Amendment No 26 <a href="#">2021/227</a>	3 June 2021	Adjusts Levels allocation for numerous parts of Scotland (islands to Level 0, some areas to Level 1 and Glasgow to L2). Permits funfairs in L2 and allows walking down the aisle or similar without physical distancing.
Amendment No 27 <a href="#">2021/238</a>	11 June 2021	Adjusts to provide a person designated by a Local Authority with a power of entry to enforce restrictions relating to stadia and events. Also reduces the required distances to be maintained between persons in Hampden Park, Glasgow and the Glasgow Green Event Zone during the UEFA EURO 2020 Championship period.
Amendment No 28 <a href="#">2021/242</a>	17 June 2021	Removes the Republic of Ireland and the area of Bedford Borough Council from the list of areas to which the common travel area restrictions apply. These regulations also add



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		Manchester and Salford to the list of areas to which common travel area restrictions apply.
Amendment No 29 <a href="#">2021/252</a>	24 June 2021	Adjusts the physical distancing requirements so that family members may be involved in funerals by carrying of the coffin or lowering the coffin into a lair. Also provides extended opening hours for hospitality in the event that a match during the knockout stages of the UEFA EURO 2020 Championship which is being shown in hospitality premises runs over the currently permitted opening hours. Adjusts the physical distancing rules for the purpose of the 1888 Cup rugby event at Murrayfield Stadium on 26 June 2021. Also adjusts the rules on face coverings at weddings and civil partnerships.
Amendment No 30 <a href="#">2021/255</a>	29 June 2021	Removes the areas of Bolton Metropolitan Borough Council, Manchester City Council and Salford City Council from the list of areas to which the common travel area restrictions apply.
Amendment No 31 <a href="#">2021/262</a>	7 July 2021	Reduces the required physical distances to be maintained between persons within the premises of the Renaissance Club, North Berwick for the period of the abrdn Scottish Open, which is scheduled to start on 8 July and end 11 July 2021 (or 12 July in the event play cannot be completed on the 11 July). They also make a minor amendment to provisions relating to stadia and live events: a local authority will only be required to notify the Scottish Ministers of an

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		application for an exemption on capacity in Levels 0, 1 or 2 when directed to do so by the Scottish Ministers. These regulations also remove the area of Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council in England from the list of areas to which the common travel area restrictions apply.
Amendment No 32 <a href="#">2021/263</a>	15 July 2021	provides that physical distancing is reduced to 1 metre indoors and outdoors and to remove the requirement for physical distancing requirements between people within a social group outdoors. They also provide that children under the age of 12 years do not count for the purpose of calculating the number of households permitted for gatherings indoors. The regulations also restrict hospitality trading times to between 04:00 and 00:00.
The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Requirements) (Scotland) Regulations 2021 <a href="#">2021/277</a>	5 August 2021	Provides that relevant hospitality and entertainment premises are required to obtain and record visitor information for the purpose of preventing the spread of coronavirus or monitoring the spread of infection and the incidence of coronavirus disease. They also require persons responsible for places of worship, carrying on a business or providing a service to have regard to relevant guidance issued by the Scottish Ministers about measures to minimise risk of exposure to coronavirus. They also provide that persons in specified indoor places must wear a face covering unless a specific exemption applies. They require persons who use a passenger transport service or passenger transport service premises to wear a face

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		covering unless a specific exemption applies. They also cap numbers at live events at 5000 people for events held outdoors and at 2000 people for events held indoors subject to local authority approval of higher attendance limits in accordance with the process set out in the regulations. Enforcement powers are provided for. They also require Scottish Ministers to review the requirements at least once every 21 days and the regulations require Scottish Ministers to revoke any requirement as soon as it is no longer necessary.
The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Requirements) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2021 <a href="#">2021/299</a>	2 September 2021	Enables performers to perform or rehearse for a performance without face coverings in situations where distancing or partitioning is not possible. The exemption will apply as long as there is either a partition or a distance of at least one metre between performers and other people (including the audience) but that does not include people who are performing or rehearsing with the performers or assisting with the performance or rehearsal.
The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (Directions by Local Authorities) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2021 <a href="#">2021/329</a>	22 September 2021	Extend the expiry date of The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (Directions by Local Authorities) (Scotland) Regulations 2020 (“the principal regulations”) to 25 March 2022.

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<p>The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Requirements) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 2) Regulations 2021 <a href="#">2021/349</a></p>	<p>30 September 2021</p>	<p>Provide that late night premises and premises where a relevant event is taking place must operate a reasonable system for checking that persons on, or seeking to enter, their premises are fully vaccinated against coronavirus or are exempt from the requirement to demonstrate that they are fully vaccinated. Relevant premises must also prepare a compliance plan describing how their systems will operate and other measures in place to prevent or minimise the spread of coronavirus. These Regulations amend the Principal Regulations to enable a local authority to take appropriate steps to enforce the requirement to operate a vaccine checking system. These Regulations introduce a right of entry for persons designated by a local authority to enter premises operating a system. These Regulations also remove capacity limits previously in the Principal Regulations on stadia and live events above which a capacity exemption application must be approved by a local authority.</p>
<p>The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Requirements) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 3) Regulations 2021 <a href="#">2021/384</a></p>	<p>29 October 2021</p>	<p>Amend the Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Requirements) (Scotland) Regulations 2021 (the 'Principal Regulations') to provide that persons who are a nominated representative of an organisation which has been accredited by the United Nations Framework on Climate Change for entrance to the COP 26 Blue Zone are deemed to be fully vaccinated for the purposes of entry to the COP 26 Green Zone. The amendments will cease to have effect on 13 November 2021.</p>

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<p>The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Requirements) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 5) Regulations 2021 <a href="#">2021/475</a></p>	<p>16 December 2021</p>	<p>amend the Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Requirements) (Scotland) Regulations 2021 (the 'Principal Regulations') to expand the existing requirement in regulation 4 to have regard to guidance issued by the Scottish Ministers about measures to minimise risk of exposure to coronavirus. The new provision also requires the taking of such of the measures as are reasonably practicable. The Regulations also extend the distance from 1 metre to 2 metres where an exemption from wearing a face covering applies in certain indoor settings. This includes in the workplace; when leading an act of worship; rehearsing or performing or in certain parts of a marriage ceremony.</p>
<p>The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Requirements) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 6) Regulations 2021 <a href="#">2021/496</a></p>	<p>23 December 2021</p>	<p>to introduce a requirement to take measures to ensure, so far as reasonably practicable, that a distance of 1 metre is maintained between people on or waiting to enter hospitality and leisure premises and that only enough people are admitted to the premises to allow the 1 metre distance to be maintained. The Regulations also introduce a requirement for table service in premises where alcohol is sold for consumption on the premises, and that the customer must remain seated whilst consuming food and drink on the premises. The Regulations also introduce capacity limits for live events held indoors and outdoors - 100 people at indoor standing events, 200 people at indoor seated events and 500 people at outdoor events (whether seated or standing).</p>

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The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Requirements) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 7) Regulations 2021 <a href="#">2021/497</a>	23 December 2021	to close nightclubs, dance halls or discotheque premises, subject to exceptions, from 5.00 a.m. on 27 December 2021. It would remain open to these businesses to operate the premises with distancing and table service, rather than as a nightclub, dance hall or discotheque.
The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Requirements) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 8) Regulations 2021 <a href="#">2021/498</a>	24 December 2021	to allow nightclubs to adjust their operations so as to not operate as a nightclub for the purposed of remaining open in line with these regulations, without being in breach of any licensing arrangements.
