Hi [redacted]/Donna,

Happy New Year! Hope you both managed to get some down time over the Christmas period and that the horrors of home schooling aren't too much of a challenge for you.

Wanted to give you a heads up that I've received a draft letter from the Office for Statistics Regulation (OSR) regarding casework they have received from individuals writing to them about the Care Homes report published by PHS at the end of

October 2020. Their letter is fair and I'm meeting them tomorrow to talk through some of the specifics. Generally they are complementary of the report and the transparent way we produced the analysis. Their specific comments relate to the complex modelling in section 2 and the way that has been explained (with a view that we could have done more to aid the understanding of a lay person). I've drafted a response to the OSR, acknowledging their letter and explaining that we deliberately held sessions with many of the key stakeholders, including media, to walk through the findings and allow them to ask questions. [redacted] and [redacted] and their team have also done some additional analysis and our current thinking is that we produce an updated report in February 2021, with the new analysis included, and an updated commentary to take account of the OSR letter.

[redacted] and I are meeting with the OSR tomorrow (Tuesday) to discuss. We'll then know the likely date of publication (they've indicated Wednesday 13th but may be later). I'm speaking with the PHS Comms team tomorrow so they are briefed and will ask them to brief SG comms colleagues too.

I'll double check with the OSR that they are content for me to share copies of their final letter and my response with Scottish Government in advance of publication so that you can use for any briefing purposes.

Happy to chat through tomorrow (Tuesday) if that would help.

Hi [redacted],

Just to confirm, that after discussion with PHS and confirmation from [redacted] that Cab Sec is content, PHS will not proceed to publish the data on discharges from hospitals to care homes on 30/09. They are keen to ensure that the data is fully quality assured and that they are able to publish the full context surrounding the data. They intend to publish the following on their website this afternoon:

“On 30 September, Public Health Scotland were due to release a publication on ‘Discharges from NHS hospitals to care homes between 1 March and 31 May 2020’. However, whilst undertaking the analyses PHS identified a number of data quality issues that need resolved. PHS has therefore, made the decision to delay this publication until the 28 October to allow further data quality assurance work to be undertaken, in collaboration with NHS Boards. It is vital to ensure that the correct cohort of people are identified for this work, which has linked together several different datasets for the first time, and we want to incorporate, where possible and appropriate, feedback from NHS Boards.

Our plans for the publication on the 28 October are to have two complementary reports: one reporting on the statistics; and the other providing the wider narrative to contextualise the statistics.

PHS are collaborating with clinical experts from University of Glasgow and University of Edinburgh.”

Comms colleagues are aware and reactive lines are being prepared. We will ensure that the Cabinet Secretary is kept up to date with progress on the production of the report.
