1. INTRODUCTION

This document outlines an overview of the initial planning and considerations being made by Bowls Scotland and associated delivery partners to host the above event safely whilst considering that any activity undertaken is consistent with Scottish Government (SG) guidance on health, physical distancing and hygiene. Bowls Scotland has completed an initial assessment to ensure that hosting the event will be no detrimental impact on the wider community and healthcare systems.

The support of SG and Public Health Scotland (PHS) is essential and Bowls Scotland will work with the relevant delivery partners and User Groups, drawing on their guidance and expertise throughout the delivery of the event/competition. This request has been made taking consideration and having full understanding of the requirements to host events/competitions that are defined in Resumption of Performance (Elite) Sport Guidance (Steps 1 – 4) and that they can be applied within all areas.

Any developed plans will meet and exceed all National and Local Government guidance intended to slow the spread of coronavirus. This will be done by implementing control measures to limit contact among individuals associated with the event and delivering specific protocols including COVID-19 related communication and testing. The event will be delivered with the minimum number of personnel required with appropriate emergency services measures being agreed and relevant insurance in place to host an event/competition of this nature. Bowls Scotland will work in partnership with accommodation providers to ensure that COVID-19 guidance is in place and can be followed when players/staff are in their hotels. Both team delegations will be hosted at different Hotels to mitigate risk. Accommodation details are as outlined above.

Wales and England will follow the appropriate COVID-19 guidance and will travel as detailed above to Scotland. The most up to date Government advice governing travel throughout the UK will be followed.

Appropriate testing protocols will be in place for the event and all in attendance will adhere to the required testing.
