this over the line – suggest we use this copy list to communicate on progress and widen as needed.

Did you manage to consider the question below?

At this moment, the elite sporting exemption does not permit travel to a fan zone. The exemption specifically covers accommodation, training and competition venues. Should a request be made for a fan zone to be covered by the exemption, the Scottish Government and national clinicians would consider accordingly. Key factors would be, for example, the number of staff / suppliers travelling to a fan zone and to what extent they would be mixing with the local public.

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In addition, please can you input on the position in Scotland on the three questions below:

1a) Is there a specific procedure and any exemption from the entry requirements / quarantine for persons with a Covid-19 vaccine?

1b) Who can benefit from this special procedure and under which conditions?

There is no specific procedure / exemption from entry requirements with the vaccine at this stage.

2a) If applicable, which is procedure for people with a confirmed previous infection in regards to entry requirements in your country?

2b) Is there a specific timeframe for the previous infection to be recognised (90 days / 6 months)?

People with a confirmed previous infection will still need to provide a negative test as per international travel regulations .

3a) What is the treatment for people who have had a previous Covid19 infection and test positive again shortly after the infection?

3b) Is there a specific timeframe, within which such cases may be exempted from quarantine upon receipt of the second positive test result?

Similar to question 2, people with a confirmed previous infection will have to produce a negative test to enter the country. Whilst there will be no exemptions with a positive test, it has been noted that Lateral Flow Tests have provided more accurate results in the cases of those previously infected.
