This is a consequence of the success of GME within the authority and increased uptake from parents. GME transport is provided for children/young people using the same criteria as applies to English medium support consequently no parent choosing GME is disadvantaged within the framework (nor is there any preferential treatment) this ensure there is no disincentive regarding the choice of GME to due to distance.</i></p> <p><i>This is a continuing element in the GME spend. However as more local provision are developed transport costs will be reduced or eliminated? The second GME primary provision provides evidence of strategic development towards actively reducing costs of transport.</i></p> <p><i>Currently 2/3 of the school roll is provided with transport. This will continue to grow as more people enrol for GME</i></p> <p><i>Again, this would be the same for session 2021-2022</i></p> <p><i>SGG Campus was chosen due to its central location and suitable transport links and access. 1. *Adult and Family Classes*
2. *The programme provides initial engagement of adults in Gaelic Language in the community settings; it encourages participation by adults with no family or geographical connection to the language and helps learners become involved at an accessible level to build confidence. Learners are placed in an appropriate class following an initial levelling session at the beginning of each term and then assessed at the end of the sessions and progress to the next level where appropriate.*

Learners can progress towards fluency with links to FE and other providers

It further include Gaelic language development for parents of pupils at GME early years often providing a starting point for parents and other family members

This Saturday morning group (Sradgan) encourages and support Gaelic learning for the whole family through a programme of classes for parents and supervised play for preschools and primary school children. The groups meets weekly during term and time and also organised a week of classes and activities during the summer (part funded by GLAIF)

GlasgowLife with GCC Education services to provide support to parents with children I P1 by organising parent support homework sessions: a 6 week programme during term time and a new 1 week summer programme – currently all on line as per Covid Restrictions

In addition to this Glasgow life provides classes for parents at all 3 GME nurseries.

GlasgowLife also provides support to Casan Ceolach the youth drama group that meets at SGG

Programmes consist of classes from beginners to more advanced, parent, family and youth programmes (Gaelic Rhyme time, nursery parent classes, homework support classes, family learning week)

As participant numbers have grown it has been necessary to increase staffing to maintain staff rations especially where there are young people involved.

There has been more provision on the south side of the city to further help develop Gaelic language and identity for the new school and this uptake for this has been high.
